THE BEST IS YET TO COME

Charismatic collection of classic winners

Call it an early holiday gift – and a holiday homecoming.

Each fall for the last three years, Old Friends, the flagship Thoroughbred retirement farm, has welcomed a dual classic winner and champion back from stud duty in Japan to his old Kentucky home.

First came 1997 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Silver Charm, who arrived in fall 2014. Less than a year later, 2002 dual classic winner War Emblem joined him at the Georgetown, Ky., facility. Making it a trio of one-time Triple Crown aspirants is 1999 Horse of the Year Charismatic, who arrived at Old Friends on Dec. 3.

“This is yet another dream come true,” Old Friends founder and president Michael Blowen said. “Charismatic holds such special memories for so many racing fans, so it’s particularly meaningful to be able to bring him home.”

The influx of classic winners – ironically, Old Friends also is home to Touch Gold and Sarava, who thwarted Silver Charm’s and War Emblem’s respective Triple Crown bids with Belmont Stakes victories – has been a point of pride for Blowen, who started Old Friends in 2003. Old Friends is the only retirement facility in the country that specializes in accepting pensioned stallions.

“It’s been a very fortuitous arrangement,” Blowen said. “We’ve had such a wonderful relationship with the [Japan Bloodhorse Breeders’ Association] and everybody in Japan that have been just extremely understanding about how much we love to get these horses back.

“I think with the good experience we had with Silver Charm coming back, and Sunshine Forever and Ogygian and some of the others, that they now look at us as a good place to retire some of these horses because we respect what they did and they know their fans would love to see them.”

Silver Charm, War Emblem, and Charismatic all made headlines during the 37-year Triple Crown drought that was finally ended by American Pharoah in 2015.

Silver Charm won 12 of his 24 career starts – with 11 graded stakes wins and eight additional graded placings – for earnings of \$6,944,369. A graded stakes winner all four seasons he raced for owners Robert and Beverly Lewis and trainer Bob Baffert, he rose to national prominence in spring 1997, winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness to become Baffert’s first classic winner.

Silver Charm’s Triple Crown bid came up shy

when he finished second to Touch Gold in the Belmont, but he continued on to be prominent the following season, winning the 1998 Dubai World Cup and finishing second in the Breeders' Cup Classic. For his accomplishments, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2007.

Two years later, the Lewises got another shot at the Triple Crown with Charismatic, who rose from obscurity to become a household name with a bid for racing immortality. After needing a disqualification to reach the winner's circle while running for a \$62,500 tag and finishing unplaced in the Santa Anita Derby, the colt put together a cluster of outstanding races for trainer D. Wayne Lukas, beginning with a victory in the Lexington Stakes at Keeneland in stakes-record time.

That performance earned him a spot in the Kentucky Derby, and picking up the mount on the 31-1 longshot was Chris Antley, who had won the Derby on Strike the Gold eight years earlier and had come back from addiction and a battle with his weight to return to the saddle. Charismatic won the Derby and then the Preakness to set up a bid for the Triple Crown.

In the Belmont, Charismatic dueled early with champion filly Silverbulletday before fading in the stretch, finishing third behind Lemon Drop Kid and Vision and Verse and emerging from the race with a career-ending fracture to his left front ankle. Sensing something was amiss with the colt, Antley pulled him up shortly after the wire and lifted the colt's injured leg, immobilizing him until help arrived. He was credited with saving the horse's life.

War Emblem burst into prominence with a 6 1/4-length victory in the Illinois Derby in spring 2002. He was subsequently purchased by the late Prince Ahmed bin Salman's Thoroughbred Corporation and transferred to Baffert, eventually giving the trainer another shot at the Triple Crown. For his new connections, War Emblem posted a front-running victory in the Kentucky Derby a few weeks later, then followed with a Preakness triumph. However, the colt stumbled badly at the start of the Belmont Stakes and finished eighth in his bid for the Triple Crown. He added the Haskell Invitational to his résumé later that summer and was honored as the Eclipse Award champion 3-year-old male.

Now, the stories of all three horses entwine again as they will all call Old Friends home after each spent a decade or more overseas. Florida-bred Silver Charm, who stood at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Ky., was sold to Japan with a buyback clause in 2004; Kentucky-bred War Emblem spent his entire stud career, which began in 2003, in Japan; and Kentucky-bred Charismatic, who originally stood at Lane's End in Midway, also stood his first

overseas season that spring.

Their return to Kentucky goes beyond simply walking a horse onto a plane, as the trans-Pacific voyage costs time, manpower, and, of course, money. The horses first undergo mandated quarantine in Japan. For example, Charismatic, the most recent to make the trip, entered quarantine in mid-November before leaving Japan on Nov. 30. The plane trip, which consumes a day, includes a stop in Anchorage, Alaska, for refueling before continuing on to Chicago. The stallions spend several days in the

quarantine facility at Arlington Park before a van ride to Kentucky. They then spend several quiet weeks at Old Friends, in quarantine while adjusting to their new surroundings, before they're ready to greet the public.

National and state import regulations also require incoming stallions – even those who have been pensioned – to test-breed two mares to determine if they carry contagious equine metritis (CEM), a bacteria mainly spread through semen that has been largely eradicated in the United States

but can be hard to detect and control if an outbreak occurs. War Emblem, who was famously reluctant to cover mares during his time at stud in Japan, spent his quarantine period at nearby Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital so that experts could handle his test-breeding. However, after more than a month there, he refused to cover a mare.

Thus, Old Friends took the unorthodox step of gelding the horse in order to comply with the regulations.

"While it is clear that War Emblem, as a retired resident of Old Friends, would never be called upon to breed, the [United States Department of Agriculture] is still obligated to consider that an intact stallion carrying CEM could get loose and inadvertently breed a mare or disperse the disease via human interaction with infected semen," Blowen said in a statement. "If the disease should again become widespread in the United States, the horse industry could suffer considerable economic losses.

"After much deliberation with the USDA, consultation with several veterinarians, and with all other options exhausted, it was decided that the stallion War Emblem be castrated to comply with Kentucky and USDA import regulations."

Funding the trips home is no small project, with the 501(c)(3) accepting support from a variety of outlets, including industry professionals who may have been involved with the horses during their racing or breeding days. In addition to Silver Charm and War Emblem, former Baffert trainees Game On Dude and Danthebluegrassman call Old Friends home. After finally capturing the 2015 Triple Crown with American Pharoah after three failed attempts, Baffert and his wife, Jill, pledged \$50,000 to Old Friends and also made donations to the Permanently Disabled Jockey Fund, Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance, and CARMA Cares.

"I want to share this, I want to make sure that those horses that we really love – we have to take care of them," Baffert said. "Win, lose, or draw, I was going to do it."

Silver Charm and Charismatic were both provided for partially from an endowment the Lewis family had established to ensure their long-term care, with their return journeys sponsored in large part by those gifts. In the case of Charismatic, Tito's Handmade Vodka also made a substantial donation to help bring him back to Kentucky.

"Tito's Handmade Vodka has been a staunch supporter of equine charities, and animal charities in general are near and dear to Tito's heart," vice president of sales Eric Barlund said. "We are ecstatic that we are able to participate in bringing horse racing stars like Charismatic back home where they can be revered by the public and help raise awareness for the cause."

Old Friends raised half of what was needed to ship War Emblem by selling limited edition "shareholder" certificates, featuring photography by *Daily Racing Form's* multiple Eclipse Award winner Barbara D. Livingston, for \$202, a nod to War Emblem's 2002 classic victories. Following suit, the farm is now selling certificates for Charismatic for \$199.90.

What is Old Friends? That depends on who you ask and through what prism you view this very special place.

One could judge the book by its cover and call it a retirement facility for Thoroughbreds – young and old, famous and forgotten – and wouldn’t be wrong. But it is more than that.

For horse lovers, Old Friends is a theme park of sorts, an equine Disneyland where they can happily hobnob with racing favorites of yore. Veterinarians and farriers might see it as a science/research lab where innovative, often life-saving work is conducted to benefit the broader horse world. Industry leaders rightfully regard it as a positive face for their sport, while for equine residents, Old Friends is a playground and social club, a hospital as needed, at times a hospice and, most importantly, a place of respite and calm.

Every resident here is one of a kind, each arriving with a unique world outlook molded by genetics and life experience. Some showed up hungry and frightened, on battle-scarred legs, worn-out bodies, battered psyches, neurological and gastrointestinal problems, mobility issues, fused ankles, hoof injuries, incipient blindness, osteoarthritis, or melanoma. Others strode confidently off their vans like kings of the turf, hale and well even if a bit long in the tooth. Old Friends represents for most a final earthly stop, a sanctuary where an assortment of equine characters, highborn and low, can rediscover their nature as horses and live out their lives in companionable peace.

Silver and gold

If founder Michael Blowen is the General Washington of Old Friends, then farm manager Tim Wilson is his Hamilton – an implicitly trusted aide-

de-camp since joining the team in 2014. The 49-year-old Kentucky native works a rigorous split schedule, developing young racehorses in the mornings before turning down that blacktop lane off Paynes Depot Road near Georgetown and handing himself over, heart and soul, to the 105 denizens of Old Friends.

A keen student of life, Wilson receives daily lessons here in equine sociology and psychology. He has come to understand the sometimes enigmatic personalities of his charges perhaps as well as they can be known, while dealing with a broad range of temperaments, from friendly Silver Charm to devious War Emblem.

Horses don’t think or react as we do, Wilson will tell you. Nor can their “intelligence” be evaluated like ours. But that doesn’t mean they aren’t smart.

“Just like with people, intelligence in horses shows in different ways,” he says. “Take our Derby winners. Silver Charm’s is seen in how he takes things in

stride. Nothing bothers him. He's in total control of his environment, a consummate actor. Knows all his lines, his marks. He'll run over to visitors and put on shows. He is as close to perfect as you can get."

While Silver Charm is the celebrity happy to hang with fans and sign autographs all day, War Emblem is his polar opposite – cool, aloof, with seemingly little interest in tourists passing by his double-fenced security paddock. Call out to the handsome bay and he'll likely ignore you. He prefers to be admired from afar; get close at your own peril.

Wilson sensed early on that the tightly wound 2002 Kentucky Derby-Preakness winner was special ... and smart.

"When he arrived, for all he knew he was here to breed," Wilson said. "When a person retires, they know their life has changed and hopefully they'll enjoy it, but you can't tell a horse that. You have to show him. Had he been a blockhead with the same demeanor, he'd have been hard to manage forever, but he was smart enough to adapt quickly and realize that life at Old Friends is good. A year later, he's a different horse."

It may seem like sacrilege, but War Emblem was gelded last January at 17. Why, when most older stallions here remain in their original state? War Emblem spent his stud career in Japan, where his enthusiasm for the job was famously minimal, and by the end he was refusing to breed altogether.

American import regulations require an incoming stallion to cover at least two test mares to determine if he carries the venereal infection CEM. Knowing the trouble that could potentially cause with War Emblem, the sensible alternative was castration, a procedure that can also help settle a horse.

Which is not to say he's easy-breezy to deal with now.

"Gelding didn't turn him into a Teddy Ruxpin," said Wilson. "He'll still bite, and means it when he does. You don't turn your back on this horse."

War Emblem's high equine IQ can make him a challenge, and the farm manager describes him as somewhat neurotic.

"Think of a Woody Allen mind in an Arnold Schwarzenegger body," Wilson said. "While Silver Charm has taken to the farm's agenda and become a wonderful ambassador, War Emblem has his own agenda, which he's trained us to fit. He overthinks everything and gives jobs to certain people."

For example, War Emblem has trained Blown well regarding his preferred snack delivery system. Early on, he warily inspected any hand-offered carrot before accepting it – then would drop it to the ground like a habanero pepper. He eventually conditioned Blown to bestow treats via the feed bucket where he cheerfully consumes them.

Wilson has had his own adventures with War Emblem.

"One night I was in his paddock taking pictures," he recalls. "I was in front of him with maybe three feet between us, and as I walked backwards he walked toward me. At some point, I stepped on his halter, which he had peeled off and left on the ground. I looked at it and he looked at me and I thought, 'I've got all this camera stuff, I'll get it later.' So I kept walking backwards, but when he reached the halter he stopped, picked it up in his teeth, and shook it at me as if to say: 'Hey, this is your job. Put this back on me.' That's War Emblem."

Closer to the Silver Charm personality profile is his 1997 classic rival Touch Gold, who ended Charm's Triple Crown bid with a sizzling end run in the Belmont Stakes. Other than the late Gulch, this Deputy Minister son has been the most successful progenitor pensioned at Old Friends, with 34 stakes winners and progeny earnings of \$46 million – and he's a rising star among broodmare sires. Fittingly, Touch Gold is pastured within easy view of his long-ago foe.

A chocolate bay stallion, Touch Gold looks a decade younger than his 23 years, coat shimmering in the autumn sun, eyes bright and alert. When Blown is here, Touch Gold gallops full-tilt to the fence line; for the rest of us, he'll arrive at a more leisurely pace, but always with an eye out for that bucket of carrots.


"A bundle of energy," Wilson describes him. "Another I'd put high on the 'smart' scale. He's really taken to life at Old Friends, loves it. I'm not sure when his last breeding session was before he got here (Gold's final eight-foal crop arrived in 2016), but he was one who had to learn that his breeding days were over."

Geldings

On an October morning, Wilson makes the rounds to ensure all is well. Two tour buses have pulled up outside the tobacco barn/stable (soon to be a renovated entertainment center), each expelling troops of excited visitors. Silver Charm, Touch Gold, and fan favorite Game On Dude occupy front pastures where crowds gather to meet them. Farther back on the acreage are several retired broodmares, bands

of less-famous geldings, and one old stallion for whom heavy human foot traffic is stressful.

Wilson heads that way, toward a field of mostly younger horses, an average age of 10. It's an egalitarian society here, where former bottom-rung claimers graze alongside millionaires and Grade 1 winners. A few nibble grass; others snooze. Two detach from the crowd and begin playfully shouldering into one another with flattened ears and open mouths.

It is Wilson's job to evaluate new arrivals, then place them where he thinks they'll be safest and happiest.

“This is the frat house,” he nods in the direction of the carousing pair. “They’re all pretty similar at this point in their lives, and it just works.”

At this writing frat brothers include Canadian champion Forte Dei Marmi, Grade 1 winner Sean Avery, and blue-blooded Gasconade, a son of two Breeders' Cup victors but himself a runner of modest talent. As the latter shyly edges up for a treat, an alarming skin growth on his left shoulder comes into view: sarcoid cancer.

“The good news is it doesn't seem to cause pain,” Wilson says. “It's a skin issue, but we need to get it under control. Dr. Bryan Waldrige has researched a new treatment available only in England that we want to try.”

Across the way is another gelding cluster that Wilson calls the “graduates,” slightly older and less rambunctious than the “frat boys.” These include graded-/group-winning millionaire-turned-\$5,000 claimer Diamond Stripes and 22-year-old Summer Attraction, a horse once owned by Blower.

The goal at Old Friends is for every gelding to be in a group or pairing, and every stallion to be where other horses are visible, so they can still benefit from group social behavior. War Emblem, for example, is

not far from 2010 Breeders' Cup Marathon winner Eldaafer and his goat pals, Yahoo and Google.

“Safety is why we want them in groups,” Wilson explains, again indicating the frat house. “They’re social animals and have awesome peripheral vision, hearing, sense of smell. See how they’re all looking in different directions for potential danger? A horse can relax if his buddy is keeping an eye out; then they can switch off. But horses create a hierarchy in nature, so if somebody is getting picked on we'll get him out of there.”

Couples

The farm's marquee gelding these days is \$6.5 million-earner Game On Dude, a youngster here at age 10. Upon his 2014 arrival, Dude had been placed with fellow young 'un Yankee Fournune, a pairing that ultimately didn't work out.

“Determining who to put with who is a fluid thing,” said Wilson. “We thought Game On Dude had a mental soulmate in Yankee Fournune. But Dude's a poster boy for a horse who retired sound and relatively young. He's an equine socialite, a really cool guy, that partier roommate who wants to have fun all the time. Yankee had an inflamed ankle and simply couldn't keep up with him. He needs to chill, not constantly play. So we put him in with Futural, who also had a bad ankle. With any pairing, if something changes, the room assignment changes. We've got 35 paddocks and there's a spot for everybody somewhere.”

Starspangledheat moved in with Dude for a while, but when Starspangledheat became a bit aggressive he was sent to pledge the fraternity. Today, three-time Ohio horse of the year Catlaunch resides in harmony with Game On Dude.

Old Friends's other high-profile pairings include Eclipse Award winners Amazombie and Rapid Redux, who occupy a pasture adjacent to Dude and Catlaunch. They're hard to miss, this lively duo who crowd the fence for carrots and attention, with Redux clearly the alpha male.

“Remember ‘Beavis and Butt-Head’?” Wilson asks, referencing the 1990s TV cartoon about two goofy juvenile delinquents. “Amazombie isn't Butt-Head, but Redux is definitely Beavis. He's the roommate who stays up and parties all night, leaves dirty dishes in the sink and clothes all over the place. Zombie is strong enough to put up with him, and I think now he actually likes him.”

Early Pioneer and Old Friends's senior resident, 29-year-old Dinard, are happy geriatric campers, though you might not know it with all the irritable pushing and teeth-bearing going on between the two Grade 1 winners. More than a quarter-century ago, Dinard was favored for the Kentucky Derby before a torn ligament threw him off the classic trail. And 17 summers past, Early Pioneer was an unexpected 25-1 upsetter in the \$1 million Hollywood Gold Cup.

Arguably the most endearing couple here is Special Ring and Popcorn Deelites, who can be found at any given time roaming their spacious paddock together like a hitched team. The egalitarian nature of Old Friends is again evident with Ring, a near-millionaire Grade 1 winner, and Pop, a lowly claimer turned star of silver screen. (He played Seabiscuit in the 2003 movie of that name.) Yet, they are as well matched as any two horses Wilson has ever seen.

Ring's curious parlor trick of flipping his upper lip for treats delights visitors every day – as does Pop's pitiful efforts to emulate by wiggling his own lip and cocking his head to the side. Laurel and Hardy they may be, but they also keep each other safe and enter-

tained. Wilson, however, sees a possible downside to this level of attachment.

“When you take one from the paddock for whatever reason, that powerful connection can cause anxiety,” he said. “If one had to go to the hospital and say he passed away, all his buddy knows is they took away his friend and he didn’t come back. He’s anxious and has no idea what happened.”

It was different when 1997 champion distaffer Hidden Lake died in her pasture last September due to infirmities of age; Australian champion Bint Marscay was right there with her and appeared to gain understanding and closure from the experience. Similarly, when Grade 2 winner Futural was euthanized in July after battling chronic osteoarthritis, Yankee Fourtune was nearby. Both he and Bint Marscay have since moved on to successful new partnerships.

Wins ...

A key component of Old Friends’s work has been saving horses no longer wanted or regarded as useful. Through the years it has been involved with many rescues, including some high-profile ones.

Back in 2005, 24-year-old Blue Grass Stakes winner and Kentucky Derby entrant Taylor’s Special was discovered abandoned and starving in Washington; Grade 3 winner Silver Ray was taken for \$30 from a 2013 pipeline-to-slaughter livestock auction; stakes winner Clever Allemont was plucked from a Kansas kill pen as a skinny 26-year-old one-eyed stallion; graded-stakes-placed Racketeer was picked up at a California feedlot; 2011 Preakness contestant King Congie was acquired when his owner hawked him for sale in a parking lot; Leave Seattle, a \$200,000 son

of Seattle Slew, was intercepted en route to slaughter, as was leading sire Medaglia d’Oro’s half-brother Cappucino Kid, a \$425 feedlot purchase; Genuine Reward, out of Kentucky Derby winner Genuine Risk, was bought off Craigslist for \$500; Narrow Escape, by the great Exceller who himself perished in a Swedish slaughterhouse, was abandoned in her stall following an auction where she’d received no bid; Escapedfromnewyork was found neglected in New York; and last year a pair of thin young Thoroughbreds were brought in from the abandoned horses once cared for by the Borells in nearby Mercer County. In addition, several once-notable racehorses were claimed cheaply by good people and retired to forever homes at Old Friends.

... and losses

Inspirational stories have been plentiful at Old Friends, where horses live out their days in a warm embrace. Those days can be long: Clever Allemont, Gulch, and Ogygian each died in their 32nd year; Fortunate Prospect and Do One Dance at 31; Mixed Pleasure at 30; English-bred Creator, Sunshine Forever, and Crusader Sword at 29. Losses are inevitable in an aging population, and some familiar names left us this past year, including aforementioned Hidden Lake and Futural; Grade 1 millionaire Halo America; graded stakes winner Delay of Game; half-millionaire Flick – and Wallenda, a horse who had captured Tim Wilson’s heart like no other.

The 1993 Super Derby winner, Wallenda had long struggled with a collapsing suspensory in his left hind leg. Veterinarians and farriers worked on him for years, trying to fix what ultimately proved unfixable, but keeping him alive and comfortable far

longer than anticipated.

“It was wonderful to watch,” Wilson said. “Wallenda is talked about in seminars today because of what they learned from him. It took an amazingly creative, innovative effort to keep him as close to normal as they could get.”

Wallenda surely helped himself with a positive attitude, and though the son of Gulch never overtly acknowledged his frailty, he took good care of himself.

As Wilson put it: “The best are absolutely intelligent. They’re not reckless, not hard on themselves, they take things in stride. Intelligence separates the upper echelon from the rest.”

Even among the best and brightest, Wallenda stood out.

“I’ve been with Thoroughbreds more than 20 years and Wallenda was the toughest I’d ever seen,” he said. “Other horses with the slightest little abscess, they’re three-leg lame and hobbling around, but he took what was dealt him like it was nothing. On a list of 10 role models in my life, nine would be people, but there would be one horse: Wallenda. You could search the world over and not find one as tough as him.”

Those close to the valiant black stallion finally threw in the towel on May 9, 2015, two days after the Kentucky Derby – which Wallenda had competed in 23 years before.

Old Friends does its part

In 1928, an aging Kentucky Derby winner and future Hall of Famer staggered to a head-bobbing halt in a cheap race at Fair Grounds. Black Gold’s agony ended moments later with a bullet to the brain as his tearful trainer wailed: “God is my witness, I ran him in good faith!”

Times have changed since such practices were used, but too many tragedies would follow that grim ending, including another Derby winner, Ferdinand, whose heart-wrenching 2002 demise in a foreign slaughterhouse brought worldwide attention to a problem.

In 2017, racing’s troubles persist in the form of declining attendance, sparse media coverage, drug and whip controversies, and, perhaps most devastating, the widely held belief that racing does not always do right for its most important asset.

But good things do happen in the sport of kings – a Triple Crown winner illuminates the stage, a spate of brilliant fillies dazzles us, a blaze-faced champion captures our collective imagination. The rise of Thoroughbred aftercare is another good thing – very good, in so many ways.

Along with a growing number of retirement, rescue, and rehab organizations across America, Old Friends fights the good fight every day to change the negative perceptions and harsh realities of our sport. And in the end, racing wins.

Lending a helping hand

Unless they van her over on a lark, just to wow the visiting crowd, it is unlikely that Zenyatta ever will set foot upon the grounds of Old Friends Equine.

In a way that is too bad, because every benevolent monarch should make the rounds. The imagination soars at the sight of Zenyatta, now a mature broodmare, strolling alongside the Old Friends paddocks of such transcendent stars as Silver Charm, Game On Dude, War Emblem, Alphabet Soup, Tinnies Way, and Charismatic, all part of the farm's living museum.

Then again, Zenyatta need never stir from her home down at Lane's End Farm to have an everlasting impact on Old Friends. She has become – courtesy of owners Ann and Jerry Moss – the most generous four-legged benefactor Old Friends has ever known.

A Thoroughbred racehorse like Zenyatta should never need a place like Old Friends. At least, that's the theory. Zenyatta earned \$7.3 million, reigned as 2010 Horse of the Year, and earned a place in the Hall of Fame. She will be a cherished broodmare for as long as she is able, after which she is guaranteed a home for life in a peaceful pasture at a first-rank Kentucky farm, like Lane's End.

And yet, reality writes a different tale. Even the best Thoroughbreds are moveable commodities, with economic life expectancies that vary based upon their procreative value. Geldings hit a wall once they can no longer deliver the goods on the racetrack. Broodmares cannot produce viable foals forever, just as stallions someday reach the end of the commercial line, some of them sooner than later.

Old Friends has been a haven for such horses, many of them donated by generous owners, others recovered from uncomfortable circumstance. However they get to Old Friends does not matter. Once there, life for them takes on a different hue. They become treasures beyond price, iconic heroes with their accomplishments frozen in time, while a dotting public gets to appreciate them in the flesh.


Ann and Jerry Moss picked up on this vibe more than a decade ago when they were looking for a place to permanently retire Ruhlmann, their 20-year-old stallion who had been pensioned after a modest career at stud. Ruhlmann's racing life was anything but modest, however, featuring \$1.8 million in earnings, a track record for the mile at Santa Anita, and a victory in the 1990 Santa Anita Handicap.

"It was David, my son, who told me about this great guy who was starting this new facility," said Dottie Ingordo-Shirreffs, manager of the Moss racing stable. "I contacted Michael, and he was

very gracious. He also had a very definite and loving purpose in mind."

David is David Ingordo, bloodstock agent and the man who found Zenyatta as a yearling for the Mosses at a Keeneland sale. Michael is Michael Blowen, the retired journalist and lifelong racing fan who was just getting Old Friends off the ground.

"Ruhlmann was the first big American horse that anyone trusted us with," Blowen said. "It was a validation of the kind of care they were going to get. This wasn't going to be just a storage space for a bunch of old horses. They were going to be treated like they deserved, and they were going to get great health

care. I remember thinking at the time, if people like the Mosses will trust us with their horses, then we've got a shot."

Kudos, winner of the 2002 Oaklawn Handicap for the Mosses, eventually followed Ruhlmann to Old Friends.

"Ruhlmann was tough," Blowen said. "It took him almost a year to figure out we weren't going to ask him to do anything he didn't want to do. Kudos is just the opposite. In fact, he kind of gets ignored sometimes because he's so easy going and so easy to handle."

Even the most diligent racehorse owners have

nightmares about their horses ending up in bad situations. Silver Ray, a son of Silver Hawk, won the Hoist the Flag Stakes for the Mosses in 1991 as a 2-year-old and was stakes-placed at 3. Upon his retirement he was given a shot as a stallion, but he did his best

work as a sire of sport horses later on for a dressage trainer.

In 2013 Silver Ray, then 24, was discovered in a killer's pen in Glendale, Calif., on his way to slaughter. He was snapped up by a rescue group who spread the word, after which the Mosses stepped in and sent Silver Ray to Old Friends.

They are also represented at Old Friends by the gelding Ukiah, a Moss homebred by Unbridled's Song who was claimed and ended up running with cheap claimers in Pennsylvania.

"Michael is great about keeping us informed when situations like that come up," Ingordo-Shirreffs said. "We want to help when we can."

Zenyatta stepped up in a big way in 2016 when Maker's Mark placed her stylized image on one of their famous collector's bottles, wrapped it in the Moss colors, and issued it to the public with great fanfare and a Breeders' Cup week event. Old Friends was designated at the main beneficiary of the vigorous sales.

"We sold out of them, and we're going to get over \$120,000 for Old Friends," Blown said. "There were a lot of moving parts, but it was Zenyatta and the Mosses who made it such a success."

Karma tends to go 'round and 'round. Kudos. Silver Ray, and Ukiah are living the good life at Old Friends alongside champions and Breeders' Cup winners. Ruhlmann, the horse who started it all for the Mosses, died on Christmas Eve of 2008.

"I remember they came to visit Ruhlmann here on the Thursday before the 2005 Kentucky Derby," Blown added. "He'd been here only a few months. Two days later, Ann and Jerry won the Kentucky Derby with Giacomo. I like to think their good deed for us was well rewarded."

Building an even brighter future

Michael Blowen did not hear voices that said, “If you build it, they will come.” But everyone did think he was out of his mind when he told people his concept for Old Friends.

“People told me, are you crazy? This is the stupidest thing I’ve ever heard,” said Blowen, founder and president of Old Friends, of his initial effort to solicit support for the fledgling idea.

“I talked to one owner of a major stallion farm and explained what we had in mind when we were starting Old Friends, and he said, ‘You’re getting these horses and you’re not going to sell them? What exactly are you going to do with them?’ I said, ‘We’re going to put them in our yard and people will come visit.’ He looked at me and said, ‘Good luck with that. Good luck.’ Now he’s one of our biggest supporters.”

Fans did come. And come. And come. Some 20,000

people – and counting – arrive annually at the main farm in Georgetown, Ky., to see some of racing’s greats, and not-so-greats, because owners, breeders, and trainers saw what Blowen had done, and the quality of care and life the horses were given, and they stepped up to provide a steady incoming stream of ex-racehorses, former sires, and retired broodmares.

Today, Blowen’s Old Friends is the premier after-care facility in the country. And as Old Friends has established itself – sporting the largest collection of American classic winners in the world, featuring three Kentucky Derby-Preakness winners, plus two Belmont victors – it is bulging at the seams, operating at full capacity – and there’s a long list of illustrious horses waiting to get in.

To help shape its future, Old Friends recently acquired 50 adjacent acres that will allow it to house more retirees; it has built a beautiful new multi-purpose barn to replace the one that burned down

in January 2016; it will renovate its old tobacco barn into an entertainment/educational center; and it will begin offering on-site bed-and-breakfast facilities to accommodate visitors who want to stay on a farm in the country rather than in a hotel in the city when in the Bluegrass.

All these initiatives are being undertaken to help make Old Friends more self-sustaining, because the not-for-profit facility requires considerable operating funds to pay the upkeep for scores of horses no longer producing revenues from stud fees or purse earnings.

Expansion is already under way, with fences being built to create several additional paddocks on the new 50-acre tract. The additional land will allow Old Friends to accommodate anywhere from 30 to 40 more horses beyond the present 105.

On the newly annexed acreage is a barn that

Blowen said will be used as an equine-care facility.

"There's a metal barn, and we're going to make that our medical facility," Blowen said. "It will have six stalls. And Dr. [Bryan] Waldrige [the primary veterinarian for Old Friends] and the people at [veterinary clinic] Rood and Riddle will help us design that. It will have things like IV drips in it."

The new 12-stall barn was completed last summer, replacing the wooden quarantine barn that burned down.

Like all major projects, the new barn required a substantial amount of money – a commodity often in short supply at Old Friends.

"I got a call from [CEO] Boyd Browning of Fasig-Tipton," Blowen said. "He said, 'Would you consider naming the barn after [the late owner-breeder and former Fasig-Tipton chairman] John Hettinger?' I said I certainly would."

"John Hettinger really cared about his horses. After they retired, he dedicated his life to taking care of horses, to give them the best chance they could possibly have. It would be an honor to name the barn after him, I told Boyd."

"He said, 'Oh, by the way, it comes with a check for \$50,000.'"

"And that's why the barn looks so nice. We wound up spending \$130,000 on building it."

The barn provides a lot of flexibility, serving as a quarantine facility as well as a space for horses that must be confined while recovering from injury or illness. Three shared walk-out paddocks are available from six of the stalls, enabling horses to go outside into a quarantined area.

The newest barn is located just 50 feet away from the original tobacco barn. All interior walls from the stalls have been removed and the barn will be wide open, with asphalt flooring throughout, which will help accommodate sizable parties and gatherings. Old Friends already hosts some large, seasonal parties, and with the new facility those functions will likely be more frequent, plus the barn can be rented for outside parties, such as weddings, to help raise much-needed funds.

"One of the things that used to irritate me is that every time we had a party here, like around Derby time, we had to rent a tent for \$2,000," Blowen said. "I always wanted a place where people could go and enjoy themselves."

"When we built the new barn, we didn't need the old barn anymore, and that's when we decided to convert it."

"It will also be a place where we can put up televisions and show some of these horses' races and other informational pieces. I want it so you can push a button on a monitor near Silver Charm's stall and see his races."

Blowen indicated that Old Friends envisions bringing in speakers, such as jockeys, trainers, and veterinarians, to help educate the public on racing and horse care.

"We get requests from schools all the time for kids to come out," he said.

"The more knowledgeable people are about racing, the greater the chances are for the sport to improve."

The barn also could display the trophies currently in Blowen's primary residence, many given to Old Friends by the late, great trainer Bobby Frankel.

Those trophies will be needing a new home since Blowen and his wife, Diane White, plan to move out of their two-story, four-bedroom house near the main barn, just across from Silver Charm's paddock, and into a ranch-style house that came with the 50-acre parcel. Their current home will be converted into a bed and breakfast where visitors would be able to rent a bedroom for about \$120 a night.

Also on the property is a second home also slated for conversion into a bed and breakfast. That one was on land contiguous to the new 50-acre tract, and Old Friends was able to buy it at the same time.

The second bed and breakfast will have four bedrooms and renting it will require a seven-day minimum. Blowen said an extended stay is necessary so that operational costs are not burdensome, as would be the case if the house turned over occupancy frequently. Depending on the season, the B&B could be available for \$2,000 per week.

Little Mike beat the odds

The terms “underdog” and “four-time Grade 1 winner” are not often used to describe the same horse, but Little Mike made a career out of proving the betting public wrong and Carlo Vaccarezza right.

With a pedigree that suggested he was sired by nothing and out of a mare with even less value, the gelding was often looked at with a skeptical eye even as he reached the top of the sport. His level of success and public disrespect reached their mutual apex when he won the 2012 Breeders’ Cup Turf at odds of 17-1.

None of that mattered much to Little Mike, now 9 years old, as he stood caked in a light layer of dirt in a corner paddock at Old Friends Equine Retirement. Respect comes nowadays in the form of the daily tour groups and buckets full of carrots.

Little Mike took Vaccarezza and his family on a ride that included stops in North America’s most prestigious turf races, as well as world-class races in Hong Kong and the United Arab Emirates. In total, he won 14 of 30 starts for earnings of \$3,543,392.

Anything close to that outcome would have sounded like a far-flung fantasy until it actually happened.

Vaccarezza was given the Illinois-bred mare Hay Jude after her blue-collar career on the Chicago circuit, and he sent her for her fourth mating to Spanish Steps, an unraced Florida stallion whose claim to fame was being a full brother to top sire Unbridled’s Song. The resulting foal was named after Vaccarezza’s oldest son.

“It was a giveaway mare that was basically a rescue,” Vaccarezza said. “I think it’s true when you treat someone nice, sooner or later they pay you back. I basically saved her life, and she made my life much better.”

It took five starts for Little Mike to get his footing on the racetrack, and the footing was what made all the difference. The gelding was moved to turf and scored his maiden win, and he never looked back, winning nine of his next 11 starts.

Once he established himself on turf largely on the Florida circuit, Little Mike leapt into national-level competition at age 5, starting with a gate-to-wire victory in the Grade 1 Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs, going off at 12-1. He followed two starts later with a win in the Grade 1 Arlington Million.

“For me, the biggest day was the Arlington Million,” Vaccarezza said. “My wife’s from Chicago, and the place was just completely packed. We received the trophy from [former Chicago Bears head coach] Mike Ditka, and he said, ‘This trophy goes from ‘Big Mike’ to Little Mike.’”

Little Mike finished his campaign with an upset win in the Breeders’ Cup Turf. The next year, he competed in Group 1 races in Dubai in the spring and Hong Kong in late fall, with a win in the Grade 1 Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational Stakes in between.

The miles caught up with Little Mike, who was sidelined with nagging injuries in 2014. Vaccarezza contacted Old Friends founder and president Michael Blowen about retiring the gelding to the farm and was given an open invitation, but he was not ready to give up on the horse yet.

Little Mike spent a year and a half on layup, and then another half-year at the Palm Meadows Training Center while Vaccarezza prepared him for his return.

Through all the time and money put into Little Mike’s return, Vaccarezza also knew when it was time to ease off on his star. Little Mike finished a lackluster fifth in his comeback, a Gulfstream Park allowance, and the owner said the decision to retire him was easy.

“The following morning, I came to his stall and saw him, and he wasn’t the same Little Mike,” Vaccarezza said. “He looked at me, he had his head

down, and that was the sign he told me, ‘Hey Dad, I’ve had enough.’ The following day, I shipped him up. They have a way to tell you that it’s over.”

Blowen had spoken to Vaccarezza over the phone several times, and Vaccarezza had toured Old Friends in the past, but their first face-to-face encounter in late August was unexpected.

“I look in the barn and there’s this guy I’ve never met before, a complete stranger, walking around in the barn,” Blowen said. “I said, ‘Excuse me, sir. Can I help you?’ and he said, ‘Yeah, I’m Carlo. I’ve come to get my horse off the van.’ We stood there and he told me all the great stories about how he got the dam, Hay Jude, how he bred him to Spanish Steps, he was just absolutely great.”

Though Little Mike’s spot at Old Friends had been in place for two years, handing over the shank was still harder than Vaccarezza expected.

“It’s one of those things that’s tough to swallow,” Vaccarezza said. “I’m 64 years old and I’m not ashamed to say I really cried that day. It’s something indescribable, and some people, you try to explain that and they don’t get it. It’s a bond. It’s like having another child. To have a horse like Little Mike, you can basically run the world.”

Alphabet Soup remains a standout

Popular runner and sire Alphabet Soup has been treated for melanomas, a common ailment in grays. A vaccine developed with new technology has helped keep them under control.

Not much has changed about Alphabet Soup in the two decades since he gained racing notoriety. While many gray horses lighten with age, his coat was near-white to begin with. And while many horses slow down in their twilight years, Alphabet Soup carries himself with a high-headed pride that suggests he knows exactly who he is.

He still doesn't like to be passed, either.

"At night, when I come home and it's dark, I open up the gate, and first I hear him and then see him – he kind of glows in the dark," Old Friends founder and president Michael Blowen said. "He comes over, and it's like paying a toll on the Massachusetts Turnpike – I've got to feed him a carrot in order to get up the hill."

Twenty years ago, Alphabet Soup refused to be passed in a thrilling final furlong of the Breeders' Cup Classic at Woodbine, besting Preakness winner Louis Quatorze by a nose. Another head back in

third was the great Cigar, getting an emotional send-off in his final start.

Long after the echoes of the crowd from that stretch run had faded, Alphabet Soup arrived at Old Friends after being pensioned by Frank Stronach's Adena Springs stallion operation in 2015. The 25-year-old son of Cozzene is settled in a paddock near the front of the farm, adjacent to its main driveway. He is one of the closest horses to the front office.

"Nothing bothers him," Blowen said. "That's one of the reasons he's down there – first on the tour right there because he's so gentle and kind. He's a good introduction to our visitors. They get to see a Breeders' Cup Classic winner, just this beautiful, beautiful horse, and on top of that, he has this personality [that is] very convivial. He's in a perfect spot."

Alphabet Soup won 10 of 24 starts, winning or placing in 13 stakes over four seasons, for earnings of \$2,990,270. His best season came in 1996,

when in addition to the BC Classic he scored Grade 2 victories in the San Antonio and San Pasqual handicaps and won the Grade 3 Pat O'Brien Handicap. He would have had six graded stakes wins on the season had he not been disqualified to third for interference in the Grade 2 Goodwood Stakes, his final Classic prep, making him a 19-1 longshot against Cigar.

"This horse has got a heart as big as this race-track," Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron – now a vocal supporter of Old Friends – told his brother, NBC horseback correspondent Gregg McCarron, moments after that upset win in 1996. "This horse is just dead game. He loves to run. God, what a thrill."

Alphabet Soup made just one start following his Classic triumph, finishing second in the 1997 San Antonio. He retired to stand at Adena Springs's Kentucky base but also had stints at the operation's regional locations in Ontario, Florida, and New York during a productive stud career. His runners were led by Sovereign Award winners Alpha Bettor

and Phantom Light as well as Grade 1/Group 1 winners Our New Recruit, Alphabet Kisses, and Egg Drop.

Alphabet Soup's gameness and kind personality have served him well in retirement. In January 2016, he was in the quarantine barn at Old Friends when it caught fire. He calmly followed Old Friends employee James Crump to safety in a nearby paddock and calmly ate his hay as chaos unfolded.

"There were fire trucks going around, people scurrying everywhere, and at some point the car of our farm manager, Tim Wilson, caught fire," Blown told *Daily Racing Form* at the time. "When the air bags blew up, I looked over at Alphabet Soup. He never lifted his head from the hay."

The quarantine barn was a complete loss, but has since been rebuilt.

As Alphabet Soup has moved into older age, his only health issue has been a common one. Gray horses are predisposed to developing melanomas, a type of tumor, particularly as they age. One study showed that more than 80 percent of gray horses older than 15 will develop the growths. But cutting-edge treatment has been available to Alphabet Soup, partially thanks to Stronach and his company's executives Mike Rogers and Tim Ritvo.

"Because he's a gray turning white, he had the susceptibility to have these melanomas, and it was starting to affect his digestion, in eliminating stuff," Blown said. Dr. Bryan Waldrige "suggested this program they'd established at a veterinary clinic down in Florida, which would take the DNA of the horse and make a vaccine. So, we took a little bit of this tumor and sent it down to Florida, and they created this vaccine for him and sent it back.

"It's an expensive proposition. We would pay for it – it wasn't a question of whether we were going to do it or not. But I called Adena Springs up, and Mike Rogers and Tim Ritvo both agreed, and within a week, we had all the money we needed."

Adena Springs has developed a strong relationship with Old Friends, entrusting the farm with another of its high-end pensioners in Touch Gold, who arrived at the farm shortly after Alphabet Soup. The 22-year-old Deputy Minister horse raced in Stronach's colors before standing in Kentucky and New York for Adena Springs. His most famous triumph came under McCarron in the 1997 Belmont Stakes, when he ran down Triple Crown hopeful Silver Charm – also an Old Friends resident.

"There's a guy named Jack Jeziorski, he works for Frank Stronach and is in charge of a lot of the simulcast operations," Blown said. "He came to the farm one day on a tour, and I said to him that I really loved Alphabet Soup and Touch Gold, and whenever they retired, I'd love to have them at Old Friends.

"In the intermediary period, Mike Rogers, who runs everything for Frank, came to the farm with a lot of people from the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance. His wife, Stacie Clark, is one of the people that runs it. I told him that we really wanted them, and I think he liked the farm, so between Jack and him, that's what really made it work."

And thus, Stronach's stallions have become a beloved part of the Old Friends family.

Blown said it's been a thrill to have Alphabet Soup at Old Friends.

"I look back at that Breeders' Cup and how I was rooting for Cigar, rooting for Cigar, rooting for Cigar," Blown said. "And now, 20 years later, I'm really glad Alphabet Soup beat him."

Beaming satellites

Old Friends has two satellite divisions, where fans are encouraged to go to and see a lot of other great and beloved horses. The division at Kentucky Downs was started in 2015, while the Cabin Creek facility in New York was launched in 2010. The New York facility received major support from the late trainer Bobby Frankel. Here's a closer look at the two facilities.

Old Friends at Kentucky Downs

In July 2015 an historic thing happened. Kentucky Downs, the racecourse in Franklin, Ky., opened a small retirement facility for Thoroughbreds on its grounds. The joint venture between Old Friends in Georgetown and the European-style oval just across the state line from Nashville, Tenn., just may be the first and only racetrack that has ever made space for ex-racehorses to live out their lives. Think of it as Old Friends's Mini-Me.

The facility showcases nine horses, some of which celebrated big wins over the turf course at Kentucky Downs, such as Rumor Has It, a son of Awesome Again who won the Kentucky Turf Cup in 2008, and Good Lord, who ran away with the Kentucky Turf Dash in 2012.

Tours are conducted, too, thanks to our friends at the Simpson County Tourism Commission. Along with Rumor Has It and Good Lord, you also can meet Ball Four, a 14-year-old son of Grand Slam who earned \$730,470 and won three graded stakes; Sgt. Bert, who won the 2005 and 2006 Woodford Stakes at Keeneland; Thornfield, a Sovereign Award winner and Canada's Horse of the Year in 1999; Tour of the Cat, a multiple graded stakes winner of \$1,106,955; and Dueling Alex, an allowance runner and claimer who earned \$178,655 racing on the East Coast. The newest member of the Kentucky Downs herd is Balance of Power, who captured the Grade 3 Philip H. Iselin at Monmouth Park.

People on a tour can also stop in and say hello to Joanna Drake, who runs the gift shop, and Jennifer Jones, who manages the horses.

"This is a very unique layout," notes Rick Albright, Kentucky Downs's racing manager. "It allows the horses to enjoy their retirement in an environment they are accustomed to, and some can even gaze down the homestretch of a track they once won races on."

But no trip to an Old Friends facility would be complete without a mini. Fonzi, the little (and we mean little) paint at Kentucky Downs is more or less Little Silver Charm's doppelganger in the south. Visitors can get up close and personal with "the Fonz" on daily tours, too. That is, if his new best pal,

What JoAnn and Mark Pepper and their band of intelligent, invaluable volunteers have done with Old Friends at Cabin Creek: The Bobby Frankel Division in Greenfield Center, N.Y., is nothing short of remarkable. The facility, built nearly single-handedly by Mark, is a picture postcard – a Shangri-La – of Thoroughbred retirement. Home to America's lovable loser, Zippy Chippy, whose motto is "winners don't always finish first," and two-time Whitney victor Commentator, Cabin Creek has done things so well I have to visit to pick up pointers on how to improve our facility in Kentucky.

Over the years, the Peppers have shown great faith in the Old Friends concept. In the beginning, before the current surge in support from New York owners and breeders and some great fundraising during the Saratoga meet, donations were hard to come by. However, with the unerring faith of Vivien Malloy, Jack Knowlton of Sackatoga Stables, Terry Finley of West Point Thoroughbreds, Rick Violette of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, and Mike Repole, who allowed us to retire Cool N Collective, a great son of Ruhlmann, Cabin Creek has prospered.

Every one of its retirees has a great story. From King Congie's unwavering support from West Point, his original owners, when he found himself in a dangerous situation, to Travers winner Will's Way, JoAnn treats them all the same.

Visitors who have never been to a horse race mingle with savvy trainers, owners, and jockeys during tours that are both entertaining and enlightening. And, while it might take some twisting and turning through the back roads of rural Saratoga County, I've never met one person who said it wasn't worth the trip. It's a tribute to the Peppers, the Saratoga community, and all of our great retirees.

The horses always look great. And that's the most important thing.

Cabin Creek is located in Greenfield Center, N.Y., just 10 minutes from Saratoga Racecourse. Tours are open-house style during the summer race meet, and at other times by appointment. For information call Cabin Creek at (518) 698-2377.

Every Breeders' Cup Saturday, like clockwork, a beautiful floral arrangement arrives from Dee Poulos, Ernie Poulos's widow, for special placement on Black Tie Affair's grave. It's meant to commemorate his gate-to-wire victory in the 1991 Breeders' Cup Classic. And it certainly does. But it also does more. His deeds have outlived his mortality. And so it is with all of our old friends.

This past year, 10 of our memorable Thoroughbreds died. Gulch, at 32, was the oldest and, clearly, one of our favorite stars. Independent. Willful. A Hemingway male. "He must be the toughest horse who ever lived," said his one-time trainer and Hall of Famer, LeRoy Jolley, during one of his visits.

He didn't really like being messed with, although he did suck up to Laura Hillenbrand during her stopover. Even at the end, it was hard to tell he was in pain. Gulch was so much larger than life that he had to be buried in two places — half his ashes at Old Friends and the other half at Lane's End Farm, where he had stood at stud.

His son Wallenda was as stoic as his dad. Given his difficult podiatry condition, most horses would have surrendered many years earlier. Not him. He withstood years of prodding and made hoof history with the variety of shoes and applications used to keep him going.

Sarah Arnold, trainer Rusty Arnold's wife, visited regularly to bring treats to her hard-knocking favorite, Delay of Game. She groomed him and adored him, and he returned the favor. They adored each other's company.

Everyone adored Flick. Although I never saw him race, you couldn't help but notice how kind he was. His owner, Judy Carmel, always inquired about him and her generosity took care of many other retirees, including Al the Bingel who didn't have many fans at all. Her namesake owner abandoned her, but Lorita Lindemann took her in, and she was able to live out her days as if she won the Kentucky Oaks.

Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron rode many of our horses and visits them regularly. Futural, who was unfairly disqualified in the Hollywood Gold Cup, was one of his, and our, favorites.

To see, feel, and experience how much Hidden Lake meant to Barbara Fossum is to witness a relationship as deep and rewarding as anything I've ever seen and that includes humans.

We didn't have Halo America very long, but her proud, gray countenance exuded class. Both Moonshadow Gold and Sea Native graced our pastures for years and never made demands.

While I don't object to people that do, I don't believe in the Rainbow Bridge. As much as I'd like to think I'll be reunited with Precisionist, Black Tie Affair, Marquetry, Sunshine Forever, Invigorate, and so many others, I don't think that's going to happen. But I can't imagine that event being any more exhilarating than the individual images I'm blessed to carry in my mind every single day.

When I walk around the cemetery, my thoughts are not of pain and loss and death but joy. The idea that these great friends allowed me to spend my later years with them is beyond my comprehension. And these memories will not die until I do.


My name is Princess. And I'm not a princess in name only. I rule all the other cats here at Old Friends. I am Michael's favorite, his right-hand cat.

Why do I do it? Because I am devoted to Old Friends, so I don't mind playing second fiddle to a bunch of Kentucky Derby winners, to say nothing of the many other champions who live here.

One of my many jobs is helping our new horses adjust to retirement, so they learn pretty quickly that I'm in charge. I'm the little horse with all the answers, so naturally they come to me for advice. For example, I helped (Big) Silver Charm choreograph his paddock routine for visitors. I suggested he stand at the top of the hill until he sees a tour approach, then race to the fence, stop short with a flourish, then pose for photographs directly in front of his paddock sign. It's a hit with visitors, and with (Big) Silver Charm, too. He gets lots and lots of carrots. But does he share any with me?

I continue to branch out in all directions. My latest venture involves being spokeshorse for the town of Georgetown, where Old Friends is located. 

Afternoon Deelites was a sight to behold. In the Futurity, he bided his time, came with a powerful move, seemingly effortlessly moved up on the far turn, took command, opened up, and won in a romp, and all the while, rider Kent Desormeaux just sat there. It set him up as the early favorite for the following year's Kentucky Derby.

While Afternoon Deelites's Derby dreams evaporated turning for home on Churchill Downs's long stretch, his star was not extinguished. He would show his versatility in winning the Grade 1 Malibu later that year and finished his career with a sharp second in the Grade 1 Met Mile in 1996.

Alphabet Soup

It wasn't just his white coat and a shocking upset of Cigar in the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic that made Alphabet Soup stand out.

In nearly three full seasons of racing, Alphabet Soup earned just under \$3 million, with a stakes résumé among the best of his era. Under the guidance of the savvy David Hofmans, the son of Cozzene won or placed in 12 graded stakes and hit the triple-digit mark on the Beyer scale in 12 of his last 13 starts.

The Breeders' Cup Classic field he gamely defeated at nearly 20-1 in 1996 was one of the best in the history of the race. In addition to Cigar, that year's Classic included Louis Quatorze, Editor's Note, Will's Way, and Formal Gold.

Alphabet Soup was retired following a bang-up second to Gentlemen in the 1997 San Antonio Handicap and was shipped off to co-owner Frank Stronach's Adena Springs in Kentucky. It was one of a number of stops the handsome stallion made in a stud career that spanned nearly two decades.

After standing his final season back at Adena Springs, Alphabet Soup, still as sound and good-looking as ever, headed to his new home at Old Friends, giving fans a chance to see a Breeders' Cup Classic winner in the flesh.

I was at Woodbine when Alphabet Soup beat Cigar, and when I heard he was coming to Old Friends, I was happy to get to see him. When he first arrived, I thought we had gotten a “nervous Nellie” at the farm, as he constantly paced and hollered when he was out in the round pen. He sure made a pretty picture, though. Once he moved to a permanent paddock at the front of the farm, I realized, he was not a “nervous Nellie,” but rather the farm busybody – a “nosy Nellie” – as he has to know everything that is going on all the time. He quickly figured out tours and carrots and delights visitors when he follows them along with the tour to make sure he can get every possible carrot. His eyes seem to just pull you in as they mesmerize you. It's hard to believe that he was in the barn when it caught fire in January. He is one lucky horse and a sweetheart, too!

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Adena Springs's Jack Jeziorski first visited the farm several years ago. I inquired about the possibility of retiring some of the great Adena stallions to Old Friends and Jack said he'd look into it. Nothing happened for a while but, early in 2015, Adena's manager, Mike Rogers, came to see Old Friends and I inquired, specifically, about Alphabet Soup and Touch Gold. A few months later, accompanied by a generous donation from Frank Stronach, the most gorgeous horse who ever stepped foot on the farm arrived.

Amazombie

In case there was ever any doubt, Amazombie proved that it is okay to fall in love with a racehorse. Just ask his trainer, Bill Spawr, who owned him with his racing buddy Tom Sanford.

Spawr will tell you Amazombie was honest as a sunrise and durable as a Maytag. As a young horse he was a giveaway, tossed in with the purchase of a barnmate. He needed time, but eventually he settled into a beautiful groove, repeating his races over and over to the delight of his Zombie-loving fans.

Which Amazombie performance tasted best? Most will call up the 2011 Breeders' Cup Sprint in which he beat the best the game could offer, or the race before that in the Ancient Title, when he circled the field to seal the score.

There is support for his 2012 Bing Crosby, a thrilling re-affirmation of class. And then there was the 2011 Sunshine Millions Sprint, when he tipped his destiny by winning a three-way photo while shading 1:08.

Amazombie earned just shy of \$2 million, no small sum for a free horse. In return, he has been given the gift of a life at Old Friends Equine. The exchange rate seems about right.

Originally a "throw-in" as part of a two-horse package purchased for \$5,000 by trainer and part-owner Bill Spawr, Amazombie went on to win three Grade 1 races, including the 2011 Breeders' Cup Sprint, on the way to being named champion sprinter. In December 2011, after his Breeder's Cup Sprint victory, Spawr got a call from a major Kentucky farm. "When Amazombie is done racing, we would love to stand him at stud at our farm," said the stallion manager. "You must have a great veterinarian," was Spawr's reply. "Why?" asked the stallion manager. "Because he has been a gelding since 2009." So much for a stallion career, but the fact he is a gelding allows him to enjoy the attention and carrots he receives each and every day at Old Friends.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

When trainer Bill Spawr decided to retire Eclipse Award champ Amazombie, the timing couldn't have been better. We had just made arrangements to fly Game On Dude to Old Friends from California, and Amazombie got to hop aboard the same flight. Tex Sutton flew them both to Kentucky for free.

Arson Squad

First, there was the name, Arson Squad – way cool, especially since his momma was Majestic Fire. Sam Siegel didn't care if he was a gelding when she bought him. He was a yearling and didn't know better. She wanted a racehorse and got one, 35 starts' worth, \$1.1 million, and a trip to Dubai for the big dance in the desert. I watched him run many times, and I grieved when the tracks in California went synthetic. Arson Squad went east – but not before he won my all-time favorite race, the Strub Stakes, against horses who had won or would win the Hollywood Gold Cup, the Godolphin Mile, the Donn Handicap, the Santa Anita Derby, and two runnings of the Breeders' Cup Sprint. When he was hurt and Siegel said she would do whatever it took to fix him, you just knew everything would turn out okay. Lucky Arson Squad today, living the life at Old Friends.

The amazing horse Arson Squad is aptly named. Aside from being fearlessly heroic on the track, in retirement he showed the firefighter spirit even when it wasn't expected of him. When his paddock mate I'm Charismatic began suffering from the degenerative eye disorder recurrent uveitis, which renders him functionally blind, Arson Squad never left his side. Arson Squad leads his pal around from their run-in shed to the feed bucket to the waterer. He stays with him day and night, providing the comforting presence that makes life much better for his "brother." He looks after his paddock mate selflessly; he leaves no gelding behind. Lexington Fire Department Fire Station No. 5 is proud to sponsor Arson Squad after hearing how he cares for his brother. His halter from his racing days hangs in our communication room at the station.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Arson Squad's career ended prematurely when he was injured in a training accident on New Year's Eve in 2011 at Gulfstream Park. Owner Samantha Siegel sent him to Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, where the 9-year-old gelding survived extensive surgery. We were thrilled when, with Samantha's wholehearted enthusiasm, a recovering Arson Squad arrived at the farm about a month later.

Bint Marscay

“Bint Marscay was probably the most natural 2-year-old I ever trained, and I regard her as a benchmark,” said famed Australian trainer Lee Freedman a few years back when reviewing his greatest horses.

Purchased as a yearling for \$100,000 (Australian) by Sheikh Rashid bin Hamdan al-Nahyan, Bint Marscay emerged as the best of her crop at 2, regardless of gender. In 1993, the flame-coated daughter of Marscay triumphed in the world’s then-richest race for juveniles after breaking from post 14 – considered an “insurmountable draw” – dominating top males and establishing a 1,200-meter record in winning the \$2 million Golden Slipper Stakes in Australia.

“Binty,” as she would come to be known, was retired after a short, injury-plagued career in which she earned \$1,034,821 and embarked on what looked to become a phenomenal broodmare career. Between 1996 and 1999, she produced four consecutive foals, three of whom won in group company, including Group 1 winner Bollinger (the dam of 2009 Louisiana Derby winner Friesan Fire).

In 2002, Bint Marscay was exported to the United States, but reproductive difficulties prevented her from producing another live foal. After a final attempt failed in 2012, the aging champion found her way to Old Friends, where she shared a pasture with Eclipse Award-winning Hidden Lake until the latter’s death last fall. Now 27, Bint Marscay enjoys the company of Ferdinand’s daughter Hidden Dark and Grade 1 producer Miss Du Bois.

Michael Says: As beautiful as she is talented, Bint Marscay is at the very top of Laura Battles’s favorites list. That’s why there are so many flattering photographs of her all around Old Friends. And she deserves it. It gave me great personal pleasure to see her interacting with Hidden Lake through the years. It was like seeing Joan Crawford and Bette Davis, except our classy dames got along much better.

I knew that we were getting Australian champion Bint Marscay at Old Friends and immediately checked her out since I am a big fan of international racing, but she just kind of was “here” for her first couple of years. Then, in the spring of 2016, she was chosen to be the paddock companion of Hidden Lake. As I got to know the little red mare, I realized she had a kind, but stubborn personality. Over the summer, I fell in love with her day by day. Binty soaked up all the attention and would stand all day long to be groomed. When she has an itch, she places herself where she itches and expects to be scratched. Researching her history, I discovered not only did Bint Marscay beat the boys in the Golden Slipper as a 2-year-old, she was very fast doing it. I also discovered that I had seen her last race when she was a 4-year-old back in 1994! I never dreamed that I would one day be the personal servant of one of the horses I saw race that day!

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Frances Relihan, assistant general manager of Vinery, called Old Friends about retiring Bint Marscay, whose breeding career was over. I had never heard of Bint Marscay. But I have now! This Australian-bred was 2-year-old champion in Australia 24 years ago. What a very sweet, smart retiree.

Catlaunch

Let's be clear, a sport can't survive without global superstars. Horses like American Pharoah and California Chrome are as critical to horse racing as Michael Jordan and LeBron James are to basketball.

That said, what makes any sporting endeavor truly enjoyable is the local legend – the competitor who goes almost unknown outside of his local sphere, but you look at him and say, “That’s my guy.”

Catlaunch was “my guy” for many fans on the Ohio circuit, hitting each stop on the state’s handicap division schedule like clockwork over the course of a decade, and winning a lot of them. Of the Ohio-bred program’s three million-dollar earners, only one had his own T-shirt during his ontrack career, and it wasn’t Harlan’s Holiday.

Catlaunch raced 108 times, with all but two of those starts coming in his home state, and he won in stakes company up to age 12. In an era of superstar horses that are too fragile or valuable to run more than a carefully charted handful of times, Catlaunch was a local institution, and he continuously rewarded those who went along for the ride. That’s what makes “my guys” special. That’s what makes Catlaunch special.

Michael says: Catlaunch is the Lou Gehrig of Old Friends – an Iron Horse. In 108 starts over a 10-year career, he won 40 and earned \$1,122,309. He was victorious numerous times in virtually every Ohio-bred stakes race. In 2011, he won the E. Babst Memorial (\$50k) at Beulah on May 7, the M.F. Rowland (\$50k) at Thistledown on May 28, and the Gendelman (\$50k) at River Downs on June 11. The gelded son of Noble Cat earned every penny of his retirement, which they celebrated at Beulah with a special Catlaunch Day.

For 10 years, Catlaunch was a fixture on the landscape of Ohio horse racing. Superman, as he is affectionately known, started 108 times, only twice outside Ohio – winning 40 races and placing in an additional 37. With earnings of \$1,122,309, he retired as only the third Ohio-bred to crack the \$1 million mark. Before he arrived at Old Friends, on a cold winter day in January 2014, Catlaunch called Barn 7 on Beulah Park’s backside home. On the outside, the “Ivan Vazquez Racing Stable” sign was the only feature distinguishing this barn from many others. Once inside, there was no mistaking this barn as Catlaunch’s kingdom. His presence commanded attention – tall, straight, confident, purposeful – and his disposition kept the attention coming. He would stand at this stall door as long as there were peppermints, ear scratches, and kisses. Catlaunch’s connections were generous in sharing Superman with the Ohio racing public. Now at Old Friends, Catlaunch has developed a national fan base.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Catlaunch is the Thoroughbred King of Ohio. At the old River Downs (now Belterra Park), he was the most popular horse of the decade. After trainer Ivan Vasquez and jockey Megan Fadlovich delivered him to Old Friends in 2013, he settled right in. In fact, he’s become one of the kindest, sweetest horses at Old Friends.

Charismatic

The image is indelibly seared into the mind of anyone who saw it – a frightened, sweat-streaked chestnut pulled up just past the wire after finishing third in the Belmont Stakes, his green-and-yellow clad jockey on the ground beside him, cradling a badly damaged left foreleg in his arms to prevent further injury. And so ended Charismatic’s bittersweet quest for immortality, after he had emerged from seemingly nowhere that spring to win the Kentucky Derby and Preakness for owners Bob and Beverly Lewis and Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas.

Thanks to the late Chris Antley’s heroic actions, this Secretariat lookalike survived multiple cannon-bone and sesamoid fractures to be named America’s 1999 Horse of the Year and earn a shot at stud.

Charismatic retired in 2000 to Lane’s End in Kentucky, and he would sire eight stakes winners from three crops, including \$2.2 million-earner Sun King. In 2002, the flashy son of Summer Squall was exported to Japan, where he stood through 2016 at the JBBA’s Shizunai Stallion Station.

Charismatic was not a success abroad, and this past October his retirement from the breeding shed was announced. The 21-year-old vanned into his final home at Old Friends on the evening of Dec. 3, where he joined Silver Charm (1997) and War Emblem (2002) as the farm’s third resident Kentucky Derby-Preakness winner – and the 17th earner of more than \$2 million to reside at Old Friends.

Michael Says: A few days after we’d made arrangements to bring Charismatic home, I was in the back of the musty basement and found a framed, dusty poster of Charismatic’s 1999 Kentucky Derby. On the glass was a Post-it that read: “Save for when he comes home.” It was dated April 11, 2004. After reading Elizabeth Mitchell’s brilliant book, “Three Strides Before the Wire” for the third time and watching the ESPN documentary “Charismatic” over and over again, I couldn’t imagine any horse who we’d rather join Old Friends. He’s a stunning Derby-Preakness winner, joining Silver Charm and War Emblem to complete one of the great trios of all-time. It’s too bad Chris Antley didn’t live long enough to give him a big hug.

We can reel off the stats: Winner of the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness, dual Eclipse Awards, including Horse of the Year, earnings of more than \$2 million. But maybe what fans remember most about the fairy-tale career of Charismatic is that he lost. In spring 1999, Charismatic rose to the top of the 3-year-old ranks from the musty depths of average horses by winning the Lexington. Coming down the stretch at Keeneland, ridden by Chris Antley, who was rising from the ashes of his drug and alcohol demons, he was Cinderella awakening from the big sleep. After winning the Kentucky Derby and then the Preakness, Charismatic found himself on the threshold of being the 12th Triple Crown champion. But in the Belmont Stakes, he crossed the finish line third, pulled up with multiple fractures in his left front leg. It was an ending worthy of the Brothers Grimm – until Antley jumped off and held the colt’s leg off the ground until help arrived, a fractured man tending the wounds of his splintered partner. And in that moment, we knew all was not lost. Charismatic is the third Kentucky Derby winner Old Friends has repatriated from Japan – following Silver Charm and War Emblem – and we’re looking forward to living happily ever after with him.

Commentator

Far too often, speed is considered cheap in the modern Thoroughbred. That could have something to do with the glut of races at six furlongs or shorter at most bread-and-butter tracks in the U.S., along with the well-reasoned belief that if you're going to breed a good Thoroughbred, it should be able to get at least a mile. More likely, it has to do with the fact that speedy horses have only one way to go to lose a race, and that's backward, as if they didn't have the guts or breeding to go any farther. Commentator, a New York-bred gelding, never had cheap speed.

I was standing on the sun-drenched rail at Saratoga for the 2005 Whitney Handicap on a busman's holiday, perfectly free to cheer, when Commentator went to the lead going into the first turn in 23.56 seconds. Up by three, he did the half in 46.41. Now up by five, he went six furlongs in 1:09.76. The Horse of the Year Saint Liam came to get him at the top of the stretch, but Commentator kept going. He won the 1 1/8-mile race by a neck, with the rest of the field at least nine lengths behind. Nothing cheap about it. Those in the know greeted Commentator at the winner's circle, applauding luxuriously.

A lot more of his fans would get to see him, and he could dangle his two Whitney wins over Will's Way and his lone Whitney win. My two favorite memories of 'tator in Kentucky are the time he raced up his paddock and reared in challenge at Williamstown while the old stallion just looked him like “Kids!” The other memory is 'tator doing his “dinner dance.” He always got excited when it was time for dinner and would run and leap around his paddock until his food was put out. He would immediately dump it out and the birds would descend to help him eat.

Commentator was donated to Old Friends by Tracy and Carol Farmer. Both Tracy and Carol visited Old Friends before deciding to trust us with their blazingly quick two-time Whitney winner.

Eldaafer has always done things his own way. One look at him and you know, by the presence of a couple of goats, that he's a different type. He has an entourage that goes everywhere with him. And this is not just an Old Friends act – he had goats at the track, which presumably helped him win 13 races and more than a million dollars.

When he won the Breeders' Cup Marathon, his trainer, Diane Alvarado, said he had a mind of his own. "One morning, he'll want to gallop a mile and a half, and one morning, he'll make you gallop two miles," she said in the interview room after the race. "He's an interesting horse. I mean, he trains himself pretty much. He does what he wants."

When he put his mind to it, he competed at a high level in races at a route of ground. He won or placed in 11 stakes races, with his highlight win coming at Churchill, where he set a track record in taking the Marathon. At age 8, in his last career start, No. 46 in six seasons of racing, he won the Grade 3 Greenwood Cup Stakes at Parx. He bowed out a winner to his adoring fans – and goats.

Eldaafer won on dirt, on a wet track, and he won on the turf. Most of all, he won when he wanted to win. He did it his way. Horses are naturally gregarious; they are herd animals. They thrive in the company of others, and some despair while isolated. Eldaafer, being the uniquely independent and discerning equine he is, created his own herd by incorporating into his life Google and Yahoo, his two goats. It's a reciprocal deal. They stand for each other, best friends and stalwart guards. Eldaafer, son of A.P. Indy, and grandson of Tabasco Cat, won 13 races, including the Breeders' Cup Marathon, and earned more than \$1 million. For me, while witnessing his intelligent keen eye, always coming back for a win, and retiring with a win at age 8 in 2013, well, I stand in awe before him. Then, as if perceiving my respect and my love, Eldaafer looks into me, as if to say, "Yes, I'm good. It's all good. Everything is as it should be." Nearby, Google and Yahoo witness yet another fan of their friend Eldaafer, the horse that did it his way.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Late in 2013, owner-trainer Diane Alvarado decided to retire the 2010 Breeders' Cup Marathon winner after he injured his suspensory. I was thrilled that she would trust us to take care of this seemingly tireless campaigner's well-deserved retirement.

Forte Dei Marmi

Forte Dei Marmi was transformed from a useful handicapper in England into a Canadian champion who competed at the highest level for Hall of Fame trainer Roger Attfield.

It took some time for Attfield to weave his magic with the handy little gelding, who won the Grade 2 Sky Classic Stakes in 2012 in course-record time of 2:00.12 for 1 1/4 miles, before finishing third in both the Grade 1 Northern Dancer Turf and Grade 1 Canadian International.

Forte Dei Marmi struggled mightily in the spring of 2013, but he turned things around abruptly after shipping back to Woodbine that summer, when he won the Sky Classic again after taking the Grade 3 Singpiel. His poor showing over soft ground in the Canadian International was overshadowed by his workmanlike score in a rainstorm in the Northern Dancer, and at year's end he garnered the Sovereign Award for Canada's champion male turf runner in 2013. He was also the runner-up in Canadian Horse of the Year voting.

Forte Dei Marmi's longevity was admired by many. He raced until age 8, winning 10 of 39 starts for earnings of more than \$1 million.

Michael says: Forte Dei Marmi had 17 starts in England before being shipped to Canada. Lucky horse. He didn't hit his stride until he was 6. Thanks to the astute handling of Hall of Famer Roger Attfield, who combined patience and placement in Forte's management, he had a long and distinguished career. Forte Dei Marmi's strong, independent streak made his retirement as smooth and effortless as his stride.

Upon meeting Forte Dei Marmi, my first thought was “he is adorable!” He has beautiful, unique markings, complete with an upside-down exclamation point for a blaze. He came right up to me for an introduction. He was personable, friendly, and very decisive. He wanted attention and treats. I liked him immediately. With his sweet disposition and unusual markings, I nicknamed him “my smore.” Forte now resides in a large paddock with several other geldings. I am always impressed when I visit him. He is smaller than the other horses, but he commands respect and his own space without aggression. He is quite the boss among his fellow paddock mates. No one competes with him. When he sees me, he is consistent. He comes right over and settles in for a visit, waiting for attention and, of course, carrot treats. I didn't think it possible that he could become sweeter, but he has. He now enjoys having a face scratch, ear rubs, and an occasional kiss on the nose. Almost two years now that he has been with us at Old Friends, and he is still one of the most attentive, adorable, fun horses I have known.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

I ran into trainer Roger Attfield at Keeneland and he said he might have a horse that would fit our program. A few days later, he asked if we would be interested in Forte Dei Marmi. I was floored. He was Canada's champion turf male in 2013 at the ripe old age of 7, when he won three graded stakes. Named after a village in Tuscany, he is exactly the sort of champion we appreciate.

Game On Dude

Game On Dude had 34 starts over the course of five racing seasons and won nearly half of them, so there are plenty of memories to take away from his career, but for me, nothing was better than when Game On Dude won the Santa Anita Handicap in 2014 to become the first horse to win that storied race three times.

Game On Dude was clearly in the twilight of his career at that point. He was 7 and had lost three straight races, beginning with a crushing loss in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Classic that cost him titles as champion older horse and Horse of the Year, awards for which he was the front-runner entering that day.

Going back to the 2012 Californian, Game On Dude had been favored in 14 straight races and was odds-on in seven of those races. But having lost three straight, and with Mucho Macho Man and Will Take Charge – the one-two finishers from the previous fall's Breeders' Cup Classic – in the Big Cap, Game On Dude was the distant third choice at 7-2.

But the old boy reached back for one last hurrah. He used his wicked speed, the kind he could carry a distance, to run his rivals off their feet – six furlongs in 1:09.39, a mile in 1:32.57. And he kept on going. It might have been his finest race.

When he ran his last race in August 2014, his owners – Joe Torre, Lanni Family Trust, Mercedes Stable, and Bernie Schiappa, along with trainer Bob Baffert – decided to let the champ, who was 7, to go out on top. Good news for us and for his legions of fans who have come from far and wide to meet him up close and personal. Now “The Dude” is Old Friends's resident puppy dog – a horse that has seemingly left his competitive nature behind. When he came to us Bob and Jill Baffert warned us – “You're going to fall in love with him.” And we have.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Jill Baffert sent us an e-mail just after Game On Dude's owners decided to retire him and was asking about our facility. We were thrilled to be in the running for the future Hall of Famer. After several phone calls from Bob – many of which resembled an IRS audit – Joe Torre, Bernie Schiappa, Debbie Lanni, and Mercedes Stables decided to send him to Old Friends. We were overjoyed.

Genuine Reward

One of the most memorable days I ever had at a track was the first Saturday in May 1980, when a filly – a filly! – won the Kentucky Derby, something that had not happened in 65 years. It was a remarkable feat, totally unexpected, an overwhelming moment. Unfortunately, the much-anticipated career of Genuine Risk as a broodmare was over for all practical purposes before it ever started. She had difficulty foaling her first time trying, producing a dead foal and getting torn up in the process, and she did not produce a live foal until she was 13. She produced only two foals. I wrote a column in 1993 about her producing her long-awaited first foal, the headline on the story titled “Genuine Reward.” Bert Firestone, owner with his wife, Diana, of the mare and who I knew well through friends, sent me a note telling me how much he liked the column and that he was going to name the colt Genuine Reward. I was honored. I still am. And I’m proud and happy he wound up with old friends at Old Friends.

Michael says: Genuine Reward certainly didn’t inherit his mother’s racing talent, but Genuine Risk’s beauty and intelligence are all apparent in this gorgeous chestnut. Obviously, he was very well cared for in Wyoming because he arrived in marvelous physical and mental condition. While he earned nothing from his racing career, his baseball caps, festooned by the Firestone silks, are flying off the shelves of the gift shop, and he’s got thousands of fans who can’t wait to visit.

Breathtaking to say the least, Genuine Reward captivates visitors. Although he never raced, that takes nothing away from this beautiful stallion. Born in 1993, he is a son of Genuine Risk, who won the Kentucky Derby in 1980, one of only three fillies to do so. A mirror image of his famous mother, it’s like having her live with us. After being listed on Craigslist for \$500, he ended up at Old Friends in 2015. Laura Hillenbrand, author of “Seabiscuit” and “Unbroken,” helped with transport expenses for him from Wyoming, where he was at stud. In his breeding career, he sired 47 foals, with 24 starters and 13 winners, and achieved additional success as a sire of polo ponies. Genuine Reward is definitely one of the most popular horses at Old Friends.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Genuine Reward, probably the most famous racehorse who never raced, was finished siring polo ponies in Sheridan, Wyo., so his owners decided to retire him. They didn’t realize selling him for \$500 on Craigslist would ignite a social-media firestorm. When the dust settled and author Laura Hillenbrand and other contributors donated all the necessary funds, Genuine Reward was on his way to Old Friends.

Geri

Geri was among the more underappreciated horses of the 1990s. He won 9 of 19 starts and earned a Beyer Speed Figure of at least 100 on 12 occasions. The handsome son of Theatrical won multiple graded stakes for trainer Bill Mott and amassed \$1.7 million in earnings but competed in the shadow of the great Cigar, who also was owned by Allen Paulson. Perhaps the highlight of Geri's career was his come-from-behind score in the inaugural Woodbine Mile in 1997. The late Chris Antley, who rode him that day, said the chestnut didn't handle the soggy turf on the backside but kicked in strongly through the stretch after finding the firmer ground there more to his liking. Geri remains the lone Woodbine Mile winner to cut back significantly in distance heading into the race.

Michael says: When notified that Geri was flying into New York, I went straight there so I could see him get off the plane. I can't imagine anyone as overjoyed as I was on that sunny summer morning when he stuck his nose out of the Sallee van and stepped foot back on American soil.

He sure ran faster than a wildfire when he won the 1996 Grade 1 Oaklawn Handicap, Grade 3 Creme Fraiche Handicap, and the 1997 Grade 2 Citation Handicap, and when he finished second in the 1996 Hollywood Gold Cup and 1997 Breeders' Cup Sprint. Geri burned up both turf and dirt with agile ease. He looks like fire, too. Refined, graceful, and blazingly red-gold. Geri is bright-eyed, alert, quick to notice what goes on around him, and quicker to react. He doesn't make friends easily – you can't catch fire in a net – but attaining his friendship is more than worth the effort. He loves attention, being cared for in small ways, being groomed, and being groomed some more. Bliss is having his mane combed. It's thick, but fine and silky. When the wind lifts it, it looks like ... well, no other word really gets it. A bright, glowing flame.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Several years ago, Old Friends office manager Sylvia Stiller visited Geri while vacationing in Italy. This striking chestnut son of Theatrical had been pensioned by Azienda Agricola Sant'Uberto Stud. During the summer of 2013, we were notified that the owners were willing to send him home. Through the cooperation and generosity of Andrea Branchini of Horse America and Peden Bloodstock in Germany, Geri arrived home in August 2013.

Ide

There is perhaps no feeling in racing more satisfying than being proven right by a horse you believe in – whether you bred him or bet him. Ide gifted many with that emotional high over and over again from fall 1995 to spring 1996. During that period, he never let the public down.

Ide was favored in the final seven starts of his career and won every time. And most of the races carried implications beyond that afternoon's win picture and payoff. Ide's streak was built on the Kentucky Derby trail – he captured the Iroquois and Kentucky Jockey Club at 2 and proceeded to knock out the Southwest and Rebel at 3.

Ide never had the chance to make his run for the roses due to injury. But the reliability he embodied on the track carried over to the breeding shed, where he became one of the perennial leading stallions in Louisiana. His notable runners have included Ide Be Cool, a winner of the first seven starts of his career who was crowned the 2013 Louisiana-bred of the year for his campaign at 2, and Ide Like a Double, a seven-time stakes winner who earned \$632,416.

Michael Says: I first laid eyes on Ide many years ago at Saratoga when trainer Peter Vestal allowed me to give him a carrot. After losing his first two races, he was on a winning streak that had him headed to the Kentucky Derby as one of the favorites. He was alert, aware, and very, very self-assured. Unfortunately, after running his winning streak to seven, he was hurt and retired. When owner Peter Wilmott, one of the best in the game, called about retiring him after a successful stallion career, we were thrilled. Now, he's part of the Toyota/Georgetown-Scott County Tourism advertising campaign.

Ide is an eye-catching, dark copper chestnut. His striking good looks are complemented by his evenly distributed “chrome” accessories. Much like his famous sire, Forty Niner, Ide has a very muscular build. He easily qualifies as a ruggedly handsome hunk. After a short and successful racing career, Ide has spent the last 18 years as a stallion. The transition from stud to retiree at Old Friends was ... interesting. He was the most vocal new arrival I have experienced. His first two days consisted of relentless nickering and whinnying. We translated to, “Where have all my girlfriends gone?!” The look in Ide's eyes is pure intelligence. He adapted to retiree status very quickly. A very eager, friendly stallion who enjoys visitors on tours, Ide puts on quite a show of appreciation, with bursts of running and following people along his fence line. He makes personal contact with everyone he meets. He does love his carrot treats. Already he has had visits from his former owners and admiring fans from his stud days in Louisiana. I would not be surprised if a former girlfriend shows up! I believe Ide is enjoying life at Old Friends as much as we love having him with us.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Peter Wilmott, a long-time supporter of his alma mater, Williams College, and Old Friends, retired Williamstown and Ide to us. Both Thoroughbreds were named after locations associated with Williams. Basically, we do everything Peter wants us to do as soon as we can do it. He loves visiting his old campaigners. And he gets the Old Friends haberdasher award as best-dressed advocate.

King Congie

Six years ago, King Congie was the real deal. On paper, the Kentucky-bred ridgling was impressive, with double shots of Mr. Prospector and Northern Dancer coursing through his veins, and in appearance he certainly looked the part of a good one when West Point Thoroughbreds paid \$100,000 for him at auction. Following uninspired efforts in his first two starts later that year, the colt was switched to grass – and he was off to bright racing career.

King Congie was trained throughout his career by Tom Albertrani and named for West Point's beloved communications director, Congie DeVito, who died of a bone disease in 2011 at age 35 but lived just long enough to see his namesake win Calder's Tropical Park Derby. Classic dreams were born that afternoon, and the unmarked bay confirmed them with a strong third-place finish in the Blue Grass Stakes before splitting the Preakness field. He ultimately finished on the board in six of 11 starts while banking \$243,740.

When West Point retired its star due to injury, it sprung for an expensive surgery to repair his leg and ensure him a secure future. The young stallion was sent to what they believed would be a responsible new home, where he was used briefly for breeding before quickly falling off the radar. (Congie has two as-yet unraced foals of 2014.) In 2016, the former classic contender was discovered at a livestock auction, where a rescue activist acquired him for \$100. He resides now at Old Friends Cabin Creek in New York alongside Whitney winner Commentator and lovable loser Zippy Chippy.

Michael says: In 2011, King Congie started the year off with an impressive win in the Tampa Bay Derby, followed by finishing third in the Blue Grass Stakes at Keeneland and the Saranac Stakes at Saratoga. In 2016, he became a cause célèbre on the Internet after falling through the cracks. His original owner, West Point Thoroughbreds, under the astute leadership of Terry Finley, came to his aid and he was retired to Old Friends at Cabin Creek with the full support – financial and otherwise – from West Point.

King Congie is named for West Point Thoroughbreds' beloved employee Congie DeVito, who passed away from complications of osteogenesis imperfecta in 2011. He won the Tropical Park Derby, was third in the Blue Grass, and competed in the Preakness. After King Congie sustained a serious injury in April 2012, West Point and his partners sent him for life-saving surgery that required insertion of a metal plate and screws in his left front fetlock. King Congie was adopted after recovering from the surgery and moved on to a second career breeding Quarter Horse mares. Unfortunately, he ended up in the wrong hands and was ultimately rescued by Dawn Robin Petrlik (Rosemary Farm) in summer 2016. West Point then arranged for King Congie to become a permanent resident at Old Friends Cabin Creek. My wife, Debbie, and I visit him regularly. It brings me great joy to watch Congie buck and squeal in his paddock. This situation has us thinking more than ever about how to improve the aftercare structure. It's not easy and we'll never have a perfect solution, but that doesn't mean we can't try. We're incredibly grateful to the selfless team of people at Old Friends who work every day to make horses' lives better.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Thanks to Rosemary Farm Sanctuary, which rescued him from auction, and former owner West Point, King Congie arrived at Cabin Creek in August 2016. Our gratitude to all who participated in assuring this much-loved horse arrived safely at his forever home.

Little Mike

Speaking with Michael Blowen for the featured piece on Little Mike in this issue, the Old Friends founder and president brought up an interesting point about the gelding that I would like to share.

“He introduced us to almost a whole new generation, him and Game On Dude,” Blowen said. “We have all the horses that people like me remember, like Silver Charm, War Emblem, and Charismatic, and those are kind of ‘our’ horses. Now, with Game On Dude being so young and Little Mike being younger, it’s a whole different crowd that likes to come visit them.”

It’s a fascinating insight into the future of Old Friends and its present as a place where owners feel comfortable retiring their high-profile geldings straight to the farm.

Younger race fans have likely heard about the ontrack exploits of the farm’s senior residents, but it always means more when you were there to watch a horse develop into a star in real time and then say goodbye when the time comes to step away from the racetrack.

It’s always special when a new friend becomes an Old Friend.

Michael Says: I thought I was Little Mike. I guess now I’m Littler Mike. Who wouldn’t fall in love with this gorgeous athlete who outran his pedigree and everything else that anyone threw at him? I still remember his win in the Breeders’ Cup when he was sent off at long odds and very little respect. He also didn’t get much respect from the Eclipse Award voters. I think he’s the only horse to win the Breeders’ Cup Turf, Arlington Million, and Woodford Reserve Turf Classic in the same year and not win the Eclipse. But he gets all the respect he’ll ever need at Old Friends.

Being a fan of turf runners, I always enjoyed watching Little Mike compete. During his 2012 campaign, he won stakes races at four different distances and tracks, with the finale being his victory in the Breeders’ Cup Turf, in which he defeated the best turf horses in the world. In a season when he earned a well-deserved Eclipse Award nomination, finishing as runner-up for champion turf male to eventual Horse of the Year winner Wise Dan, my level of respect and admiration for him soared. When he was retired to Old Friends in July 2016, I was again amazed that such a fierce competitor on the racetrack could be one of the kindest horses anyone would ever want to meet.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Years ago, Little Mike’s owner-trainer, Carlo Vaccarezza, called me about retiring the winner of the Breeders’ Cup Turf, Woodford Reserve Turf Classic, and Arlington Million. He had suffered an injury. Then, I didn’t hear anything for more than two years. Carlo, after a lot of time, patience, and money, brought him back to the track. He didn’t win. A few weeks later, Carlo and Little Mike came to Old Friends.

Nobiz Like Shobiz

Nobiz Like Shobiz, a son of Albert the Great, is one of the newest members of the Old Friends roster, having arrived there in October after standing stud duty at Crestwood Farm in Kentucky.

Nobiz Like Shobiz is a six-time graded stakes winner, with his biggest victory coming in the Grade 1 Wood Memorial in 2007 at Aqueduct, where he beat Sightseeing by a half-length. He finished 10th in the Kentucky Derby but gave trainer Barclay Tagg a bit of a thrill at the quarter pole.

“At the head of the lane, he was head-and-head, then he threw in the towel,” said Tagg, who trained Nobiz Like Shobiz for Elizabeth Valando.

Two starts after the Derby, Tagg transferred Nobiz Like Shobiz to the turf, a surface over which he reeled off consecutive stakes victories in the Grade 2 National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame at Saratoga, the Grade 3 Kent at Delaware Park, and the Grade 2 Jamaica Handicap at Belmont Park. He finished fourth in the Breeders’ Cup Mile over a soft Monmouth Park turf course before ending his career with an eighth-place finish in the Grade 1 Hollywood Derby.

For his career, Nobiz Like Shobiz won 7 of 13 starts with earnings of \$1,544,730. His other graded stakes wins came in the Grade 2 Remsen at 2 and the Grade 3 Holy Bull at 3.

“I thought he was better on the turf,” Tagg said. “He was a big, hearty, strong horse.”

Michael says: The gorgeous black stallion could have had a brilliant career as a leading man on Broadway if he were born human. Trained By Barclay Tagg, this impressive son of future Old Friends retiree Albert the Great was a favorite of Mrs. Valando. According to Tagg, she turned down more than \$18 million for him. Fortunately, he spent his later years under the wonderful care of the McLean family at Crestwood Farm.

Nobiz Like Shobiz immediately found a place in my heart. After our Wallenda passed away earlier this year, I promised myself I would not get emotionally close to another horse. I’ve heard it said, “When a door closes, a window opens.” Well, with Shobiz a barn door opened wide. When I first saw Shobiz, all I could say was, Wow! This very dark bay horse is huge, powerful looking, and gorgeous! When racing, Shobiz made his mark on dirt as well as turf. As a new retiree at Old Friends, he already has a win – we love him! When I visit him, I laugh. I laugh a lot! Attentive and curious, he likes to “test the waters” with your limits. I initially saw a lot of lip and plenty of teeth. Popcorn Deelites

Popcorn Deelites may end up being one of the most viewed Thoroughbreds of all time, but it isn't due to his work on the racetrack, though the gelding saw some success, winning 11 of 58 starts in six racing seasons. The bulk of his work came in the low-level claiming ranks, and even when people see him, they don't realize they're watching HIM.

Instead, his visibility is due to an uncanny resemblance to a most famous horse: Seabiscuit.

His bay coloring with some dark points makes him the spitting image of that legendary runner, and for the movie of the same name in 2003, Popcorn Deelites had a starring role. He was one of six horses used in the movie as a Seabiscuit double. Popcorn Deelites's primary role was to play that historic horse breaking from the gate, as well as racing. So, as long as "Seabiscuit" is around, so too is Popcorn Deelites.

Michael says: Popcorn Deelites wasn't much of a racehorse, but there is something special about him: He bears a striking resemblance to Seabiscuit. Rapid Redux

The streak began on a Thursday night in December 2010.

Rapid Redux, a 4-year-old gelding, won the seventh race of his career in an \$8,000 claimer at Penn National. It was one of scores of claiming races run throughout the nation that day and seemed like nothing more than a blip on the parimutuel radar at the time.

The race turned out to be historic. Rapid Redux never lost again.

Over the next 13 months, he won 21 consecutive races at Charles Town, Laurel, Mountaineer, Parx Racing, ThistleDown, and Timonium, racing primarily in starter-allowance company.

Through 2011, the buzz surrounding Rapid Redux increased, and the appreciation of the Pleasantly Perfect gelding stretched across the nation. He approached and went past the 19-race winning streak shared by 2010 Horse of the Year Zenyatta and the New Mexico star Peppers Pride before Thanksgiving of 2011 and won what would be his final start at Laurel on Jan. 4, 2012.

For his winning streak, Rapid Redux was honored with a Special Eclipse Award in 2011. In the spring of 2012, it was decided that he would not race again. He was bound for a deserved retirement at Old Friends.

Rapid Redux. An odd name, even for a Thoroughbred, wouldn't you say? So let's break that down for some insight. Rapid, meaning speedy, swift, quick, and redux, meaning to bring back or revive. In other words, he was fast over and over and over again. Rapid Redux, a chestnut gelding by Breeders' Cup Classic winner Pleasantly Perfect out of a daughter of Storm Cat, holds the modern North American record for consecutive races won— 22. That's more than Zenyatta, more than Cigar, even more than Citation (though Rapid's races were not of the graded stakes variety). For his efforts, he was awarded a Special Eclipse Award in 2011, and his gutsy spirit also earned him the Secretariat Vox Populi Award. In all, Rapid Redux, a \$6,200 claim in 2010, earned 28 wins in 42 lifetime starts and more than \$360,000 in earnings. After announcing the horse's retirement in 2010, owner Robert Cole Jr. and trainer David Wells made the decision to donate Rapid Redux to Old Friends, where he has met with a legion of dedicated fans, including younger racegoers who gamely followed his winning streak. These days RR seems to be enjoying his, well, R&R and is no longer in much of a hurry. Though he's still pretty speedy when it comes to snatching carrots away from paddock mate, Amazombie!

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Owner Robert Cole Jr. gave Rapid Redux to trainer David Wells, and David gave him to us. And we are very, very grateful. David has visited Rapid Redux at the farm and supports him financially. We thank him very much.

Sarava

With a half-mile left to run in the 2002 Belmont Stakes, Sarava didn't get a call. He was racing fourth, just behind the leaders, while going nicely on the bridle, but track announcer Tom Durkin, focused like most of the crowd on War Emblem's failing Triple Crown bid, missed Sarava.

When Durkin returned to the front of the Belmont field at the three-furlong pole, Sarava was back on his map, and as the lead pack turned for home and Sarava knifed through to engage Medaglia d'Oro for the lead, it became clear that Sarava, against the odds, was not going away.

"A huge upset is looming here," Durkin said as the finish neared. "Under the line, Sarava has won! The biggest longshot in the history of the Belmont Stakes at 70-1!"

Where did the race come from? The Belmont was Sarava's third career win – and his last. He didn't start for more than 13 months afterward, and never again for Ken McPeck. In the summer of 2004, out of the blue, Sarava finished a close fifth in the Grade 1 Suburban and a close fourth in the Grade 1 Whitney. Those races, respectable performances against high-class competition, provided some validation for Sarava's Belmont performance. But posterity will remember Sarava for the sheer improbability of a victory on one of racing's biggest stages.

Michael says: When Sarava, the longest shot in Belmont history, won, I tore up my losing tickets in a huff. Now, I'm overjoyed that he won because he's drawn thousands of fans to Old Friends. Recently, several Brazilian students told us that Sarava's name, in an Afro-Brazilian dialect, means "message to the gods."

I arrived at Old Friends to work as a tour guide in summer 2016. Before doing my own tours, I followed many of the tour guides around the farm to learn as much as possible about these retired Thoroughbreds and their entertaining stories. Sarava, the first horse that I met, is a beautiful dark bay. The guide informed visitors of the safety rules when interacting with stallions, including keeping our distance from the fence and to be careful feeding carrots as some stallions have been known to bite. Very soon, I found that if I fed Sarava a carrot and backed away, he seemed to accept me quickly. I respect a horse's space, and I think that is why they have accepted me. Sarava comes when I call him, and I have snuck a rub on his nose just while walking by him. With Sarava, as with other stallions, it's always best to have respect and stay on your guard. The other day, as I was walking around the farm talking and feeding carrots to the horses, I stopped to speak to Sarava. I reached up to lightly touch his face. He quickly gave a snap, but not biting me, as if to say, "Not yet." I backed away and told him, "Okay then, friends still." We're building trust.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

In 2012, bloodstock agent Tom Bozarth asked me if we'd like to have Sarava, who had been standing stud at Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Fla. I jumped at the chance. Not only did we get our first winner of a Triple Crown race, but owners Gary and Kitty Drake of Louisville, Ky., and Paul and Susan Roy of Britain donated \$30,000 to his care. The Drakes often stop by to feed Sarava carrots and mints.

Silver Charm

Bob Baffert has won the Kentucky Derby four times now and, owing to American Pharoah, even has a Triple Crown winner on his résumé. But it was Silver Charm who first got him to the winner's circle on the first Saturday in May, and that victory came one year after a brutal loss, one that left Baffert wondering if he'd ever get a better chance on Derby Day. Cavonnier, Baffert's first starter in the Kentucky Derby, was beaten in the 1996 Derby in the very last jump by Grindstone. A year later, Silver Charm was in a dogfight with Captain Bodgit.

"Please don't do it; Lord, please don't do it to me again," Baffert said he pleaded as the horses neared the wire.

When the horses hit the finish, Baffert collapsed into the arms of Bob Lewis, who owned Silver Charm with his wife, Beverly.

"I didn't think I'd feel like that," Baffert said. "It was an unbelievable experience. My stomach hurt so much when they hit the wire, I couldn't move."

That tenacity was Silver Charm's calling card. Of his 12 wins, six – including a dead heat – were by a head or less. Silver Charm was the first horse with whom Baffert won the Dubai World Cup and was the first Kentucky Derby winner to also win that rich race.

Michael says: Dec. 1, 2014, was one of the happiest days of my life. When Silver Charm, led by Three Chimneys's Sandy Hatfield, calmly strolled off the Sallee Van, it marked a milestone in Old Friends history. And it allowed me to have my favorite Thoroughbred of all time in my backyard. He has lived up to all of our lofty expectations with his dignity and grace. How does it get any better than that?

When Silver Charm arrived at Old Friends in December 2014, life as we know it changed. This son of Silver Buck out of Bonnie's Poker (herself an Old Friends retiree) made one small step off the trailer, but it was one giant leap for aftercare-kind. Silver Charm coming to Old Friends was the culmination of years of work and years of dreamy imagining. Here was another American stallion returned from stud duty abroad. Here was our first Kentucky Derby-winning retiree. Here was Michael Blowen's favorite horse. Here was affirmation from the racing and breeding industry that Old Friends was the best place for the best in the business. Since then our tourism has increased tenfold – regular visitors include jockey Gary Stevens and trainer Bob Baffert. He's also become a media darling. His keen intelligence, handsome good looks, and impressive résumé (the 1997 Kentucky Derby and Preakness and the 1998 Dubai World Cup) make him camera ready, helping to bring the mission of Old Friends and the face of Thoroughbred retirement to the masses. And if that isn't enough, he's always willing to pose for a selfie.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Thanks to Beverly and Jeff Lewis and the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association, Silver Charm is at Old Friends. When he left the United States a decade ago, he carried with him a buyback clause that Robert Lewis insisted on. When his breeding life was finished, the Lewises enforced the clause – and here he is.

Sokitumi Samurai

There are many different reasons to respect a racehorse. Success at the highest level of the game garners widespread admiration. Horses on long win streaks develop fan bases, as do those who have a reputation for hitting the wire first. Still others build followings for getting the job done into their golden years.

Beyond those examples, there's another type of racehorse who merits respect: the popular claim. It's tough to change barns often and keep performing. But that's what Sokitumi Samurai did. Claimed nine times during his 35-race career, the gelding continually adapted to new environments, new feed programs, and new connections, all while compiling a record of 6 wins, 7 seconds, and 5 thirds. He earned \$260,222 – the hard way.

Sokitumi Samurai never saw stakes action but had some memorable times on the track. He defeated \$25,000 maiden-claiming rivals by 12 lengths in a 2012 start at Belmont Park. Sokitumi Samurai got on a three-race win streak in 2014. During that streak, he was claimed twice and won for both of his new barns. Sokitumi Samurai was haltered one last time a few months later for a \$16,000 tag out of his final career start in August 2014.

At Old Friends, he has found a place to call home.

Michael says: In many ways, Sokitumi Samurai is a great symbol of the hard-knocking, always-trying Thoroughbreds that make up the majority of athletes that compete day after day, week after week, month after month at tracks that form the backbone of the sport. His trainer, Diane Balsamo, adores him and regularly calls the farm inquiring about him. While he never competed in the Derby, he's very cute and a welcome addition to the tours.

Thinking about Sokitumi Samurai always brings a smile to my face. Besides his handsome blaze, he has the personality to go along with his good looks and talent. With his looks, breeding, and determination, I loved every day with him. He was tough to gallop, but we did okay together, and he always picked up checks. He was claimed from me several times. I claimed him back. In August 2014, I claimed him back one final time, sensing that something may be wrong. Upon his arrival in Saratoga, where I was based, I X-rayed him and discovered he had a leg fracture. I called Michael Blowen and asked if he had room for this wonderful boy. Michael said he would be glad to have him. I hated to see him go, but he had done his job and deserved retirement. I spent one last week with him, and then it was time for him to leave racing. I was so happy to know where he was going to be. At Old Friends, Laura Battles keeps me posted with photos. I glow every time I see him and was blessed to visit him on Breeders' Cup Day in 2015. It made my day! Sokitumi Samurai is one of the special ones that tugs at your heart, and I will always remember him.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

New York-based trainer Diane Balsamo called us about this son of First Samurai more than two years ago. We were happy to oblige. While the Derby winners and Breeders' Cup champions get the most attention, it's the Sokitumis of the world that form the day-in, day-out foundation of racing. And they certainly earned their retirements.

Special Ring

You can't miss him. He's the stocky, bright bay with a cheerful disposition who greets guests at the fence with the curl of his lip, displaying a tattoo well known to Southern California race identifiers a decade and a half ago. It's a quirky performance put on daily by the 20-year-old gelding known as Special Ring, preferably in exchange for treats. On the surface, one could hardly recognize this playful clown as a former West Coast terror – a dominant, fire-breathing force on grass, over which he smashed speed records, won multiple Grade 1 events, and beat the best from around the world.

Gelded late at age 4 due to a “nightmarish” temperament, the classically bred son of Nureyev eventually settled down for trainer Julio Canani and in the early 2000s came into his own while establishing himself as the undisputable king of the Del Mar turf. During a three-year span, Special Ring was unbeatable at that seaside oval as he captured back-to-back editions of the \$400,000 Eddie Read Handicap, once in a record 1:45.87 for 1 1/8 miles, and scorched a mile at Del Mar in record time of 1:32.72. When retired at 8 in 2005, he had won or placed in 17 of 29 career starts and banked \$915,023 for owner Prestonwood Farm.

Special Ring is now in his 12th year of charming and entertaining visitors at Old Friends, alongside his best friend and paddock mate, Popcorn Deelites, star of the 2003 movie “Seabiscuit.”

We could tell you that Special Ring started his career in France, winning his maiden at Maisons-Laffitte and winning stakes at Chantilly and Saint-Cloud. We could also tell you that in the United States, he ran for Jack Preston's Prestonwood Farm and was trained by Julio Canani, who saddled the gelding for seven wins, including back-to-back victories in the Grade 1 Eddie Read Handicap at Del Mar. But what we really want to tell you is that this blood-bay son of Nureyev – who was donated by his owner and has been with us since 2005 – has learned to curl his upper lip and show you his tattoo if you give him a treat. Try it. Curl, chomp. Curl, chomp. Curl, chomp. It's as certain as death and taxes. Who says you can't teach an old horse new tricks?

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Jack Preston, who owned Prestonwood Farm, campaigned this multiple stakes-winning gelding until Special Ring was 9. He called Tim Overton, who was the farm manager for Alfred Nuckols's Hurstland Farm where Old Friends was based at the time. Tim said Special Ring was a great horse and, at the time, Old Friends had a great slot for him. A few days later, Special Ring arrived from just a few miles away, and he's been here ever since.

Timothy James

Timothy James never raced. In fact, he never received a lip tattoo, one of the registration requirements needed to be able to race.

But Timothy James became a part of the national awareness of the humane care of horses when he was part of the herd in the prominent case of abandonment involving Charles Borell and his daughter, Maria Borell. That he was bred by Charles and Maria Borell, though not owned by them, makes his case all that more poignant.

Less than a year earlier, Maria Borell was the toast of racing as the trainer of Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Runhappy. The tragic case of abandonment changed that narrative in an instant. The plight of horses like Timothy James brought national attention to the need for sanctuaries and homes for horses who have left the track – or never even made it to the track.

Old Friends stepped in to take several of the horses from the Borell herd, and Timothy James now has a secure and safe future. He came in emaciated and has flourished in the Old Friends environment, gaining all the weight he needed, and he has settled in nicely at the Georgetown farm.

Timothy James will always be a reminder of the good things that happen to horses when people care.

Horses come to us from all kinds of places. Farms pensioning a stallion, owners doing the right thing, fans who claim horses off the track to expedite retirement. And then there are those that migrate to us from less-than-conscionable situations. Timothy James, a 4-year-old colt when he arrived here, was one of 43 horses rescued in Mercer County in central Kentucky, abandoned by Chuck Borell and his daughter, trainer Maria Borell. But this dark bay colt, it turns out, had people who really loved him. The real Timothy James, the son of Alice and Wayne Reynolds, was a friend of Maria's – the two meeting and bonding on Facebook over their great love of Derby winner Sunday Silence. Sadly, Timothy passed away, and Maria asked his parents if she could name the colt born to her mare Dancin' Charisse in his honor. They said yes, and soon formed their own friendship. But not long after Maria saddled Runhappy to win the Breeders' Cup Sprint in 2015, the Reynoldses began to lose touch, and soon they began to read about the dark situation in Mercer County. As part of a state and county rescue operation, TJ was one of two Borell horses that landed at Old Friends. Needless to say, the Reynoldses were quick to reunite with their late son's namesake. Timothy James is doing much better these days. He's in good weight and enjoying learning how to just be a horse again, proving that sometimes even the darkest tunnel has a light at the end.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Timothy James was part of a herd of more than 40 horses abandoned on a farm in Mercer County, Kentucky. Old Friends was one of 14 local farms who took part in a relocation effort and offered sanctuary for two of the horses that needed immediate care when they were seized by the state veterinarian office. Thanks to his owners, Timothy James has found a permanent home with the Old Friends herd.

For nearly 20 years I have been awaiting the chance to repay the favor to Touch Gold for bailing me out, and for those that happened to trust my opinion back on a famous afternoon of racing.

Push the rewind button to June 1997 when Silver Charm was seeking to become a Triple Crown winner in the Belmont Stakes after winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. And though I respected Silver Charm, I was thrilled about the prospect of betting against him at a short price – with Illinois Derby winner Wild Rush.

I told friends in the *Daily Racing Form* office that year: Wild Rush – bet him. Well, Wild Rush gave me a Belmont rush for only a mile or so, then began his retreat. And that's when his entymate Touch Gold saved the day, rallying wide under Chris McCarron to catch Silver Charm in the closing strides. Thanks to Touch Gold being coupled in the wagering with Wild Rush, I was wrong and still got to collect a \$7.30 mutuel, leaving me that day much luckier than smart.

With the benefit of hindsight, Wild Rush had nothing on Touch Gold as a 3-year-old, and for that matter, it could be argued that not even Silver Charm and Free House – other top 3-year-olds of that year – were of his quality for at least a few months that summer, when Touch Gold also won the Haskell, and prior to the Belmont was an unlucky fourth in the Preakness after stumbling to his face at the start and injuring a hoof.

He is a splendid addition to Old Friends, and I'm sure many, like me, will forever remember his 1997 Belmont victory, whether they bet him (or his stablemate) or not.

Tour of the Cat

Tour of the Cat is a true son of Florida. He was bred, foaled, and sold at auction in the Sunshine State and spent most of his nine racing seasons competing at its various tracks. A modestly bred son of Tour d'Or, he brought just \$18,000 at a 2000 2-year-old sale in Ocala and then was haltered for \$25,000 in his racing debut seven months later. More than four years would pass before Tour of the Cat was again put up for offer in a claiming event.

From the start, the bay gelding outran his pedigree and all expectations. Though Derby dreams faded early, Tour of the Cat would win or place in 25 Florida stakes, peaking at 5 with a trio of graded scores, including the Grade 2, \$200,000 Richter Scale Sprint Championship Handicap at Gulfstream Park.

Time eventually took its toll. He remained a moneymaking machine long past the time when most runners had been retired. Remarkably, he continued winning at ages 9, 10, and 11, and his competitive spirit burned hot as ever even as his body began to betray him – to the point where a Finger Lakes veterinarian deemed him unfit to race. But race he did, underweight and reportedly on sore ankles. A long, slow descent down the claiming ranks ended in his 70th start, when the millionaire graded stakes winner was claimed for \$5,000 and retired to Old Friends. Tour of the Cat resides today at Old Friends's satellite facility at Kentucky Downs, along with Canadian champion Thornfield and \$730,470 earner Ball Four.

Tour of the Cat first came to our attention in a Joe Drape New York Times article that detailed how this graded stakes winner of more than a million dollars was preparing to make his 80th career start at the lower end of the claiming ranks. When Maggi Moss stepped in and claimed him, Old Friends stepped up and provided him a forever home. I did a tour one day and a visitor came up to me afterward asking to see Tour of the Cat. It was Dr. Mary Scollay, a former track vet who had been one of Tour's guardian angels when he was racing in Florida. Tour of the Cat may have fallen from the highest levels of competition to the lowest levels, but he always had guardian angels watching over him, repaying his kind eye and gentle disposition with a safe retirement.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

Tour of the Cat's journey to Old Friends was long and winding. After 79 starts, including back-to-back wins in the Miami Mile Breeders' Cup Handicap and the Spend a Buck Stakes at Calder in 2003, this son of Tour d'Or started to descend the claiming ladder. Many of his fans contributed to the awareness of his downward path, but we're very grateful to both Maggi Moss for claiming him, Beverly Strauss of Mid-Atlantic Horse Rescue, and Dr. Margaret Ohlinger of the Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program.

War Emblem

He can be devious, aloof, temperamental, and enigmatic, but he is undeniably magnificent – and knows it. War Emblem may not be the easiest character to deal with at Old Friends, but since the dual classic winner's arrival in 2015, he has certainly been among the most interesting.

War Emblem could have been penned by rags-to-riches author Horatio Alger, having been a modestly bred \$20,000 yearling who rose to the very apex of his sport. Under Bob Baffert's tutelage, the nearly black colt won three \$1 million races in 2002 – the Kentucky Derby, Preakness, and Haskell Invitational – and earned a \$1 million bonus for adding the \$500,000 Illinois Derby to his résumé before retiring with \$3 million in the bank and an Eclipse Award on the shelf.

He sold for \$17 million to Japan for a much-anticipated stud career, but the opinionated young stallion had ideas of his own, turning out to be picky, disinterested, and weirdly averse to grays. A fortune was spent on physiological testing and libido “therapy,” and after an appalling four-foal debut crop, War Emblem improved to 33 in 2005. But he remained erratic. In 2010, he “accepted” just five of the nearly 300 mares brought to him; the following year, not one would do. Sadly, he could have been a contender as better than 15 percent of his runners were of stakes class, including a champion.

Last January, War Emblem was gelded to avoid import regulations requiring he breed two mares in testing for contagious equine metritis. He had made it quite clear that wasn't an option ... and so it goes.

Michael says: War Emblem has what all great athletes – human or equine – possess: talent, intelligence, and iron will. While he has settled in in the past year, he still wants everyone to know that he's a dual classic winner, and you're not.

To work with War Emblem every day is to know a horse that is by some measures, but not all, the most intelligent horse currently enjoying retirement at the farm. He is that smart. Of course, if brute intelligence is the only factor under review then Superman could give the same report about his arch nemesis, the enigmatic supervillain Lex Luthor. Similar is life with our own master of enigma, War Emblem. War Emblem also has the body of a Greek god walking earth in the guise of a horse, the face of a GQ model, and an overflow of natural talent. On the other hand, he has the maturity of a spoiled kid throwing a tantrum in a toy store, the patience of a gnat, and pretty much embodies the equine version of the term “tactile defensive” when work on his legs is involved. But all of that describes War Emblem locked into a loop of overthinking things. That is a loop that is slowly, but surely, being weakened. When he first arrived at his new home, War Emblem appeared a horse with a ton of things on his mind, all moving at 100 mph. But to see him today, he is to see a markedly more relaxed and settled horse. He is clearly a king at peace with his kingdom. Credit for this should be happily shared by everyone – staff, volunteers, and visitors who are combining to give War Emblem the life of leisure and enjoyment that he has so enthusiastically embraced.

PATH TO OLD FRIENDS

In fall 2002, War Emblem was sold to the Yoshida family of Japan to stand at their Shadai Stallion Station. When he was retired from stud duty in 2015, the Yoshida family generously agreed to donate him to Old Friends.

Windy Land

It's not just the greats who are loved. Take, for example, the late Mixed Pleasure.

Mixed Pleasure, a son of the obscure Bold Ruler-line stallion Sucha Pleasure, wound up somewhat obscure himself after a good start on the track. He won a stakes at Golden Gate in his second start as a 2-year-old and was second in the Grade 2 Hollywood Juvenile Championship but two years later was racing unsuccessfully for a \$5,000 tag. He actually went to stud and was bred to a few mares, but he sired only five foals over an eight-year period. He did get two starters, both winners, but they earned only \$9,417 between them in 31 starts. Mixed Pleasure was forgotten and eventually had to be rescued at the age of 27 in Oregon, and he then found a home at Old Friends in Kentucky.

His caregiver, John Bradley, absolutely adored him. After Mixed Pleasure died in 2015 at the age of 30, John thought it would be a good idea for Michael Blowen to consider making a home for one of his sons. And now at the Dream Chase location in Georgetown is Windy Land, who was unraced, but that does not preclude any horse from earning a good retirement home or from care and affection.

John walks around beaming about Windy Land, showing him off to all visitors like a proud father.

Kris Jakeman pensioned her to Old Friends, where she tolerated us for several years. She ran the mare paddock until the day she died.

Bull Inthe Heather



His grave was relocated to Old Friends in 2011, when his former resting spot was deemed in jeopardy of development.

Everyone loved him.


