

I'm in a place that I wouldn't trade with anyone, no matter how rich or famous or smart or beautiful. I was in my own mystical place. It was as if I discovered both the Fountain of Youth and Shangri-La in my own backyard. And I wasn't even looking.

Happiness doesn't even begin to describe the moment. I've been happy before . . . many times every day . . . but there was nothing like this feeling of transcendence. It must be the sectarian version of Nirvana.

And I owe it all to everyone who helped me out and picked me up and rescued me from my own incompetence over the past two decades. Whether you wrote a kind note or donated a few dollars or told me to keep my eye on the ball, it all added up to this one indescribable feeling.

Daily Racing Form has published this magazine for 11 years at no charge to Old Friends, and the issues provide a comprehensive memoir of how far we've traveled.

When I first started Old Friends, I needed some advice, so I made an appointment to visit with former Kentucky Gov. Brereton C. Jones at his Airdrie Stud in Midway, Ky. As he sat behind his splendid antique desk, apparently listening, I explained the idea.

"So, let me get this straight," he said. "You're going to get these old horses... and bring some back from Japan... and you're not going to breed them or race them or sell them. What exactly are you going to do?"


"I'm going to put them in my backyard and invite people to visit," I responded. He looked at me as if I were a Republican before reaching into his top desk drawer and pulling out a tattered checkbook.

As he wrote out a \$5,000 check to Old Friends, he said "Good luck to you. I hope it works. Keep in touch."

But his tone belied a certain skepticism. Over the years, I've been honored by his friendship and his support. We even got to retire two of his Airdrie stallions, You and I and Afternoon Deelites.

It took 20 years, but we now have retired hundreds of Thoroughbreds – from Hall of Famers Silver Charm, Precisionist, and Lava Man to my old gelding, Summer Attraction, who I claimed for \$3,500 on a soggy Mother's Day in 1999 at Finger Lakes. These athletes have attracted more than 100,000 visitors, many of whom have become wonderful friends. One of my favorites is the famous movie star Angie Dickinson, who has supported us from the beginning and calls every time she hears that the weather has taken a turn for the worse in Kentucky.

And there are so many others. Really old friends like John and Alan and Joe who encouraged me from the beginning. I think they were too kind to share their doubts. And, my son, Dylan, who put up with my passion, and my daughter, Lorita, without whom I would be a lot more ignorant than I already am.

And I want to thank all of those who put their hard-working, knowledgeable stamp on Old Friends, especially Antonio Marin. He is the pinnacle of all the great farm managers that built Old Friends.

How do you explain the unexplainable? How one gray horse, from an obscure background, would carry those who touched his life, and were in turn touched by him, on the ride of a lifetime?

It all started when the now-revered Silver Charm was bred by smallscale breeders who had faith in an unlikely stallion cross for their mare, who had only raced in claiming races. It's the story of how a trainer took the horse near the beginning of what would be a Hall of Fame career and his rise to national prominence when the gray colt provided him his first Kentucky Derby victory.

It's the story of how Silver Charm provided the inspiration to a young girl to be a devoted fan of racing after watching Silver Charm win the 1997 Derby, leading her to pursue her passion across the ocean and one day herself be involved in the sport. It's the story of how Old Friends founder Michael Blowen got his favorite horse of all time back to the U.S. to be an ambassador for all retired racehorses, and show how all retired horses should be treated after their racing and breeding careers have ended.

Following are reflections on how Silver Charm inspired and rewarded so many people throughout his life.

A humble beginning

From an unassuming background, the horse of a lifetime

You have heard the saying that racing is the Sport of Kings. This could not be further from the truth regarding Silver Charm, his dam, Bonnie's Poker, or my parents, Gordon and Mary Lou Wootton, who bred him.

My dad lost his mother at an early age and spent his formative years at a military school in Tennessee where his passion for horses took hold. My parents met and got married at the University of Maryland – not too far from Pimlico Racecourse – where he and my mom often visited the track as racing fans. Many years later, after my dad's successful career on Wall Street, they claimed their first Thoroughbred at Aqueduct in 1984. One of those claims was the hard-knocking filly Bonnie's Poker. During her four years of on the racetrack, she won 11 races in 63 starts, finishing second or third 19 times, and earning \$153,960.

After she incurred a few injuries, the decision was made to retire her and send her to the breeding shed. My father studied sire line nicking patterns and liked what he saw with Silver Buck, a stallion standing at Silverleaf Farm in Ocala, Fla., so for her second mating, he chose Silver Buck for Bonnie's Poker. Bonnie's Poker was eventually sent to Scott and Diane Dudley in Ocala, Fla., who took care of her while she was in foal to Silver Buck.

That first mating of Bonnie's Poker and Silver Buck produced a filly who won several races, but it was merely a prelude of what was to come. Several years later, Bonnie's Poker was sent back to Silver Buck because my father said he liked the cross between the two.

A healthy, but unremarkable-looking colt was produced, the yet-to

be-named Silver Charm, and as a yearling he was consigned to the 1995 Ocala Breeders' Sale Co. sale. My parents flew down to Ocala from New York to see the sale in person. Unfortunately, the flight was delayed, and they missed seeing Silver Charm enter the sales ring.

Much to my dad's dismay, the colt was purchased by pinhookers for the paltry sum of \$17,000, which was not much considering the \$6,000 stud fee. My dad said if they had arrived on time for the sale that he would have bought back the colt.

You know the rest of the story. After the colt changed hands a few times, Silver Charm ended up in the barn of trainer Bob Baffert for owners Bob and Beverly Lewis. Despite the fact that my parents sold Bonnie's Poker's yearling for a small sum and the colt went on to fame and fortune capturing the public's imagination in the chase for the elusive Triple Crown and ultimately winning nearly \$7 million, I never heard my father say "If only I had" or "I should have, would have, could have."

My parents were at Churchill Downs in 1997 to see him win the Kentucky Derby, and the whole family went to see him win the Preakness. Everyone in the family was also there at Belmont Park to see him try to win the Triple Crown, falling a heartbreaking second in the race. Still, everyone got to meet the Lewises, Baffert, and jockey Gary Stevens. They enjoyed the entire experience, and that they played a small part of the history being made before their eyes.

My sister, Jennifer, and I attended Silver Charm's induction into the Racing Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., in 2007. Unfortunately, both my father and mother had passed prior to the event and were not able to see the celebration of one of racing's greats.

While doing some research for this piece, I contacted my dad's close friend and trusted horseman Bruce Gibbs of Greenfield Farms in Lexington, Ky. He recalled that the reason why Silver Charm was listed solely

The start of something big

On Aug. 7, 1982, in the middle of a dark and stormy Saratoga afternoon with trees down and the track seemingly deeper than the infield pond, I placed the first \$50 wager of my life on a beautiful gray horse in the Whitney Stakes, Silver Buck. Owned by C.V. Whitney and trained by Elliott Burch, it seemed only right that, even at odds-on, he would win. He did.

A few years later, in March of 1986, the filly Bonnie's Poker won three races in 10 days for Oscar Barrera. Eighteen years later, after a contentious legal battle, Bonnie was retired to Old Friends by her owner, Kris Jakeman. Bonnie was tough as nails and very smart. We nicknamed her Greta Garbo, because, at first, she liked to be left alone.

Neither Silver Buck's Whitney nor Bonnie's Poker's trio of claiming wins would be the highlight of their careers. That would come through their son Silver Charm, who won the Kentucky Derby on his way to a Racing Hall of Fame career. – Michael Blowen

as being bred by my mother was because at the time my mom was trying to get my dad to sign the paperwork necessary to register the colt, she got tired of nagging him, and she filed the paperwork with herself as the sole breeder of Silver Charm.

I have visited Old Friends and seen the great work that Michael Blowen does for all of the equine athletes in his care. God bless him and all the horses at Old Friends.

Steely gray

He introduced a Hall-of-Fame trainer to the world stage

The first time I saw Silver Charm was on a video when he was breezing for the 1996 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April Ocala 2-year-olds in training sale. I liked what I saw. He was a good mover, and he had one of the fastest works for the sale. I wanted to bid on him, but I was on a plane from Los Angeles to Kentucky to see Cavonnier work for the 1996 Derby. When I landed, I found out Silver Charm was a \$100,000 RNA. In other words, the owner had bought him back because he hadn't reached the reserve (Reserve Not Attained). We bought him privately the next day for \$80,000. He shipped to Churchill Downs the following week.

When I saw him in person, he was kind of narrow and I saw that he toed out (splay-footed) in both front feet, but he had a presence about him that I can't really explain. He would stand in front of his stall and wouldn't defer to anyone. He was tough, confident, and had a great mind. Nothing could rattle him. The first time I trained him on the track, he acted like he had done it his whole life. By that summer, he had filled out and his legs had straightened up. Silver Charm was a throwback, tough as nails and noble. Like the old-timers would say, he never turned a hair.

Fast forward to the 1997 Kentucky Derby (G1), and as I watched Silver Charm take the lead from Free House at the eighth pole, I was thinking of the year before with Cavonnier, and how he had the lead and got caught in the last stride at the wire. This time, Captain Bodgit loomed up outside Silver Charm like he was going to run by him, but as soon as Silver Charm eyeballed him, he dug in and was relentless. I knew in my heart he was not going to be denied.

That evening, after the press and well-wishers were gone, I stood in front Silver Charm's stall staring at him for a long time. I was in awe of him, so proud of what he had done and still in disbelief, really. I thanked him. He stood there with his ears up. He was proud. I could tell he knew

he was the big man on campus. He was an alpha horse for sure.

Silver Charm was always a good doer. He ate well and wouldn't waste any energy. He was kind of a lazy horse in the mornings. He held his weight well through all three Triple Crown races. His demeanor never changed. He was always calm, cool, and confident. The crowds never bothered him. He loved the cameras and photographers and all of the attention he would get from fans, but he didn't want a lot of physical affection.

He's the grittiest horse I've ever trained, and he had a reputation for it. Other jockeys knew if their horse eyeballed Silver Charm, they were probably going to lose. The year we took him to the Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1), he made the lead at the top of the long stretch. They were four horses abreast and it looked like they were all going to pass him. One by

Bob Baffert was always a great bet

As a handicapper, I knew of Bob long before I heard of Silver Charm. I bet Bob's Cavonnier in the 1996 Kentucky Derby when he lost that heartbreaking photo to Grindstone. However, it wasn't until the next year when he was walking Silver Charm over for the Derby and I was trying to lead one of trainer Carlos Figueroa's claimers over from Barn 7 at Suffolk Downs so I could watch the Derby on one of the dusty TVs, that he really made an impression.

I always liked to use bettor's biases against them and there was definitely a deep-seated prejudice against California shippers. I bet Silver Charm and watched him fight off Captain Bodgit and Free House, while waiting for Carlos's horse to finish seventh in an eight-horse field in the next race. While Bob celebrated, I was on my way back to Barn 7. Little did I dream that, nearly a quarter century later, Bob would be a great friend and Silver Charm would be grazing outside my back window. – Michael Blowen

one, he turned away every horse who made a run at him. He was truly in his element. He loved a good battle, and I loved watching him. He never won by more than was necessary because that's the way he wanted to do it, and Silver Charm always did things his own way.

When Silver Charm was sent to Japan in 2005, I was sad, and thought I would probably never see him again. After so many years, the first time I saw him at Old Friends was very emotional. I felt like I had reconnected with a long, lost friend.

Being with him brought back all the wonderful memories with his owners, Bob and Beverly Lewis, my family, and our friends. Even though it had been years, I thought of him or talked about him every day.

Silver Charm took us all on a magic carpet ride. He gave me my first great thrill in horse racing. I've had some great horses since Silver Charm, but he is my first love, and he will always have a special place in my heart. He taught me that pedigree isn't everything. What he lacked in pedigree, he made up for in heart, which is something that can't be measured.

Knowing he's not that far away now and living his best life at Old Friends makes me happy. Silver Charm still thinks he's the King and he's still treated like the King. As he should be.

An inspiration for life introduces an international flair

As a little girl watching the pre-Kentucky Derby coverage in 1997 on TV, Silver Charm captured my imagination. His eccentric trainer and sweet, elderly owners were enjoyable, to be sure, but his determination and desire to win really caught my attention. For many people, those aspects of Silver Charm were enough to make them racing fans for life or inspire them to work in racing. Simply put, that is what Silver Charm did for me: he took me on one heck of a detour to do it.

As a young girl, I had a separate fascination with Japan and was majoring in Japanese in college. In 2004, I went to Japan for a yearlong study trip abroad, which only fomented my love for the language, culture, and country. Then one morning, I got a Blood-Horse Breaking News alert that Silver Charm had been sold to Japan. I hadn't seen racing in Japan before, so I immediately started looking it up and headed to Tokyo Racecourse. I was blown away by the size and scope of the track. I'd never seen anything like it in the U.S., where most tracks were small. This was new and *huge*, with thousands of people there. I went back several times before I had to go back to the U.S. to graduate.

When more traditional forms of work with the Japanese language didn't inspire me, I decided to move to Japan to check out Japanese horse racing in earnest. I arrived just as Silver Charm's first crop turned 2 and were beginning to debut. I made yearly trips to Hokkaido to visit him as I slowly but steadily worked my way into the Thoroughbred industry. Though many people told me that I wouldn't ever be able to find employment in the Japanese racing industry, I kept my head down and fought on, just like my favorite gray.

I started as an unlikely photographer (just taking pictures of Silver Charm's offspring) and a freelance journalist, but that got me noticed by a breeding farm that hired me as their communications manager. I remember visiting Silver Charm one spring when a mare from the farm I worked at was going to be covered by Empire Maker. I made the trip with her and triumphantly told the stallion staff of my new job at the farm.

They were surprised that the crazy Silver Charm fan who had spent many hours just watching and talking to him had finally managed to go legit.

This farm job coincided with the time that Silver Charm made his trip back to the United States and to Old Friends. The people who worked with the stallion arranged a special visit to see him for my birthday, where I even got to sit on Silver Charm's back (much to his dismay). It was a glorious last visit with my favorite horse.

I was worried I wouldn't be able to see him again, but two years later, I started my own company in Japan and began working for the Breeders' Cup and Keeneland, which meant I would be able to see Silver Charm once or twice a year. I have expanded my efforts since and now also work for Churchill Downs, the New York Racing Association, every other major racing event/track in the U.S. in some fashion, and even the Dubai World Cup.

I was emotionally overwhelmed the first time I had a runner in the Kentucky Derby, helping represent the connections of Master Fencer, the

Writing a new chapter

For decades, I adored Silver Charm from afar – during his stunning Hall of Fame racing career and throughout his life at Three Chimneys and for 11 years breeding in Japan. I even named Little Silver Charm after him back in 1999. (His original name was Brownie.)

In the spring of 2021, seven years after Silver Charm's return from Japan, a new chapter in Japanese aftercare was born. With support from Maniyah City, the Japanese Racing Association (JRA), and other stakeholders, Old Friends Japan opened its doors in the Okayama Prefecture. We are proud that Old Friends Japan is modeled on the standards and ideals set by our farm in Georgetown. – Michael Blowen

first Japanese-bred to ever run in the Derby. I had come full circle. It was a moment I wanted to share with my late father, but instead, I traveled to Old Friends and shared it with Silver Charm. Master Fencer didn't win (he finished sixth), but he did Silver Charm proud by trying hard.

Silver Charm made me a lifelong racing fan, but his stint as a stallion in Japan led me to work in horse racing. He opened up a whole new world for me.

Many fans are sad when their favorite horse gets sold overseas, but I took it as an opportunity to explore and create an entire industry niche. I've helped 13 Japanese horses come to the Breeders' Cup, two horses to the Kentucky Derby, and many more travel over for other races in the U.S. and the Middle East, all thanks to the passion that Silver Charm instilled in me that first Saturday in May in 1997. He didn't produce any great sons or daughters at stud in Japan, but I hope that in some small way, in my service to Japanese horses around the globe, I have added a little substance to his tenure in Japan.

I cannot imagine what my life would be like had we not crossed paths the way we did. Silver Charm, without a doubt, changed the course of my life.

Dream weaver

Fast-forward dreaming of an aftercare superstar

Dreams are funny. Most of the time, they don't come true. I dreamed of being a movie director. I dreamed of becoming a famous novelist. I dreamed of playing third base for the Boston Red Sox. I dreamed. I dreamed. I dreamed. But, when I cut back on my dreams, things started to happen. And, beyond my wildest dreams, Diane White said she loved me, and Silver Charm ended up in my backyard.

You don't have to be a genius or a Hall of Fame trainer or a horse whisperer to appreciate the charisma of Silver Charm. It's obvious to every visitor who has the opportunity to feed him a carrot at Old Friends. He is who he is.

You can list the statistics that got him into the Racing Hall of Fame. You can see it in his eyes when he won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes, and in his dogged demeanor when he lost the Belmont Stakes to Touch Gold during his star-making Triple Crown run in 1997.

Born of a talented father, Silver Buck, and a really tough dam, Bonnie's Poker (who preceded him to Old Friends), Silver Charm certainly didn't depend on his pedigree to put him over the top. And, while his Hall of Fame trainer, Bob Baffert, deserves a lot of credit for pointing him in the right direction, that wasn't it either. No, he was an alchemist's dream – an amalgam of strength, spirit, and intelligence that resists formula and turned Silver Charm into gold.

When Sandy Hatfield, the brilliant stallion manager at Three Chimneys, called me in late October of 2014 and asked if I wanted an old, gray stallion at Old Friends, I knew who she was talking about. On Dec. 1, 2014, he arrived. And, in spite of the fact that my expectations were already over the moon, he exceeded them. He strolled off the trailer as if he owned the place.

Since then, he's changed the lives of so many people and so many of his colleagues. He welcomed two of his biggest rivals, Touch Gold and Swain, to Old Friends. No jealousy. Just the compatibility that comes with age and acceptance. Like Joe Frazier and Muhammed Ali and Larry and Magic. No competition.

He taught us what retirement was about. He taught us that, after a lifetime of horses taking orders from humans, the shoe was now on the other foot. And he did it through patience, kindness, and understanding.

Now, I look out the back window every day and there he is, in all his indescribable glory, and think about what he's taught me. I've shed a lot of unattractive qualities, jealousy and envy among them, because of him. Why should I resent someone else's success when I'm the only one on the planet Earth that has Silver Charm in his backyard? In one way, it is a dream come true. But, in fact, I never dreamed this big. And I owe it all to Diane and Silver Charm and the thousands of visitors who have come to Old Friends and understand exactly what I mean.

Finally, in spite of how many words are written or pictures taken, or kisses provided, Silver Charm remains a man of mystery. And that's what makes him so very special. That we, as humans, will never know the precise answers to explain his greatness through the past 29 years. We may not know what becomes this legend most, but, when you see it

Medina Spirit memorial

When local arborist Dave Leonard declared the nearly century-old sycamore in the front yard of the Old Friends Visitor's Center a lost cause, office manager Sylvia Stiller just couldn't accept the untimely death of such a beautiful old tree.

"We all loved that tree," said Stiller "It was an iconic tree."

Looking for options, Leonard suggested contacting local artist Kiptoo Tarus, who was doing remarkable large-scale things with wood all over Lexington and surrounding areas, but initially the cost to Old Friends seemed prohibitive.

"I said, 'Sylvia, it's a great idea, but we can't spend money that's meant for the horses on a dead tree,' " Old Friends Founder Michael Blowen said. But it was hard to keep even this dead tree down. Before long, a new plan and a benevolent sponsor emerged.

In the spring of 2022, Old Friends was chosen as the final resting place for the multiple graded stakes winner Medina Spirit, who had won the 2021 Kentucky Derby but was subsequently disqualified. Unexpectedly, the colt died suddenly in December of 2021 and a few months later his ashes were buried in the Nikki Bacharach Memorial Cemetery at Old Friends. A proverbial light bulb went off. Why not turn the tree into a memorial? Stiller and Blowen approached Medina Spirit's trainer, Bob Baffert, and his wife Jill, and they were excited to sponsor the ambitious project.

With funding in place, Tarus took on the project, eager to breathe new life from the dying trunk.

"It was really humbling to be able to know that Medina Spirit was a great horse, and that I was asked to capture his essence here in the heart of Thoroughbred country," he

said.

Erecting scaffolding and using common chain saws, Tarus began work in August 2022 – nearly causing traffic accidents as carloads of passersby began stopping all along Paynes Depot Road as the elegant equine shape began to emerge. The amazing sculpture was complete by September.

"Regardless of what was adjudicated, he was an amazing animal who had an amazing career that was cut short," Blowen said, "and we are so excited to be able to showcase the magnificent work of Kiptoo and to honor a great Thoroughbred champion.

"It's like our own Mount Rushmore!"

The sculpture

• Medina Spirit's ashes were buried in the Old Friends Nikki Bacharach Memorial Cemetery. His grave is open to visitors at the farm.

• The Baffert family sponsored the sculpture.

• Carving began on August 17, 2022, and the completed work was unveiled on September 15, 2022.

• The sculpture stands 15 feet high.

• It was carved from the trunk of an old sycamore tree that could not be saved.

• Sycamore trees, the largest deciduous tree in the eastern United States, can grow 75 to 100 feet tall with a similar spread, and even taller under ideal conditions. The trunk may be as much as 10 feet in diameter.

• It was carved exclusively with chain saws, grinders, sanders, and chisels.

• An undercoat of red barn paint was applied before its topcoat of black fence paint.

The artist

Born in Nairobi, Kenya, artist Kiptoo Tarus earned a B.A. at the University of Nairobi for Design, majoring in illustration. In 2011, he established the graphic design company King Concepts before being accepted to the University of Kentucky, where he studied sculpture. In 2015, Kiptoo's large-scale hand sculptures were exhibited on Short Street in Lexington as part of the Breeders' Cup beautification of downtown, and Tarus quickly became a rising star in the regional visual-arts scene.

He soon developed an interest in equine art and his large-scale wood sculptures - often carved with a chainsaw - juxtapose classical equine art with the tribal and pastoral influences of his homeland. Some of the artist's most significant work in the Lexington area include the horse sculpture seen on the Henry Clay estate, Sculpture 2020 Blues on Southland Drive, the Melting Pot Sculpture in Woodland Park, and the memorial for Breonna Taylor at Lexington's Carnegie Center for Literacy.

One of the highlights of our Annual Homecoming event is seeing artist Robert Clark hard at work doing what he does best – bringing canvas to life. With a worldwide client list, Clark has painted more than 200 graded stakes winners, and helped raise over \$500,000 for equine charities. It is our privilege to witness his talent first-hand, and to be able to share it with you.

Let me introduce myself. I'm Robert Clark and I paint horses.

My life has evolved around art for almost 50 years, during which time I've received art scholarships, a degree in fine art, won art shows, served on the board of directors for a museum, taught art, hosted a television show on the arts, produced two books featuring my artwork, and owned two art galleries.

Two things are most important in the making of my art: 1) the quality, and 2) the subject. If you remember one thing about me, remember this... I paint horses.

Old Friends is one of the organizations at the top of my equine charity list.

For the Old Friends Annual Homecoming event live-auction, held the day after the Kentucky Derby, I paint as much as I can of the Derby winner from the previous day. The first time I did this was in 2006, when Barbaro won the Derby. That day planted the seed of what's become a tradition of painting for Old Friends after the Kentucky Derby.

Doing these one-day paintings on a blank canvas and trying to get as much done as possible can be a hectic challenge, but there is also a thrill to drawing and painting in front of a live audience. Just knowing the clock is ticking toward the auction is extremely exciting.

These live, one-day paintings are not anything like my commis-

sioned paintings in terms of their detail and their overall finished quality, but they do capture the essence of both the horse and that historic moment.

The racing fans and supporters of Old Friends have been great with their bidding to bring in more money for a charitable cause. I see the sale at the auction as a partnership between me, the artist, and the fan that writes the check for the work.

Together, we've put a load of hay in the barn or maybe help fence a new paddock.

I am honored to be asked to keep coming back year after year.

Lava Man was worth the wait

Lava Man was pledged to us by his connections – and they were true to their word. It just took 14 years to get him to us in Kentucky.

On November 8, 2022, Lava Man – Hall of Famer, multiple graded stakes winner, an earner of \$5,268,706, and hailed as one of the greatest claims of all time – stepped off the trailer at Old Friends as our newest retiree, and his arrival has left us all a little verklempt.

A chocolate bay son of Slew City Slew, Lava Man boasted a career as enormous as the 17 or so hands he stands. Owned by STD Stable (Dave and Steve Kenly) and Jason Wood, and trained by Doug O'Neill, the gelding ended his career as one of the leading California-bred earners of all time, his seven Grade 1 wins tops among California-breds.

Sporting a name that foreshadowed his volcanic success, Lava Man rose from the claiming ranks into a stakes winner in little more than a year. In a career that spanned seven seasons, he won 17 of 47 starts. His striking string of victories includes three consecutive wins in the Hollywood Gold Cup (G1), from 2005-2007 (equaling the presumed unmatchable feat set by Native Diver in the 1960s), the 2006 Pacific Classic Stakes (G1), the 2006 and 2007 Santa Anita Handicaps (G1), and the Charles Whittingham Memorial H. (G1) among his 13 stakes triumphs.

Lava Man was bred by Lonnie Arterburn, Eve Kuhlmann, and Kim Kuhlmann, and was foaled at Poplar Meadows Ranch near Sanger, Calif. Born in March, he was named for the annual Lava Man Triathlon that is held that same month in Hawaii.

Originally trained by former jockey Arterburn, Lava Man began his racing career as a 2-year-old in a \$12,500 maiden-claiming race at the San Joaquin County Fair in Stockton in 2003. A switch from dirt to grass initiated a move up the ranks, and in August of 2004 the then-3-year-old Lava Man was claimed for \$50,000 by O'Neill at the urging of his owners.

O'Neill immediately put Lava Man into a stakes races in his first start for his new owners, the Derby Trial Stakes at Pomona, and the gelding gave a preview of what was to come when he won that race by 6 1/4 lengths. He never looked back, running in stakes races all but one time in his remaining 33 career starts.

His first major stakes win came at age 4, in the 2005 Californian Stakes (G2), and the transformation from claimer to king of the California circuit inspired some of the press to dub him a modern-day Seabiscuit.

Lava Man's name is now intrinsically linked with numerous racing "firsts." He is the first horse to win the signature race at each of Southern California's major racetracks in one year. He is the first horse to equal Native Diver's record of winning three consecutive Hollywood Gold Cups. He is the first horse in a generation to win a Grade 1 race on dirt and turf in the same year, and he is the only horse ever to win a North American Grade 1 race on dirt, turf, and a synthetic surface.

In 2009, at the age of 8, Lava Man was retired from racing, but he showed his connections that he really wasn't ready for kicking back and chilling out just yet.

"He had to be retired from racing due to some physical issues, but he just didn't appear happy to be retired," O'Neill said, "so we decided to bring him back as a lead pony. And he turned out to be the best pony

any barn could ever ask for."

O'Neill has credited assistant trainer Sabas Rivera for expertly grooming the gelding for that second career – a job the horse eventually took to so famously that he earned the moniker "Coach" for his gentle way of teaching young horses on the track.

In 2022, with Lava Man 21 years old, his connections felt it was finally time to retire him from racetrack life.

"He still has a lot of life, is mentally strong as ever," O'Neill said. "We just thought it was time to let him enjoy his last few years. We thought it would be something if he could take Hot Rod Charlie to the post for the Breeders' Cup Classic and 'drop the mic,' if you will."

"The attention and notice a superstar like Lava Man brings to our organization is multi-fold," says Old Friends founder and president Blowen. "It's the champions that attract tourism and donations, and in turn that helps us care for the many geldings and mares we have that are not as well known. We're really looking forward to meeting Lava Man's many admirers here at the farm.

"From the beginning, Steve [owner Kenly] and everyone associated with this amazing athlete have done what's best for Lava Man," Blowen added. "I can't tell you how thrilled everyone is at Old Friends to know that they've entrusted the care of this unbelievably talented horse to us."

Historic ground honors legacies

They are scattered around the Bluegrass region. Monuments to the past. Renowned farms with names like Calumet, Claiborne, and Spendthrift are home to graveyards that honor the history of a sport filled with legendary names of racing's heroes. While the two cemeteries at Old Friends are in their infancy by comparison, they offer fans a unique opportunity for remembrance.

At Old Friends, at the top of the hill, behind Michael Blowen's home, lies the resting place for the majority of the Old Friends past residents, with champions such as Black Tie Affair, Precisionist, and Gulch honored there.

But it is the newer cemetery, the Nikki Bacharach Memorial Garden, next to the farm's welcome center, that is the final resting place for former Old Friends residents like War Emblem and Charismatic. It provides a place to remember old and new greats, such as Noor and Medina Spirit, both relocated to the farm after their deaths.

"Our Memorial Garden is named after Nikki Bacharach. the daughter of actress Angie Dickinson and the late, great composer Burt Bacharach." Old Friends founder Michael Blowen said. "Burt retired his stallion, Afternoon Deelites [who died in Feb. 2023, just days after Burt Bacharach passed], to us when we were just getting started. Angie has been a friend to me and Old Friends ever since the beginning. Nikki loved flowers and we have honored her with this garden named in her memory. The Nikki Bacharach Memorial Garden at Old Friends is a reminder of how much Nikki was loved and how much we love the horses who have graced our farm."

The garden is currently the resting place for 14 horses, including some whose former graves were in danger of being lost. That was the case with Racing Hall of Famer Noor, whose original

gravesite at Loma Rica Ranch in California was going to be developed after the land sold a decade ago. In a move spearheaded by devoted fan Charlotte Farmer, Noor's remains in an unmarked grave had to be located by a forensic anthropologist using ground penetrating radar and, when found, exhumed. A fundraiser was organized to pay \$5,000 to transfer the horse's remains to Old Friends in Georgetown, Ky.

"The more I got to know about Noor, the more I got sucked into his world," Farmer told the Blood-Horse's Steve Haskin in 2011. "It was just amazing to learn about this horse. I would go out to the grave site, but all I knew was that somewhere in the general vicinity was supposed to be Noor."

After a four-year project to relocate Noor, Farmer drove the horse's remains from California to Old Friends. In 2011, he was the first horse to be buried in the cemetery. Created for champions and Hall of Famers, he has been joined by other big names in the sport over the past decade.

The other horses in the cemetery include four Eclipse winners, a Golden Slipper winner in Australia, a Kentucky Derby winner, two Breeders' Cup winners, a European champion, and a two-time Ohio Horse of the Year. The gravestone of Rockingham Park legend Springsteel and graves of multiple accomplished Shadwell Stud stallions also reside in the cemetery.

The Nikki Bacharach Memorial Garden is unique in that not all the horses were at Old Friends at the time of their death. While 10 of the horses were Old Friends residents, the other four relocated to the farm after their death. The cemetery is one of the few in Kentucky and around the world where not every horse was associated with the farm where they're buried – a distinction it shares with the Kentucky Horse Park just down the road from Old Friends.

Noor, the first horse buried in the cemetery, was joined nearly

five years later by fellow Hall of Famer Skip Away in 2015.

Two-time Ohio Horse of the Year Glacial Princess had her remains moved to Old Friends in a case similar to Noor. The mare had been euthanized and buried at Beulah Park in 1987, but when the track closed in 2014 and redevelopment talks started, racehorse owner Ryan Brady approached Blowen about giving her a place in the cemetery. The mare joined Skip Away and Noor in January of 2017, with her former owner, Dr. John Graver, donating her gravestone.

"She was a champion, the pride of Ohio, and we are proud to be able to offer her fans a place to come and honor her," Blowen told Paulick Report. "It's important to keep such history alive. Glacial Princess brought so much to the sport of racing and she should be remembered as one of the greats."

Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit joined this trio in 2022, when he was buried next to fellow Derby winner War Emblem in April 2022. He's the third Kentucky Derby winner to be buried there, with Charismatic taking up residence on War Emblem's other side.

Charismatic and War Emblem were both residents of the farm before their deaths, being two of the seven U.S. Triple Crown race winners to live at Old Friends at some point in their lives. Included in that group is the current oldest Kentucky Derby winner in Silver Charm.

The cemetery also has international flavor, with Australian champion Bint Marscay, winner of the Golden Slipper (Aus-G1), buried next to U.S. champion Hidden Lake.

A broodmare in both Australia and the U.S., Bint Marscay came to Old Friends in 2013 before passing away in 2019 at 29. While she didn't have any foals during her time in the U.S., Bint Marscay had an impact on the Kentucky Derby when her Australian Group 1-winning daughter Bollinger produced multiple graded stakes winner and 2009 Kentucky Derby starter Friesan Fire.

The cemetery is free and open to the public and is a popular destination for those who want to pay their respects to the greats buried there.

A unique feature of the Memorial Garden is the ability of people to memorialize their favorite Old Friends retiree, beloved horse or pet, loved one, or special occasion with a

personalized memorial brick. Over 300 pavers already have been placed, creating a walkway filled with tributes and love.

Daughters of Old Friends

Being the child of a celebrity doesn't guarantee an easy ride in life. The same holds true for the progeny of champion Thoroughbreds. Those that do not possess the talent of their racing parent can easily end up in a perilous situation – just as all but one of the daughters we have here at Old Friends did.

Luckily, these ladies made their way here, and we were more than happy to make them part of our family. Here are the daughters of Old Friends stallions.

Private Charm, a daughter of Silver Charm

Being the offspring of a Kentucky Derby winner puts a lot of pressure on a kid. But while Private Charm is a dead ringer for Old Friends's dual classic winner Silver Charm, she is more like her dam, the New York-raced Said Privately, who made 38 starts in four seasons on the track, winning three times and earning close to \$100,000. (Like her daughter, Said Privately also was sired by a great, the multiple graded stakes winner Private Account.)

Private Charm made all of her starts at Evangeline Downs in Louisiana. She raced seven times, winning twice, for trainer Brandon Marks, and then became a broodmare, producing four foals, three starters, and two winners before falling off the radar. She was found in a kill pen in 2021 and rescued, making her way to Old Friends thanks to some benefactors.

Fittingly, she is now in a paddock with Groundshaker, who just happens to be a relative of another horse you may have heard of: She is a great, great-granddaughter of Secretariat.


Albany House, a daughter of Gulch

A daughter of Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) winner and champion Gulch and the stakes-placed mare Summit Park (by the great A.P. Indy), Albany House counts Bill Mott and D. Wayne Lukas among her trainers. She raced only seven times for owner-breeder Donald R. Dizney but never won. A couple of third-place finishes in maiden races at Gulfstream Park were her most successful outings. What she lacked in talent, she made up for with charm and personality.

In the breeding shed, she produced six foals, four starters, and two winners. Her 2015 foal, Bella Dudette, by First Dude, earned \$161,130 while racing 55 times over six seasons. Her connections retired Albany House to Old Friends in 2018.

Moriah, a daughter of Kayrawan

The Oklahoma-bred Moriah is a 21-year-old daughter of Tom Fool Handicap (G2) winner Kayrawan, himself a son of the great Mr. Prospector. But like the others here, Moriah did not live up to her genetic expectations on the track or as a broodmare. In 30 starts – mostly in claiming races while racing almost exclusively in her native Oklahoma – she won four times and banked \$62,018.

After her racing career ended, she was bred several times, producing just one named foal who never raced, and eventually wound up at the Stroud Oklahoma Kill Pen, where she was purchased to get her out of that situation. She came to the attention of one of Old Friends's most loyal supporters, Shirley Ford, who runs a sanctuary in Texas, and while Ford did not have space for her, she reached out to us, and we gladly took her in.



Wicked Sorceress

Wicked Sorceress, a daughter of Charismatic

Wicked Sorceress, a claiming-ranks stalwart, was sired by 1999 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Charismatic. She finished her racing career running for a \$5,000 tag at Presque Isle Downs in Pennsylvania in 2009 after making 40 starts, winning four times and earning almost \$80,000.

As a broodmare, she produced just one named foal, in 2013, a horse who failed to win, and she eventually ended up where no horse should – in a feed lot sale. Thanks to New York-based trainer Richard Schosberg, who is president of Take the Lead Thoroughbred Retirement Program, she averted the worst fate, and found her way to Old Friends, where she now has a friend in paddock mate Miss DuBois.

Another year has passed and in that time we lost 17 of our favorite denizens, among them champions, millionaires, career claimers, a famous nonwinner, and an old "girlFriend." All were cherished. Among those, Alphabet Soup, Affirmed Success, and Popcorn Deelites – who passed early in 2022 – were covered in last year's magazine.

Albertus Maximus

B., h., 2004, by Albert the Great—Chasethewildwind, by Forty Niner

At 18, Albertus Maximus was the youngest of six stallions brought here in 2022 from the late Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm. After capturing the 2008 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile for his breeders, Marianne and Brandon Chase, he was acquired by the Sheikh, for whom he won the 2009 Donn Handicap (G1). An injury suffered in the 2010 Dubai World Cup (UAE-G1) sent him to stud at Shadwell. Albertus Maximus was special to us, not only as an individual, but because he was a son of our late pensioner Albert the Great.

Cool N Collective

B., g., 1997, by Ruhlmann—Panther Run, by Cox's Ridge

Before Repole Stable rose to fame with champions Uncle Mo and Vino Rosso, there was Cool N Collective, a gutsy end-of-career claimer. The son of early Old Friends retiree Ruhlmann won the 2000 Elgin Stakes at Woodbine at age 3 before descending in class. On the way down, then-racing newcomer Mike Repole claimed him – again and again. Four times Repole haltered the gelding who just kept on winning. For a neophyte owner, it was a thrill. "He was my first superstar, really special," Repole later recalled. So special that Repole eventually retired him to Old Friends at Cabin Creek, where he greeted fans for 12 years before we lost him to laminitis.

Dumaani

Gr. or ro., h., 1991, by Danzig—Desirable (Ire), by Lord Gayle

At 31, Dumaani was the oldest of our Shadwell stallions. We enjoyed the company of this nearly white son of Danzig a brief time, from March 2022 until July, when age took its final toll. Bred and raced by the late Dubai finance minister Sheikh Hamdan, Dumaani boasted a pedigree befitting a champion, and this sizzling grass miler deported himself as such on racetracks around the globe. He later sired several stakes winners before retiring from breeding in 2011.

Ferocious Won

Ch., g., 2003, by Lite the Fuse—Shawklit Ruse, by Air Forbes Won

Old Friends lost an iron horse in Ferocious Won due to an untreatable hock infection. The New York-bred raced through age 10, his biggest victory coming in the 2006 New York Derby. With earnings of \$503,627, the gelding shipped to Old Friends in 2013. Despite his name, he was a kindly soul and is missed by his buddies in Paddock 74.

Kudos

B., g., 1997, by Kris S.—Souq, by Damascus Kudos was our first loss of 2023. The Grade 1 winner had been one of our longest residents, having spent 17 years here before passing unexpectedly in his paddock on Jan. 4. At the turn of the millennium, Kudos competed with the best, winning four stakes and finishing second or third in seven others while banking \$1.2 million. But life was not always easy – twice he battled and beat back equine protozoal myeloencephalitis, a dangerous neurological disease. In 2006, Kudos was donated by owner-breeders and longtime Old Friends patrons Jerry and Ann Moss.

Miss Saigon

B., m., 1993, by Literati—Grab Your Socks, by Cox's Ridge

We lost an old girlFriend in Miss Saigon, who passed at age 30 in January 2023. Both of her long-ago victories came in turf allowance company at Rockingham Park. She subsequently produced seven foals, with four starters and two winners, before arriving here in 2017.

Mustanfar

Ch., h., 2001, by Unbridled—Manwah, by Lyphard

At 21, Mustanfar was a relative youngster among the pensioners who came here from Shadwell, but sadly, he was the first of four we lost. Like Dumaani, the chestnut with the striking blazed face became a graded stakes winner for Sheikh Hamdan, winning at up to 12 furlongs on dirt, grass, and synthetic. As a stallion, he had fertility problems, and he left behind only a handful of foals. After only three months in residence, Mustanfar left us far too soon.

River Squall

Dk. b. or br., h.,1994, by Summer Squall— Bangkok, by Riverman

River Squall was a quality racehorse, with multiple graded victories to his credit. Later, as a Texas-based stallion, he sired about 100 foals in 15 crops before arriving at Old Friends in 2018. He spent much of his time here in a stall (due to a condition that made him unable to sweat efficiently), playing tongue-pulling games with anyone willing to participate. Sadly, we lost this character on his 28th birthday, April 15, 2022.

Slamming

Dk. b. or br., g., 1993, by Claim—A Smash, by Star de Naskra

Slamming was a bread-and-butter guy. The gelded grandson of Mr. Prospector raced long and hard – eight seasons and 80 starts – winning 20 races and \$206,021. In the 1990s, he had been a top prospect in the Southwest, where he won nine stakes until slowed by age. He was eventually haltered for \$4,000 by trainer Lorita Lindemann, for whom he still found the winner's circle at age 9. Lindemann



retired him to Old Friends in 2013 to live the good life he so richly deserved.

Swain (Ire)

B. h., 1992, by Nashwan—Love Smitten, by Key to the Mint

We wish we'd had him longer, but it could never be – when Swain arrived here with the other Shadwell stallions, he was already 30. In an age of short fuses, Swain relished a distance, winning at up to 14 furlongs. The Irish-bred twice captured Ascot's prestigious King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond Stakes (Eng-G1) and in 1998 ranked as best older male in all of Europe. Unfortunately, he couldn't duplicate his success at stud. Swain died in July of old age.

Thornfield

Ch., g., 1994, by Sky Classic—Alexandrina, by Conquistador Cielo

After 12 years in residence, Canadian champion Thornfield left us in January 2023 after suffering a paddock injury. The 29-yearold millionaire had been Canada's 1999 Horse of the Year and top grass horse. Upon retirement, he was used as a hunter-jumper for a time before being donated to Old Friends.

Victor Cooley

Dk. b. or br. g., 1993, by Cool Victor—Willow Flight, by Lend Lease

This gelding of modest pedigree burst onto the scene in 1996 like a meteorite, topping a brilliant season by winning the classic Queen's Plate Stakes and earning a Canadian title. Retired home to Ontario-based Windways Farm at age 7, he proved a handful at times even then, but the millionaire Grade 1 winner had earned the right to be whoever he wanted to be. When Windways closed in 2014, he joined at Old Friends, and happily mellowed over time. We lost this quirky fellow in June 2022 to a neurological issue.

You and I

Dk. b., h., 1991, by Kris S.—La Chaposa, by Ups

You and I wasn't our friendliest resident. He didn't dash to the fence for carrots or put on a show for visitors. The nearly ink-black stallion had too much dignity to beg or perform, but nevertheless left an impression on all who saw him. Winner of the Metropolitan Handicap (G1) and other important stakes, he ranked among the best of his time before retiring to Airdrie Stud in 1996. He became a well-traveled stallion, standing at times in Kentucky, Peru, California, and Washington. If not a resounding success, he did sire some good ones, most notably five-time Grade 1 winner You. You and I pensioned here in 2011, and we enjoyed his regal company for more than a decade before his passing at 31.

Zippy Chippy

B. g., 1991, by Compliance—Listen Lady, by Buckfinder

Every loss hits hard, but in 2022 one of the hardest was that of Zippy Chippy, the "loveable" loser who famously failed to win in 100 starts. He was racing's most celebrated maiden, with his own Wikipedia page. Zippy was consistent in his disdain for everything. He didn't care for any distance or surface. from 41/2 to nine furlongs, dirt or turf, fast or slow tracks. He expended his energy in other ways as a non-people pleaser who kicked and carried on and got banned after repeatedly refusing to break from the gate. During down time, Zippy ate popcorn, drank beer, and bit people. In 2000, People magazine named him one of its most interesting personalities. Pensioned in 2010 to Old Friends at Cabin Creek, he died there in April 2022.

In the spring of 2004, a plain bay colt with not a white hair on him became the horse America loved to hate. Barely 15 hands and 900 pounds at the time, the late Marylou Whitney's homebred Birdstone shocked a roaring crowd into silence when, at 36-1, he ran down heavily favored Smarty Jones in the Belmont Stakes to deny him a Triple Crown sweep. Moments later in the winner's circle, trainer Nick Zito and jockey Edgar Prado found themselves in an unusual place – apologizing for their victory and ending Smarty's bid for destiny.

Despite that moment of infamy, Birdstone was a good one in every sense. The son of 1996 Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone and future Broodmare of the Year Dear Birdie snagged the 2003 Champagne Stakes (G1) and 2004 Travers (G1) in additional to that memorable Belmont, and banked \$1,575,600 before a bone chip stopped him after his ninth start.

At Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Ky., Birdstone's initial \$10,000 fee looked like an absolute steal when his first crop reached the races and included 2009 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Mine That Bird, 2009 Eclipse Award 3-year-old male champion and Belmont Stakes winner Summer Bird, and three additional North American graded stakes winners.

Birdstone never replicated that gangbuster debut crop but became a useful sire whose offspring have since earned some \$30 million. The sweet-natured stallion was pensioned to Old Friends in August of 2020.

Like everyone else in America, I was desperately hoping that Smarty Jones would win the 2004 Belmont to win the Triple Crown. Additionally, Stewart Elliott, his jockey, came up, like I did, through the claiming ranks at Suffolk Downs. But it wasn't to be. A son of Grindstone came hurtling down the long Belmont stretch, passing Smarty and sucking every last bit of air from the Belmont grandstand. His owner, the eternally classy Marylou Whitney, was apologetic in the post-winner's circle interview. But she had nothing to be sorry about. Birdstone would go on to win the Travers, confirming his competitive greatness. After he was winding down his post-racing career, I started to make inquiries about possibly retiring him to Old Friends. I even had the audacity to drop a subtle hint to John Hendrickson and Mrs. Whitney the last time I saw them at an event at the Hall of Fame. Enter the Passarellos. Jon and Bev are longtime breeders with strong connections to Gainesway and Neil Howard. When I inquired about Birdstone's diminishing stallion career, Bev went to work, extolling, or should I say exaggerating, all of the virtues of retiring a stallion to Old Friends. Buoyed by her gritty enthusiasm, I sent a note to Mr. Hendrickson. Within a few months, Birdstone arrived at Old Friends. A few weeks after his arrival, we were contacted by a very nice woman from Cady Hill, the estate in Saratoga Springs. She explained how happy John Hendrickson was with his decision to send Birdstone to Old Friends. He couldn't be as happy as we are to have Birdstone. And, to make it even better. he's our vet's-Dr. Bryan Waldridgefavorite horse and he is supported by a very generous stipend. He may even help us get Smarty here for a rematch.

Game On Dude

Game On Dude had 34 starts over the course of five racing seasons and won nearly half of them, so there are plenty of memories to take away from his career, but for me, nothing was better than when Game On Dude won the Santa Anita Handicap in 2014 to become the first horse to win that storied race three times.

Game On Dude was clearly in the twilight of his career at that point. He was 7 and had lost three straight races, beginning with a crushing loss in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Classic that cost him titles as champion older horse and Horse of the Year, awards for which he was the front-runner entering that day.

Going back to the 2012 Californian, Game On Dude had been favored in 14 straight races and was odds-on in seven of those races. But having lost three straight, and with Mucho Macho Man and Will Take Charge – the one-two finishers from the previous fall's Breeders' Cup Classic – in the Big Cap, Game On Dude was the distant third choice at 7-2.

But the old boy reached back for one last hurrah. He used his wicked speed, the kind he could carry a distance, to run his rivals off their feet – six furlongs in 1:09.39, a mile in 1:32.57. And he kept on going. It might have been his finest race.

Lava Man

A lot can and has been said about Lava Man – a book could be written about his accomplishments in racing – so providing a summary of his career in a few words is difficult. But here's some things to know about Lava Man: He won more money after being claimed than any horse in racing history; he is the fourth-leading California-bred money earner of all time (behind California Chrome, Tiznow, and Best Pal); he won more Grade 1 races (seven) than any Cal-bred in history; he's one of only two horses to ever win all three premier Grade 1 races for older horses at the three major tracks in California in the same year – Old Friends resident Game On Dude is the other – and he equaled Native Diver's feat of winning the Hollywood Gold Cup (G1) three years in a row.

Did we mention he was beloved by racing fans? Fans love a horse who rose from the claiming ranks to the top echelons of the sport, but even more they love a horse who races a long time, tries his best every time out, and pays off at the window. That was Lava Man.

None of that would have happened if his owners, STD Stable and Jason Wood, had not asked trainer Doug O'Neill to claim the son of Slew City Slew for \$50,000 for them midway through his 3-year-old season, in his 13th start. After being claimed, Lava Man was one of the best in the game for years, winning 14 of 34 starts, with 13 stakes wins, nine of them graded, and earning \$5,170,103. - MARK SIMON

Michael says: When we were contacted in 2008 about retiring Lava Man to Old Friends, I was so excited. But plans changed, and Lava Man went on to become the greatest stable pony in the history of the world. Lava Man is a horse that represents why people love horse racing. He raced every race; he fought every fight. Everything he's ever done has been spectacular, even as a pony. People would come to Doug's barn all the time to see him. He's a superstar. To have two Hall of Famers at Old Friends in Silver Charm and Lava Man is really a testament to everybody who works for us, and I'm thrilled to welcome him. It was a long wait, but worth every minute!

We would like to also thank Corev Nakatani and Patrick Valenzuela, who piloted him to several Grade 1 victories; and Hollywood Park, Santa Anita, and Del Mar racetracks and management who supported Lava Man during his racing career. We would like to thank the National Racing Hall of Fame for his induction in his first year of eligibility in 2015. Little Mike

Little Mike is the boss. Just ask Game On Dude.

Dude and Mike are paddock mates, a great pairing for visitors, who get the opportunity see the collective earners of more than \$10 million and 21 graded stakes wins.

Dude outearned Mike almost 2 to 1, but apparently Mike never got the memo, because he rules the paddock. If you try to give Dude a carrot, Mike is there trying to prevent any such act of kindness. They're for him.

This feeling of privilege was earned by Mike on the track, where he was beloved and doted on by his owner-breeder-trainer, Carlo Vaccarezza. He outran his pedigree by miles. His sire, the unraced and obscure Spanish Steps, sired just five stakes winners in the United States from more than 300 foals, and has since been shipped off to stand in Saudi Arabia. But Little Mike is the stuff owners and breeders dream about – hitting it big, especially with a modestly bred homebred. Little Mike did that. The gelding took his owner on a joyous ride across the country to numerous top races, culminating in a victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita that almost earned him a championship turf title.

Little Mike earned a good retirement, and has that at Old Friends, romping around a paddock with another multimillionaire. And the competitive Little Mike is always trying to show Dude he's still got it.

Michael says: I thought I was Little Mike. I guess now I'm Littler Mike. Who wouldn't fall in love with this gorgeous athlete who outran his pedigree and everything else that anyone threw at him? I still remember his win in the Breeders' Cup, when he was sent off at long odds and with very little respect. He also didn't get much respect from the Eclipse Award voters. I think he's the only horse to win the Breeders' Cup Turf, Arlington Million, and Woodford Reserve Turf Classic in the same year and not win the Eclipse. But he gets all the respect he'll ever need at Old Friends.

Milwaukee Brew

Milwaukee Brew's arrival at Old Friends in October of 2020 provided an example of why the retirement farm was created in the first place – as a place for pensioned stallions to live out their lives in comfort and where fans would have the chance to meet them.

Milwaukee Brew came to his forever home from Frank Stronach's Adena Springs North in Ontario, Canada. On the track, Milwaukee Brew was one of only four horses ever to win the famed Santa Anita Handicap more than once, joining a select club that includes the legendary John Henry, the grand campaigner Lava Man, and three-time winner and fellow Old Friends denizen Game On Dude. Rare territory, and great company, indeed.

By inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic winner Wild Again, Milwaukee Brew was purchased as a yearling by Stronach for \$230,000 and went on to win five graded stakes and \$2,879,612 while racing 24 times from ages 3 through 6. A model of consistency, he ran triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures 18 times.

Milwaukee Brew was well traveled as a stallion, standing initially in Kentucky before relocating to Florida, and eventually to Ontario. Overall, he sired 31 stakes winners and five champions, including Canadian champions Milwaukee Appeal and Ginger Brew.

I was first attracted to Milwaukee Brew because of his name. I'm sure I'm not alone. Beer drinkers of the world unite! He was best known, in some circles, by the horses he lost to - third to Volponi in the 2002 Breeders' Cup Classic; third to Dixie Union in the 2000 Haskell, and he also finished behind fellow Old Friends retiree Albert the Great twice. Sometimes fans forget about his back-to-back wins in the Santa Anita Handicap (2002, 2003) or his scintillating wins in the Californian and the Ohio Derby. He won nearly \$3 million. But that still doesn't explain his popularity. Personally, I think it's because his name perfectly fits his personality. Forget the champagne and the martinis and drinks overwhelmed by cream and fruit. He was a beer guy: a lunch-pail campaigner who showed up for work every time, ready to put in a top effort, as long as the afternoon ended with a trip to the local pub. And he's that way in retirement. Let Silver Charm and Touch Gold garner all the attention. Let them spend the early evening sipping cognac at the Thoroughbred Club. Milwaukee Brew would rather be down at the Red Mile simulcast letting Jill dispense a Molson or two. (Naturally, since he's a Sovereign Award winner, he prefers Canadian beer.) As a retiree, he settled right in. He's not haughty like Touch Gold, but he's got a self-assurance that comes from doing the best he could every time. And, when it was over, acknowledging the competition with a cold one.

Ring Weekend

Ring Weekend was a high-class runner for West Point Thoroughbreds, which purchased the son of leading sire Tapit with high expectations in 2012, paying \$310,000 for him at Keeneland's September yearling sale. He would deliver, and do it often.

Ring's biggest win came in the Grade 1 Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita as a 4-year-old, and he was victorious in graded stakes from ages 3 through 5. He competed in 25 stakes, winning six – all graded. Versatility was one of his strengths; he won on both dirt and turf, at 14 different racetracks through six seasons and earned more than \$1.5 million while finishing in the top three in more than half of his 33 starts, all for trainer Graham Motion. He was the kind of runner that owners and trainers dream about.

Ring's athleticism eventually drew the attention of Olympic gold medalist Phillip Dutton, who, with his wife, Evie, bought into the West Point partnership that owned him. When the well-bred gelding was retired from racing at age 7 in 2018, the Duttons attempted to repurpose him as an event horse, but in the process, Ring suffered an injury that would eliminate a second career. The decision was then made to find a forever home for the classy warrior, and the choice was obvious – Old Friends.

Michael says: After the 2021 Belmont Stakes, I was waiting for Lorita Lindemann to pick me up in the parking lot at Belmont Park. Coincidentally, Graham and Anita Motion were just in front of me. After exchanging a bit of small talk, Graham asked if Old Friends would be interested in Ring Weekend. I was more excited than Brad Cox was in the winner's circle with Essential Quality. I'd seen Ring Weekend, a great West Point Thoroughbred horse, break the track record in the Bernard Baruch at Saratoga. Now, after a swing at being an Olympic competitor for gold medalist Phillip Dutton and a riding horse who exercised on Crane's Beach on the North Shore of Boston, he's here and he's best friends with Nicanor.

He showed promise from the beginning but then sustained a freak injury. We are truly grateful to Old Friends for accepting him, and we hope that this will mean his many fans and admirers can visit. I know we will.

Rocketry

The very name Rocketry might give the impression of a horse who ran like he'd been shot from a cannon, but in reality, the Hard Spun gelding was quite the opposite – a long-winded, distance-loving runner who set a trio of long-distance records in stakes company at major racetracks. Rocketry's come-from-behind style endeared him to fans, whom he rewarded with consistently good performances – finishing first, second, or third in 17 of 29 career starts over five seasons, all for owner Centennial Farms and trainer Jimmy Jerkens. Centennial had purchased the future star for \$450,000 at Keeneland's 2015 September yearling sale; he paid them back handsomely with lifetime earnings of \$811,577.

A highlight of Rocketry's career was his record-setting win in the 2018 Temperence Hill Invitational Stakes at Belmont Park, in which he broke the track standard for 1 5/8 miles on dirt set by legendary Man o' War 98 years earlier (and tied in 1960 by five-time Horse of the Year Kelso), running the distance in 2:40.18. Any horse mentioned in the same breath as those two immortals has indeed achieved something special.

But Rocky would not be defined by that single milestone; he also set distance records at Keeneland and Churchill Downs before retiring in 2021 and sent to unwind at Centennial's facility at Middleburg, Va. Rocky's move to Old Friends in Georgetown, Ky., in the fall of 2021, will allow his many fans to drop by and pay respects to their old favorite.

Ruler On Ice

Ruler On Ice is a classic winner. For those unfamiliar with the jargon of racing, it means he won one of only three races in the United States that carry such a distinguished designation – the Kentucky Derby (G1), Preakness Stakes (G1), and Belmont Stakes (G1). That puts Ruler On Ice in select company, the rarefied air that owners dream of attaining when getting involved in Thoroughbred racing.

Ruler On Ice's owners, George and Lori Hall, were the ones who reveled in that feat, having purchased Ruler On Ice for \$100,000 at the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale. His sire, Roman Ruler, was just starting his career at stud, which turned out to be a very modest career at that, but as with any owner purchasing a horse at auction, the hopes and dreams of the Halls were high from the start.

Ruler On Ice showed some early promise before capturing the 2011 Belmont Stakes, winning a couple of times, once in a maiden race and once in allowance company. In his seventh career start, the Belmont, Ruler On Ice was dismissed at odds of 24-1 in the 12-horse field, his credentials a bit suspect. But wearing blinkers for the first time, he rose to the occasion, winning the 1 1/2-mile Belmont on a sloppy track and becoming the eighth-highest-priced winner in the history of the race.

While he would never win another stakes, he exhibited his class in the penultimate race of his 3-yearold season by finishing third in the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1). At year end, he was fourth in voting for champion 3-year-old male of 2011.

Ruler On Ice retired to his owners' farm in Versailles, Ky., at age 6 as the leading earner for his sire, with \$1,709,566. The Halls sent him to Old Friends in 2022 so more of his fans could see their classic winner.

Ruler On Ice, winner of the 2011 Belmont Stakes, is the fourth winner of the final leg of the Triple Crown to retire to Old Friends, but the first to do so not wearing the moniker of Triple Crown spoiler (see Birdstone/Smarty Jones, Sarava/War Emblem; Touch Gold/Silver Charm). Behind him on the Belmont track that day were Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Animal Kingdom, Preakness (G1) winner Shackleford, and eventual Travers Stakes (G1) winner Stay Thirsty. Later in 2011, Ruler On Ice would finish third in the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), missing second by a length to fellow Old Friends resident Game On Dude. For the balance of Ruler On Ice's five-year racing career, it was clear that he saved the best race of his life for one day on racing's biggest stage and gave it his all when it truly mattered. He would go on to win just once more in his career, and his retirement from racing was announced in 2014 by trainer Kelly Breen. Breen noted that Ruler On Ice retired sound, but that he and the Halls "didn't feel the horse could be competitive at the graded stakes level anymore. He just didn't have it." Ruler On Ice spent several years residing at the Halls' Versailles, Ky., farm and moved to Old Friends in December 2022, when that farm was sold. What do we know about Ruler On Ice today? He is red, he is cute, and he is very friendly. Visitors will love him!

With a half-mile left to run in the 2002 Belmont Stakes, Sarava didn't get a call. He was racing fourth, just behind the leaders, while going nicely on the bridle, but track announcer Tom Durkin, focused like most of the crowd on War Emblem's failing Triple Crown bid, missed Sarava.

When Durkin returned to the front of the Belmont field at the three-furlong pole, Sarava was back on his map, and as the lead pack turned for home and Sarava knifed through to engage Medaglia d'Oro for the lead, it became clear that Sarava, against the odds, was not going away.

"A huge upset is looming here," Durkin said as the finish neared. "Under the line, Sarava has won! The biggest longshot in the history of the Belmont Stakes at 70-1!"

Where did the race come from? The Belmont was Sarava's third career win – and his last. He didn't start for more than 13 months afterward, and never again for trainer Kenny McPeek. In summer 2004, out of the blue, Sarava finished a close fifth in the Grade 1 Suburban and a close fourth in the Grade 1 Whitney. Those races, respectable performances against high-class competition, provided some validation for Sarava's Belmont performance. But posterity will remember Sarava for the sheer improbability of a victory on one of racing's biggest stages.

Michael says: When Sarava, the longest shot in Belmont history, won, I tore up my losing tickets in a huff. Now, I'm overjoyed that he won because he's drawn thousands of fans to Old Friends. Recently, several Brazilian students told us that Sarava's name, in an Afro-Brazilian dialect, means "message to the gods."

Chance of precipitation: 100 percent. We don't know when the classic winner hooked up with Mother Nature, but those of us who watch him from the office window have come to rely on his daily forecast. "Is Sarava in his house?" "Yes." "Better take an umbrella."

Silver Charm

Bob Baffert has won the Kentucky Derby six times now and, owing to American Pharoah and Justify, even has two Triple Crown winners on his résumé. But it was Silver Charm who first got him to the winner's circle on the first Saturday in May, and that victory came one year after a brutal loss, one that left Baffert wondering if he'd ever get a better chance on Derby Day. Cavonnier, Baffert's first starter in the Kentucky Derby, was beaten in the 1996 Derby in the very last jump by Grindstone. A year later, Silver Charm was in a dogfight with Captain Bodgit.

"Please don't do it. Lord, please don't do it to me again," Baffert said he pleaded as the horses neared the wire.

When the horses hit the finish, Baffert collapsed into the arms of Bob Lewis, who owned Silver Charm with his wife, Beverly.

"I didn't think I'd feel like that," Baffert said. "It was an unbelievable experience. My stomach hurt so much when they hit the wire, I couldn't move."

That tenacity was Silver Charm's calling card. Of his 12 wins, six – including a dead heat – were by a head or less. Silver Charm was the first horse with whom Baffert won the Dubai World Cup and was the first Kentucky Derby winner to also win that rich race.

When Silver Charm, led by Three Chimneys' Sandy Hatfield, calmly strolled off the Sallee Van, it marked a milestone in Old Friends history. The consummate professional, Silver Charm would be that seasoned actor who always knows his lines. As a pensioned stallion, he is always pitch-perfect in his understanding of his work as Old Friends's most famous public ambassador. Silver Charm took to the public from the very beginning. He has even worked into his routine the fact that running up from the back of his paddock to the front for receiving carrots, pats, and photo opportunities is far more exciting for his scores of appreciative fans than simply meandering over or just standing around. He gets it. As an older horse, though, he also instinctively understands the importance of pacing himself. Having learned the Old Friends tour schedule, he plans his daily naps in the warm sun to occur just prior to a next round of scheduled visitors. Arising refreshed, Old Friends's esteemed ambassador happily returns to work.

Soi Phet

On the East Coast, the name Soi Phet may have rung no bells for the average racegoer, but out West in recent years it was well known – and beloved. The horse who carried that moniker was a dark bay California-bred gelding who came from nowhere to become one of the most popular regional runners of his time.

Soi Phet was by a stakes-winning brother to Horse of the Year Tiznow, from a female family thin on quality black type. He would do his best to change that. Unraced until age 4, Soi Phet ground it out on the track over eight seasons, winning 15 of 64 starts and earning \$1,023,917. He was claimed at age 5 by trainer Leonard Powell and under his new ownership's banner he proved smart, adaptable, and talented. He earned more than \$1 million of his career earnings for Powell as he developed mentally and physically into a classy competitor on the tough Southern California circuit, where he became a multiple stakes winner at the advanced age of 10. In the 2018 Crystal Water Stakes, Soi Phet paid \$96.80 as he became the oldest horse ever to win a stakes race in Santa Anita's long, storied history.

The "graybeard millionaire," as one writer referred to him, was a sizzling miler at his best, with a heart as big as a mountain. He won eight stakes on dirt and grass, including the 2014 Los Alamitos Mile, in which he broke his own track record in 1:33.95. Powell retired Soi Phet to Old Friends, arriving on July 8, 2019. Fans paid tribute to the gallant gelding on social media, with one commenting: "Thank you for every race you ever ran."

Michael says: Who wouldn't love Soi Phet? The \$16,000 claimer evolved into a millionaire and, on his way to financial security, became one of the most popular athletes in California history. "Financially, he means a lot," said his astute and kind trainer, Leonard Powell, when he won the \$100,000 Bertrando Stakes at Los Alamitos. "But, honestly, for the horse it doesn't mean anything, because to me he has always been worth a million dollars and more." And he's even kinder and cooler than anyone could imagine. He's a sterling example of how a program of care, concern, and love can amount to a long, successful career and a happy and healthy retirement.

The call came in spring 2013 from trainer Leonard Powell. "I have found a horse to claim who looks like he has some potential. Are you in?" The partnership of Benowitz Family Trust, Mathilde Powell, and Paul Viskovich answered "Yes," and thus began the saga of Soi Phet, a 5-year-old gelding with a modest pedigree and only a maiden win in 16 starts. The next six years were extraordinary, as Soi Phet captured eight stakes and placed in six others, including the Grade 1 Awesome Again. In winning the Crystal Water Stakes at age 10, Soi Phet became the oldest stakes winner in the history of Santa Anita. He twice set the mile track record at Los Alamitos, where he won five stakes. Soi Phet proved his versatility by winning on dirt, synthetic, and turf. He won \$1,023,917 while making 64 starts. To his connections, he is "family." Soi Phet's tenacity and longevity made him a fan favorite. His fans continually asked that he be retired where they could visit and see him as a happy horse. There is no better match than Soi Phet and Old Friends, horse heaven on Earth!

Stormy Liberal

Stormy Liberal is the type of success story that horse racing thrives on. The one-time \$100,000 auction juvenile showed only modest promise early in his career and by the fall of his 4-year-old season had been dropped into \$40,000 claiming company. At that price, the Stormy Atlantic geld-ing was snapped up by trainer Peter Miller for Rockingham Ranch and David Bernsen. In Miller's hands, he developed into a star sprinter on grass, racing through age 7, capturing two editions of the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, and earning the title of champion turf male of 2018. On the track, the handsome milk chocolate bay was pure speedball, winning 12 races from five to 6 1/2 furlongs and always on grass, en route to career earnings of more than \$2.2 million. He also went abroad to finish in the money twice in the rich Al Quoz Sprint (UAE-G1) in Dubai.

When a late 2019 exam revealed lesions in both fore ankles, the decision was wisely made to retire Stormy Liberal to Old Friends, where he arrived in mid-February 2020 – unfortunately, just as the coronavirus pandemic was exploding. Now that the farm is past those restrictions, his many fans have been able to come out to Old Friends to see Stormy Liberal.

Stormy Liberal was a once-in-a-lifetime horse. He literally took us around the world, from Hong Kong to Dubai, and no matter where he lined up to run, he outran his odds, which was a testament of his will to win. I am acutely aware that the industry is under fire on a lot of fronts, specifically the safety and well-being of our athletes. I have been fortunate enough to spend a lot of time and resources understanding some of the core factors, and, in my opinion, the predominant cause is not identifying pre-existing conditions. I would urge other owners, especially those who have been able to enjoy success at the highest level, to take a more active role in finding and supporting a solution. Gary Hartunian of Rockingham Ranch and I are immensely grateful to have been able to race such a magnificent horse, and we hope his retirement to Old Friends will benefit all retired horses.

The Pizza Man

The Pizza Man is a real home state hero. The son of English Channel was bred in Illinois, won the state's richest race – the Grade 1 Arlington Million – and retired as the all-time leading money earner bred in the Prairie State, with \$2,158,941. He is the only Illinois-bred ever to win the Arlington Million.

Bred by Midwest Thoroughbreds, the operation of Richard and Karen Papiese of Chicago, The Pizza Man is a homegrown product, the Papieses having claimed his dam, I Can Fan Fan, for \$18,000 in 2005. He got his name because the Papieses thought the blaze on his forehead looked like a slice of pizza. Though from Chicago, they did not specify if they thought it looked like deep dish or thin crust.

Trained by the late Roger Brueggemann, The Pizza Man raced for seven years, winning 17 of 36 starts. His victories included Arlington's Grade 3 Stars and Stripes Stakes twice and the Grade 2 Hollywood Turf Cup. He even ventured to Canada to win the Grade 1 Northern Dancer Turf Stakes. In 2015, for his 6-year-old season, he was named Illinois-bred Horse of the Year.

The Pizza Man was retired on September 16, 2017, in a ceremony at Arlington Park, and later worked as a stable pony for Brueggemann's barn.

He came to Old Friends in August 2020 along with 2014 sprint champion Work All Week, another Papiese Illinois homebred trained by Brueggemann. These two Illinois-breds now share a paddock in retirement.

The Pizza Man received his unique moniker from owner Richard Papiese, who believed that the bay son of English Channel displayed a blaze on his forehead that looked like a slice of pizza. I don't see it. It's kind of like seeing a religious effigy in a slice of dry toast with extra cheese. In any case, little of that matters now. The Pizza Man retired as one of the greatest Thoroughbreds ever produced in Illinois, and, as a retiree, he still displays that Fightin' Illini spirit. And he certainly is one of the best athletes that state has produced in the past decade. Trained by the late Roger Brueggemann, The Pizza Man didn't hit his stride until his 5-year-old campaign. That year, I was invited by trainer Dee Poulos and racetrack guru Richard Duchossois to hand out the trophy for the Black Tie Affair Stakes at Arlington Park. He dominated the Black Tie Affair and won wire to wire. And I got to present him the trophy. Now, thanks to Richard and Karen Papiese, we've been reunited at Old Friends. I'm sure he doesn't remember me, but I sure remember him. He's so good looking and dignified I'm thinking of renaming him The Pavlova Man. But that wouldn't fit. I'll take The Pizza Man with all fixins.

Touch Gold

For over 20 years I have been awaiting the chance to repay the favor to Touch Gold for bailing me out, and those that happened to trust my opinion back on a famous afternoon of racing.

Push the rewind button to June 1997, when Silver Charm was seeking to become a Triple Crown winner in the Belmont Stakes after winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. And though I respected Silver Charm, I was thrilled about the prospect of betting against him at a short price – with Illinois Derby winner Wild Rush.

I told friends in the *Daily Racing Form* office that year: Wild Rush – bet him. Well, Wild Rush gave me a Belmont rush for only a mile or so, then began his retreat. And that's when his entrymate Touch Gold saved the day, rallying wide under Chris McCarron to catch Silver Charm in the closing strides. Thanks to Touch Gold being coupled in the wagering with Wild Rush, I was wrong and still got to collect a \$7.30 mutuel, leaving me that day much luckier than smart.

With the benefit of hindsight, Wild Rush had nothing on Touch Gold as a 3-year-old. For that matter, it could be argued that not even Silver Charm and Free House – other top 3-year-olds of that year – were of his quality for at least a few months that summer, when Touch Gold also won the Haskell, and prior to the Belmont was an unlucky fourth in the Preakness after stumbling to his face at the start and injuring a hoof.

He is a splendid addition to Old Friends, and I'm sure many, like me, will forever remember his 1997 Belmont victory, whether they bet him (or his stablemate) or not.

I call Touch Gold our hunk-a-hunk-a horse. He is an admirable combination of power, muscle, intelligence, and intensity. He exudes strength and confidence and commands respect. In his younger days a formidable opponent on the racetrack, today he is still every bit a proud, territorial stallion. On tours, Touch Gold teaches me patience. I approach his paddock calling his name. Always in the opposite corner of his paddock from me, he begins with a look over his shoulder. The stopwatch starts ... the game is on. Every movement is a precisely choreographed practiced strategy. He starts with a slow turn in my direction, and proceeds with a graceful, cat-like walk, every step measured. At the halfway point in his paddock, he breaks into a full run. Touch Gold defines "horsepower" - all cylinders firing. Suddenly he is right in front of me with a precision-timed stop – a proud arrival at the finish line, awaiting carrots. Visitors are thrilled! I quickly glance upward in thanks, and breathe a sigh of relief. Another victory for Touch Gold ... a little more patience for me, plenty of appreciation for him!

Work All Week

Illinois has had a viable breeding industry for a century now, producing the likes of 1927 champion Anita Peabody, 1970 Kentucky Derby winner Dust Commander, 1998 champion turf male Buck's Boy, and more recent multiple Grade 1 winner Stephanie's Kitten. Another who belongs in that rank is America's 2014 Eclipse Award-winning sprinter Work All Week.

Bred in the Prairie State by Richard and Karen Papiese's Midwest Thoroughbreds and trained by Roger Brueggemann, the chestnut son of City Zip did not race until November of his sophomore season – and did not win until age 4. But from then on, his career shot off on a straight-to-the-stars trajectory.

Work All Week eventually became a seven-time stakes winner, finishing in the top three in 18 of 19 starts and earning \$1,511,071. His marquee victory came in the 2014 Breeders' Cup Sprint, preceded by a record-smashing six-furlong performance in Keeneland's Phoenix Stakes, which together netted him an Eclipse Award.

The two-time Illinois Horse of the Year was retired in October 2015 due to a stress fracture in his right knee. After lay-up and recovery, Work All Week returned to the track as a stable pony in 2016, running down more than a few loose horses for New York trainer Danny Gargan. Along with his Grade 1-winning stablemate The Pizza Man, the brilliant sprinter was retired to Old Friends, where the two geldings now happily share a paddock.

Work All Week is aptly named. He certainly wasn't precocious. He didn't race at 2 and, as a 3-year-old, he ran in an undistinguished maiden race at Hawthorne and finished a disappointing sixth. Yet, as a 4-year-old, he won seven of eight sprints, and, at 5, he showed up at Oaklawn Park and acted as if he owned the place. He did. In the fall of the year (2014), he won the prestigious Phoenix Stakes at Keeneland, punching his ticket for the Breeders' Cup a few weeks later. His stunning performance at long odds, defeating another Illinois-based speedster and future Old Friends resident Private Zone in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, cemented his claim to that year's Eclipse Award as sprint champion. When we were contacted by his owners, Richard and Karen Papiese, we were thrilled that they would trust us with their retired champion and, furthermore, he would be accompanied by his stablemate and fellow great Illinoisbred, The Pizza Man. Work All Week didn't disappoint on the track with earnings of more than \$1.5 million, and he won't disappoint his fans. The 14-year-old chestnut gelding is as handsome as he was fast. And, in an ending so ridiculously happy it might have been rejected by Walt Disney, he shares a paddock with longtime associate The Pizza Man seven days a week.

Zulu Alpha

Owner Michael Hui has enjoyed much success in the challenging world of claiming, a segment of racing he has decided to focus on. And why not? It has given him a number of notable runners who have risen from the claiming ranks to become stakes winners and to earn back their purchase prices many times over.

Zulu Alpha, Hui's most successful claim to date, is a prime example of how when things go right in this game, it can be both exhilarating and profitable.

Hui, a resident of Little Rock, Ark., claimed Zulu Alpha for \$80,000 in the fall of the gelding's 5-year-old season. In his first start for Hui, the son of Street Cry won the Grade 3 Sycamore Stakes at Keeneland, earning \$60,000. But he was just getting warmed up. In the care of trainer Mike Maker, Zulu Alpha eventually won seven stakes for Hui, none more important or prestigious than the Grade 1, \$1 million Pegasus World Cup Turf Invitational at Gulfstream Park. He had preceded that victory with a strong fourth-place finish in the 2019 Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita. In 18 starts for Hui, Zulu Alpha earned \$2,091,350, more than 26 times his claiming price.

Several years earlier, Hui had claimed the Offlee Wild gelding Hogy, also for \$80,000, and that horse went on to win three stakes and \$442,855 for his new owner. Hogy was retired to Old Friends in 2019 but unfortunately died in 2021. Hui now has another well-deserved retiree at Old Friends in Zulu Alpha.



The wife of the late Allen Paulson won Fraise from her husband in a wager on the green, decided he should be competing on the grass, not the dirt, and turned over training duties to Bill Mott, who had won the Breeders' Cup Turf with Theatrical in 1987. The result was a record-breaking Breeders' Cup Turf win by a head in a blazing 2:24.

Indeed, years from now, when people talk about Lane's End's beginnings, they will talk about Gulch. And for that, we thank our old friend.

He'd prance up the driveway and walk through the barn door and into his stall, where fresh hay, feed, and carrots awaited him. If there were not enough carrots, he'd shoot us a look and neigh. He knew what he wanted and when he wanted it, but he was never rude. His majesty is difficult to capture in words.
