Surrounded by the love and goodwill of our supporters, I can proudly report that we are in the midst of a remarkable era of growth for Old Friends.



Derby dreams

In 2024, Old Friends welcomed two Kentucky Derby winners, Big Brown and I'll Have Another

In 2003, Old Friends began with a single paddock for horses at Betty Sue Walters's Afton Farm in Georgetown, Ky., and then grew to a number of paddocks at Alfred Nuckols's Hurstland Farm in Midway, Ky., in 2004.

In 2006, Michael Blowen's dream of Old Friends having a permanent home became a reality when it moved its operation to Dream Chase Farm in Georgetown.

With the farm's opening, more horses began to arrive for their retirement, including some well-known champions such as Hall of Famer Precisionist, who won the 1985 Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) and Eclipse Award as champion sprinter; Sunshine Forever, second-place finisher in the Breeders' Cup Turf (G1) and 1988

champion turf male; and Black Tie Affair, 1991 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner and Horse of the Year.

However, one dream of Blowen's – having a Kentucky Derby (G1) winner at the farm – remained unfulfilled for the first decade of its existence.

"We needed to attract visitors to sustain Old Friends, and there are no athletes more popular in Thoroughbred racing than winners of the Kentucky Derby," Blowen said.

In September 2012, 2002 Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Sarava arrived at Old Friends and became the first classic winner at the farm. Blowen's dream of getting a Kentucky Derby champion was beginning to seem attainable.

Two years later, in late 2014, Michael got a call he had long hoped to get. It came from Sandy Hatfield, then stallion manager at

Dual classic winner I'll Have Another came to Old Friends after having stood at stud in Japan and California.

Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Ky., asking if he'd be interested in having "an old, gray stallion at the farm?"

Michael knew immediately what horse she was talking about, "And I went absolutely out of my mind. But, before I could go completely crazy, she added, 'You can't tell anybody.'"

Now, Blowen, self-admittedly, has a hard time keeping secrets, but this one he did, though he had to find an outlet for his excitement, so ... "I got on one of the golf carts and drove to the back of the farm and I ran around screaming like an 8-year-old. I mean if anybody had seen me or heard me, I would have been locked up. I was just so excited."

Kentucky Derby dream fulfilled

On the cold, drizzly day of December 1, 2014, with over 150 people in attendance, 1997 Kentucky Derby winner and Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Silver Charm, Blowen's all-time favorite horse, stepped off a Sallee Horse van and onto Old Friends's property. Blowen's "Derby dream" had finally become reality.

"Silver Charm arriving at Old

Friends was like Elvis coming back to Graceland," said Blowen.

And, in a short time, his thoughts about how much of an impact a Derby winner at the farm would mean to attracting visitors proved to be right, too, as the farm realized tourists in much bigger numbers than ever. Some people even came from overseas to see the beautiful gray stallion.

In the next couple of years, two more winners of the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes arrived, War Emblem in October 2015, and Charismatic in December 2016.

Since that time, sadly, both War Emblem and Charismatic have died, leaving only Silver Charm, who's still going strong at age 31.

In 2024, some big changes happened at Old Friends. Blowen retired from his day-to-day duties as head of the farm, and John Nicholson, the former executive director of the Kentucky Horse Park, was named the new president and CEO.

One of the first things that happened on Nicholson's watch was the arrival of two more dual Derby-Preakness winners in the form of Big Brown and I'll Have Another.

Big Brown arrives

Bred by Monticule, Big Brown, by Boundary out of Mien, by Nureyev, was foaled in Kentucky on April 10, 2005.

He began his racing career as a 2-year-old in 2007 under the care of trainer Patrick Reynolds for owner Paul Pompa Jr., and on Sept. 3, he won his first and only start of the year, a maiden special weight race at Saratoga at 1 1/16 miles on turf, by an impressive 11 1/4 lengths.

He began his 3-year-old campaign in 2008 with a new trainer, Rick Dutrow, and a partnership group consisting of Pompa and IEAH Stable.

His first two starts were at Gulfstream Park. In the first, under Kent Desormeaux, who would ride him thereafter, he won an allowance race at a mile on dirt by 12 3/4 lengths. In his next start, he captured the Florida Derby (G1) by five lengths for his first graded stakes victory, earning a spot in the Kentucky Derby.

Big Brown then went to Churchill Downs and won the 134th running of the Run for the Roses by 43/4 lengths over the second-place finisher, the ill-fated filly Eight Belles, who broke down past the finish line. Two weeks later, the big, beautiful bay Thoroughbred won the Preakness Stakes by 5 1/4 lengths. With that win, he headed to New York for the Belmont Stakes to try and become the first winner of the Triple Crown since Affirmed in 1978.

However, in the lead-up to the race, Big Brown developed a quarter crack in his left-front hoof, and there were questions about whether he'd be able to participate. A few days before the race it was determined he was okay to run.

In the race, though while he was in good position to go for the lead coming out of the final turn, he began to fall back rapidly.

Desormeaux, realizing his horse was not going to win, chose to pull up Big Brown to avoid any possible injury and save him for another day.

Desormeaux's move paid off. After a brief rest, Big Brown returned in August to win the Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1) at Monmouth Park and then won the \$500,000 Monmouth Stakes on turf in September.

He was to run in the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), but another injury forced him into retirement. He finished his career with seven



wins in eight starts and \$3,614,500 in earnings. At year's end, he was voted champion 3-year-old colt.

Big Brown began his stud career at Three Chimneys Farm, standing there from 2009 to 2014, while also shuttling to Australia.

In 2014, Andrew Cohen's Sunrise Stables and Gary Tolchin's Golden Goose Enterprises, who were both involved with Big Brown's ownership group, obtained a majority interest in the stallion and relocated him for the 2015 season to Dutchess Views Farm in Pine Plains, N.Y. In 2018, Dutchess Views formed a joint venture with Irish Hill Century Farm for breeding, and in 2020, Big Brown rewarded their faith by becoming New York state's leading sire.

Big Brown's best progeny included Dortmund, a multiple graded stakes winner who earned over \$1.9 million, and \$1.7 million earner Somelikeithotbrown, champion New York-bred 3-yearold of 2019 and winner of the 2020 Bernard Baruch Handicap (G2). Plus, his daughter Puca produced Mage, winner of the 2023 Kentucky Derby, and Dornoch, winner of the 2024 Belmont Stakes.

Big Brown was pensioned in 2024 and thanks to Cohen and all of Big Brown's connections, the decision was made to send him to Old Friends to enjoy his retirement.

With his arrival, one of his biggest fans, Dr. Bryan Waldridge, Old Friends veterinarian, was happy to see him arrive at the farm.

"His was a Derby that I will never forget," Waldridge said. "I was on emergency duty and got hospitalized by the worst kick that I have ever received. I came back

to Rood and Riddle on crutches just in time to see the horses leave the gate. I will always remember being on crutches and working straight through the weekend without stop until going to the orthopedic surgeon on Monday morning. Big Brown ran like a beast and Eight Belles can never be forgotten for literally giving her all in a valiant effort."

I'll Have Another

Bred by Harvey Clarke, I'll Have Another, by Flower Alley out of Arch's Gal Edith, by Arch, was foaled at Brookdale Farm in Versailles, Ky., on April 1, 2009.

Trained by Doug O'Neill for owner Paul Reddam his entire career, I'll Have Another began racing as a 2-year-old in 2011 and won his first start, a maiden special weight race at Hollywood Park, on July 3. He followed up with a second-place finish in the Best Pal Stakes (G2) at Del Mar. An unplaced effort in the Hopeful Stakes (G1) at Saratoga ended his juvenile season.

The chestnut colt came out much stronger as a 3-year-old and punched his ticket to the 138th Kentucky Derby with wins in the Robert B. Lewis Stakes (G2) and the Santa Anita Derby (G1).

In the Kentucky Derby, I'll Have Another came from off the pace to defeat favored Bodemeister, by 11/2 lengths. In the Preakness, he once again wore down Bodemeister in the stretch to win by a neck.

I'll Have Another went to New York for the Belmont to attempt to win the Triple Crown, but it was not to be, as he had to be scratched a day before the race due to a leg injury and was retired. I'll Have Another finished the year with an undefeated record in four starts, and \$2,629,600 in earnings. He closed the books on his racing career with five wins, one second, and \$2,693,600 in earnings in seven starts. He was voted the 2012 Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old colt.

I'll Have Another was sold as a stallion prospect for \$10 million to the Hokkaido-based Big Red Farm in Japan and began his stud career there in 2013. He stood there through 2018, then returned to the United States to stand at Ballena Vista Farm in Ramona, Calif., from 2019 to 2020, before moving to Reddam's Ocean Breeze Ranch in Bonsall, Calif., from 2021 to 2024.

I'll Have Another was pensioned in 2024, and Reddam graciously sent his champion to Old Friends for his retirement.

One final Derby dream

Today, with five Kentucky Derby winners to date having been retired to Old Friends, Blowen has one final Derby dream.

"Old Friends has been home to five Kentucky Derby winners – Silver Charm, Charismatic, War Emblem, I'll Have Another, and Big Brown," Blowen said. "Currently, Calumet Farm holds the record of having owned the most Derby winners, with eight. It's my dream that Old Friends will surpass that number while I'm still alive."

With Old Friends having earned the respect and acceptance of the Thoroughbred racing community over the last 20-plus years and owners wanting their stars to be seen after retirement, Blowen's final dream may well come true.





Fast fleet feet

Old Friends has a number of residents who set track records during their racing days

During the summer of 2024, Old Friends opened the Josephine Abercrombie Welcome Center, a complete renovation of the tobacco barn that had served Dream Chase Farm and Old Friends for decades. Situated on top of the hill on the front side of the farm, the old barn had seen countless crops of tobacco stored in its rafters and, later, the births of promising foals that began their racing or breeding careers at Dream Chase Farm.

The Center is now a multipurpose facility, and the exciting thing for our visitors is that it includes an audio-visual system that allows them to watch videos of races by our retirees. That includes being able to see the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes victories of our champions, Silver Charm, Big Brown, and I'll Have Another; the races of Hall of Fame member Lava Man; and Breeders' Cup wins by our residents.

As a long-time tour guide at Old Friends, I've had the pleasure of sitting with hundreds of visitors as they watched race videos of our horses.

A race that caught my attention was Bellamy Road's 17 1/2-length win in the 2005 Grade 1 Wood Memorial Stakes at Aqueduct. The video mentioned that Bellamy Road tied the track record for the 11/8-mile race. My first thought was, "Which horse also shared that record?" That started my research into how many Old Friends horses had set track records.

It resulted in an impressive list that features some of my favorites horses. Here's is look at some of these outstanding achievements.

Bellamy Road

Wood Memorial S. (G1). Aqueduct, Apr. 9.

Stakes record: 1 1/8 miles, 1:47.16

The race: Bellamy Road was sent off the 5-2 favorite in the Wood Memorial. Sent to the front at the start, Bellamy Road maintained his lead throughout the race while running on the inside, with a narrow advantage until the final turn, when jockey Javier Castellano turned him loose. He lengthened his lead through the stretch and won in a final time of 1:47.16. Although the official chart for the race indicated that Bellamy Road's finish was a "new track record," it turns out that the track record of 1:47 belongs to Riva Ridge, who captured the 11/8-mile, Grade 2 Stuyvesant Handicap in 1973. Bellamy Road's time was a stakes record. Although the Wood Memorial has long been considered a prep race for the Kentucky Derby. only 11 horses have won both events.

Bellamy Road today: When Bellamy Road arrived at the farm on Jan. 15, 2021, tour guides quickly learned to respect him. Although he appreciated his carrots, he would frequently bite

the hand that fed him, and arms, shoulders, and clothes, as well. As long as tour guides cautioned the visitors before feeding him, he would behave himself. As the first horse on the tour, Bellamy Road became a favorite of several of the guides.

El Gato Malo

San Rafael S. (G3), Oak Tree at Santa Anita, Jan

Track record: 1 mile, all-weather surface. 1:33.37

The race: Six horses entered the gate in the San Rafael, Favored Massive Drama set a very fast pace on the lead until midstretch, when he began tiring, and the fast-charging El Gato Malo went past him inside the eighth pole to record a 6 1/4-length win, setting a track record of 1:33.37.

El Gato Malo today: El Gato Malo has spent time in retirement honing his acting skills. When visiting his paddock, he encourages visitors to offer him sympathy (and carrots!) for his (not injured) injured leg, which

he raises and dangles convincingly. After receiving his carrot reward, he quickly shows his other leg is also injured (not!) and also needs carrots to make him feel better. We fall for it (and him) every time.

Joey P.

Decathlon S., Monmouth Park, May 12, 2007 **Track record:** 5 1/2 furlongs, 1:01.91

The race: In what turned out to be his best year on the track, Joey P. went to the post in the Decathlon Stakes as the 7-5 favorite. Joey P. was held in third early by jockey Joe Bravo, then moved ahead for better position at the top of the stretch, where he drew away to win comfortably by two lengths. His final time of 1:01.91 for 5 1/2 furlongs was a track record.

Joey P. today: Joey P. is a homebred New Jersey boy who is too good looking for his own good. Despite that, he is one of the kindest horses at Old Friends. Visitors love him!

Lava Man

Khaled S., Hollywood Park, Apr. 30, 2006 **Course record:** 1 1/8 miles, turf, 1:44.26

The race: Following his win two months earlier in the Grade 1 Santa Anita Handicap, Lava Man was the heavy favorite in the 2006 Khaled Stakes at Hollywood Park. With nine career wins already to his credit (three of those in graded races), Lava Man was clearly the horse to beat in this race restricted to California-breds, Running just off the pace through the first half-mile, he took the lead nearing the second turn and won by 51/4 lengths, completing the 11/8 miles on firm turf in course-record time of 1:44.26.

Mr. Jordan

Millions Classic Preview, Gulfstream Park West, Nov. 12, 2016

Track record: 1 1/16 miles, 1:42.52

The race: Facing seven other Florida-breds in the Millions Classic Preview Stakes at Gulfstream Park West, Mr. Jordan broke in midpack and stayed just off the pace in third. He moved up to the front a furlong out and opened up a widening lead, finishing 33/4 lengths on top as the 1-2 favorite. His time was a record-setting 1:42.52 for the $1\,1/16$ miles.

Mr. Jordan today: Fellow tour guide and Old Friends photographer Laura Battles describes Mr. Jordan as a clever wimp. He's had to learn how to sneak around paddock boss Soi Phet in order to get his fair share of carrots. He does it quite well.

Normandy Invasion

Allowance race, Gulfstream, Feb. 22, 2014 Track record: 1 mile, 1:33.13

The race: Sent off at 1-5 in a one-mile allowance/optional claiming race at Gulfstream. Normandy Invasion was fourth early in the race and remained in midpack until the quarter pole, when he went around the leaders and drew away to win by 73/4 lengths. His time of 1:33.13 set a track record.

Normandy Invasion today:

As a new resident of Old Friends. Normandy Invasion is slowly integrating into his paddock group and making friends. He quickly figured out that buckets mean carrots. He loves carrots!

Rail Trip

Hollywood Gold Cup H. (G1), Hollywood, July 11.2009

Track record: 1 1/4 miles, all-weather surface, 2:00.75

The race: With five wins in his previous seven starts, it's hard to imagine why Rail Trip went off at 9-1 in the 2009 Hollywood Gold Cup. He broke sharply and ran outside of pacesetting longshot Tres Borrachos until the top of the stretch, when he pushed ahead of the tiring pacesetter and drew off to win by three lengths to the delight of his backers, setting the track record 2:00.75 for 1 1/4 miles on the all-weather surface.

Rail Trip today: Residing in Paddock 30 with four other retirees, Rail Trip and best pal Lion Hunter mostly do their own thing and don't care what anyone else is doing. Retirement, their way!

Red Knight

Colonial Cup S., Colonial Downs, July 27, 2022 Course record: About 1 1/2 miles, turf,

The race: Red Knight raced inside and midpack early, went four wide at the top of stretch, and

drew clear at the quarter pole to win by 11/2 lengths in 2:29.67 on firm turf. An interesting occurrence at the start of the race most likely contributed to Red Knight earning the course record at the distance. According to the official chart of the race, the starting gate on the inner turf was placed at the wrong spot. The race was run at "about 11/2 miles" rather than the intended 1 1/2 miles. The track record at Colonial for 11/2 miles on the inner turf was set in 2024 by True Quality in 2:25.16, leading one to assume that Red Knight's race that day was longer than originally scheduled. Still, not bad for an 8-year-old.

Red Knight today: Red Knight shares a paddock with another chestnut turf runner, Channel Maker. In fact, I have to look at their faces to distinguish between the two; Channel Maker's white blaze is wider. During their careers, the pair competed head-to-head eight times over a period of four years. During one of my tours on the farm in 2024, someone asked me which horse got the better of the other. Based on their earnings. I thought it would be Channel Maker, but when I checked the stats after the tour, it turned out to be Red Knight, by a huge margin. Red Knight had two wins and a second-place finish in the eight races, Channel Maker was 0-0-0. Both are impressive

horses who love their carrots and attention, but Red Knight is a bit more demanding and shows no shame in following visitors around the perimeter of the paddock.

Ring Weekend

Bernard Baruch H. (G2), Saratoga, Sept. 5, 2016 Course record: 1 1/16 miles, turf, 1:38,29

The race: Drawing post 2 in a nine-horse field in the Bernard Baruch on turf at Saratoga, Ring Weekend broke midpack and raced comfortably in that position early. He moved to the inside on the far turn and then out at the head of the stretch to contest the early pacesetter, Take the Stand. Ring Weekend got up in time to win by a neck in a three-horse photo finish. During the stretch run, there was significant bumping among many of the horses, enough to initiate a stewards' inquiry, but there was no change to the order of finish. Ring Weekend's time of 1:38.29 established a course record.

Ring Weekend today: I always enjoy taking visitors to see Ring Weekend and his paddock mate, Nicanor, because they both have excellent stories to tell. I remember Ring taking his time to warm up to visitors, but once he did, he was the first to the fence when carrots were around. It also didn't take him long to realize that carrots might be available on both sides of his paddock when visitors were around.

Rocketry

Temperence Hill S., Belmont, Sept. 30, 2018 **Track record:** 1 5/8 miles, dirt, 2:40.18

The race: Breaking last in the field of five, Rocketry was unhurried early, being rated patiently through the first turn and up backstretch. Jockey Joel Rosario eased up on the reins, and Rocketry passed other horses four wide and was in the lead by the quarter pole. He extended his margin to win by 1 1/2 lengths, setting the track record of 2:40.18. Leading the field until Rocketry took to the front that day was fellow Old Friends retiree War Story, who was the 4-5 favorite. Rocketry gained some measure of notoriety that day because he broke the Belmont track record for 15/8 miles that was jointly held by two of racing's all-time greats, Man o' War and Kelso.

Rocketry wasn't done setting track records!

Marathon S. (G2), Churchill Downs, Nov. 2, 2018 **Track record:** 1 3/4 miles, 2:57.62

The race: Bettors took notice of Rocketry's record-setting run at Belmont Park in his previous start, and he was sent off as the post-time favorite in the Marathon Stakes at Churchill Downs a month later. Bumped at the start, Rocketry stayed far off the pace early as he had in his previous start, went wide, and took the lead from the pacesetter, Dabster, three furlongs out. Dabster fought back, and Rocketry prevailed in a long stretch duel to win by three-quarters of a length. His hard-fought victory earned Rocketry a second track record just five weeks after his first one at Belmont. Were his record-setting days behind him? Not yet!

Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance S. (G2), Keeneland, Nov. 6, 2020

Track record: 1 5/8 miles, dirt, 2:42.57

The race: Much as he had done in his two previous recordbreaking races, Rocketry was far back early in the 14-horse TAA Stakes field, trailing the leaders by more than eight lengths after the first mile was run. In an impressive move through the final turn, Rocketry moved up to fourth and rallied in the stretch to record a one-length win in 2:42.57, the third track-record-setting win of his career. Despite having shown an aptitude for distance racing, Rocketry went off at 11-1 odds in the TAA. Finishing midpack that day after pressing the early pace was fellow Old Friends retiree Signalman.

Rocketry today: He is Paddock 55 boss to Fearless and Lubash. Rocketry is a confident dude who

wants to make sure you know he broke a track record at Belmont that was first set by the immortal Man 'o War. Just sayin'.

Soi Phet

Los Alamitos Mile S., Los Alamitos, Sept. 6, 2014

Track record: 1 mile, 1:33.95

The race: Sent off at almost 5-1 in the 2014 Los Alamitos Mile, Soi Phet, under Hall of Fame jockey Kent Desormeaux, broke near the back of the pack in the field of eight but gained ground in the backstretch and settled in behind the leader through the turn. At the eighth pole, he responded to urging by Desormeaux and stormed past the leader for a convincing 7 1/4-length win, completing the mile in a recordsetting 1:33.95.

Soi Phet today: Paddock boss to the previously mentioned Mr.

The Pizza Man

Allowance race, Arlington, May 18, 2012 Course record: Abt. 1 1/16 miles, turf, 1:39.33

The race: As the 2-1 favorite. The Pizza Man broke midpack and remained there until moving inside just prior to the turn. He kicked ahead in midstretch to capture the lead inside the furlong grounds and gradually drew away to win by 21/2 lengths, setting a course record of 1:39.33 for the about distance of 1 1/16 miles on turf.

The Pizza Man today: The sometimes goofy The Pizza Man is boss of Paddock 53 friend Tuneintobow. He keeps a sharp eye out for the carrot bucket and will sometimes share if he's in the mood. One of the most popular horses on the farm because, really, who doesn't like Pizza?

Welder

David M. Vance S., Remington, Sept. 29, 2019 Track record: 6 furlongs, 1:08.13

The race: With 18 wins to his credit prior to the 2019 running of the David Vance Stakes, Welder was the overwhelming 3-10 favorite when the gates opened. Just past the quarter pole, Welder took the lead and increased his advantage through the stretch to win by three lengths. During his racing career, Welder would run in the Vance Stakes three times and win two

of them. Welder won Remington Park's Silver Goblin Stakes four consecutive years.

Welder today: Welder arrived at Old Friends in 2023 and shares a paddock with Rated R Superstar. When he's not working the fences looking for carrots from visitors, he stays busy rolling in the mud to hide his striking gray color. We found out shortly after Welder's arrival that he is the winningest horse at Remington Park, with 16 wins, and was inducted into the Oklahoma Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2023.

Most of our horses have never set track records, but those mentioned, and a few others over the years, have done so to the thrill of racing fans who witnessed their exploits. Winning a horse race is tough enough, but doing so in trackrecord time places these runners at a higher level of excellence.

As an Old Friends tour guide, I have the best job on the farm, although it's not a job in the true sense of the word . . . it's a privilege. I get to escort our visitors, many of whom know nothing about Thoroughbreds or horse racing, on a trip around the farm to meet many horses that are admired in the sport. I tell their stories and let these fabulous equine athletes share their own personalities as they eat carrots with our visitors. Many of our guests leave the farm with a new understanding of the excitement that draws us to the sport of horse racing.

Hogan's heroes

Patty Hogan is one of the best friends a racehorse can have. Just ask Old Friends residents Foliage, Shaky Pants, and Jack a Rose, a trio of horses on the farm affectionately known as Hogan's Heroes. They owe their lives to Dr. Hogan and the caring staff of Hogan Equine Clinic at Pheasant Hill Farm in New Jersey. Old Friends offers its gratitude and thanks.

I have always wanted to help with the Thoroughbred aftercare problem since I became aware of it in the mid-1990s, when I first started my veterinary career in New Jersey. At the time, there was very little organized structure to address this issue, and with my first experience, it was actually a group of concerned women getting together and holding bake sales to help one horse at Monmouth Park.

It did not take me long to realize how big this problem was. What a daunting task it is to bring about awareness within the industry and try to get aftercare incorporated as an essential element into the big picture of racing's business model.

At the time, I was working for someone else and had very little autonomy to contribute pro-bono services, but once I started my own practice in 2007, that all changed. I decided that this issue really needed a grand gesture, and a discount on a veterinary bill was just not going to make enough of a difference. So my policy was to offer surgical and medical services to these aftercare groups 100 percent free of charge. Horses have really made my life, and it is just something of value I feel I can give back to them and really effect some change.

We work with all of the aftercare and rescue groups throughout the Northeast, and if there is a horse with an injury, and surgery could make a tangible difference in its ability to enjoy a second career, we provide it. The cost of a surgical repair can really wipe out what is already a tight budget for these groups, so I figured we will just jumpstart the process for them, and monies raised could be better applied for the rehab and placement costs. They never get a bill from us. We have averaged over \$100,000 a year in free services for the past 15 years. I feel it is the best money we have ever spent.

We review many, many cases for these groups and sometimes surgery is not the right option. In those situations, we make appropriate recommendations for care, rehab, and

levels of placement. The cases we take on are the ones where surgery will fix the problem, make a tangible difference, and result in a good outcome for a second career for the horse. In many cases, these surgeries involve screw placement for fracture repair, or arthroscopic surgery for removal of chip fractures in a joint. Our objective is to take a fixable problem, address it, and send the horse out the door with a good prognosis for a second career.

The biggest hurdle we face today is really that of education. We are focused on stressing to owners and trainers the negative effects of chasing the "one last race syndrome," where continuing to race does more damage to the horse, making it less of a candidate for a second career, and is economically a losing situation for the connections. In these cases, the horse is not a viable racehorse but continues to cost money to keep in training, and the physical ailments it has will continue to propagate into something that eventually renders it unable to pursue a second career.

As difficult a decision as it can be, we try to avoid repairing horses that have very severe

injuries or advanced arthritis to a degree where a second career is just not possible, no matter what we do. We feel horses need a job in order to maintain value and purpose to their lives, and we strive to give those horses the care that will provide them a second career. The ones who consistently fall through the cracks, and end up in dire situations, are the ones with chronic lameness, suitable only for pasture life.

There have been a few exceptions to our rule of avoiding complicated repairs on horses whose only outcome would be a pasturesoundness situation. These have been horses who have a guaranteed quality home for life and we were comfortable helping them achieve that outcome. Two of those cases ended up at probably the best quality home that a horse could wish for - at Old Friends! Shaky Pants and Foliage had severe orthopedic injuries that required complex repairs for a pasture-sound prognosis. Knowing they had a lifetime home arranged at Old Friends made our decision to help them easy.

Jack a Rose was notable in every sense of the word – he incurred a breakdown injury

to a hind fetlock and required a life-saving salvage procedure called a fetlock arthrodesis. That is a very expensive and extensive surgical procedure that requires a long rehab that I normally cannot justify for a horse to live only a pasture-sound life. However, Jack had a guardian angel in owner Lisa Nowak, and she scrimped, borrowed, and saved to get this horse through the procedure and on to his new life at Old Friends. Jack a Rose is a very kind and special horse, and he did everything just right following surgery to get a great outcome.

With nearly 30 years of experience as an equine veterinarian, I feel horses have a sense of trust of certain people, and I know they can tell when someone is helping them. It is incredibly rewarding to take in a horse that is in pain, is uncertain, and nervous – and by addressing its injury and providing care, you can visibly appreciate the immediate sense of calm the horse has once he or she realizes it is safe and in a good place. It is something I will never stop being amazed by and I consider it a real privilege to be the person to make a difference to that particular horse. It never gets old.

My staff is heavily invested in this process.

These horses are afforded the exact same care as a classic contender. There is no scrimping on care, equipment, or supplies, and I think everyone here feels a sense of pride and responsibility to be able to pay it forward to the horses who have provided all of us with a rewarding life and career. We consistently follow up on the outcomes for these horses and share pictures and updates of their lives and exploits. It is immensely rewarding to all of us and often very touching to see such wonderful outcomes.

I can't express how touching it was to see Foliage, Jack a Rose, and Shaky Pants all end up together in the same paddock at Old Friends. My staff and I had tears in our eyes seeing the videos of them running and playing together – all of them sound and happy.

It really is a wonderful example of what can be done when people who love horses – the owners, trainers, grooms, veterinarians, shippers, aftercare groups, you name it – all come together and pay it forward for the horses who make our sport go round.

Nothing happens by accident

Old Friends reunites a man with his ancestors

In April 2024, Hillcrest Farm in Georgetown, Ky., became the newest member of the Old Friends family, with the completion of its purchase from the Bluegrass Land Conservancy. The history of the land dates to the 1700s, when two families arrived in Central Kentucky with Thoroughbred horses and a dream. Hillcrest is located literally across the street from the Old Friends satellite farm facility at Ashton Grove Senior Living. The 50-plus retired Thoroughbreds living at both farms are under the care farm manager Marisa Miller. This is the story of lessons in history, a cemetery, and a man named Frank Downing, an Ashton Grove resident who, in a remarkable twist of fate, discovered a previously unknown personal connection to Hillcrest.

This article was originally published in the November 15, 2024, edition of the Georgetown News-Graphic.

Frank Downing Sr., an Ashton Grove Senior Living resident, learned in October that he has been living next to an ancestral homestead through the Old Friends purchase of land right next door.

Downing, who retired in Owen County, Ky., near the state capital of Frankfort after a career in developing electric infrastructure across the state, moved to Scott County by chance, he said. He settled at Ashton Grove upon a recommendation from his three children after his wife had passed away.

"We retired there in Owenton. and after [my wife's] passing, I got to the position that I needed extra help," Downing said. "I told my children, 'You all find a place, and I'll be satisfied.'

Old Friends purchased the Hillcrest property, next to Ashton Grove, and began clearing it,

which included a historic family cemetery with the Downing name on several of the headstones. Among the interred are Francis, Henrietta (Viley), and John and Elizabeth (Roberts), whom local historian Ann Bolton Bevins traced in "Real Country Volume IV" as the builders of the homestead. The house was originally named Alta Mont, and later given its current name of Hillcrest Farm, with the Downing family retaining ownership for over 80 years.

"The farm's heritage traces to John and Elizabeth Downing. who purchased part of the large estate of the late Colonel Robert Saunders in 1816," Bevins wrote. "Alta Mont continued as the home of the original owners' family until 1898."

Bey Passerello, Old Friends board member and Ashton Grove resident, knew Downing was living there in the facility. Downing regularly gives a "history lesson" over dinner. Passerello connected Downing to Old Friends.

"I knew about the cemetery,"

Passerello said. "I knew Frank. Frank and his family had no clue that this cemetery existed or that their family were buried up there starting in the 1700s."

Though his first reaction to the news was surprise, Downing tried to historically visualize the era when his family arrived in Scott County.

"The property here, you try to visualize Daniel Boone in Boonesborough in 1775, and Francis Downing came to [Kentucky] in 1795," Downing said. "It's really awakened me to everything. Looking at the countryside here, I was impressed that Francis selected such pretty country as his home spot, and I wonder what brought him in."

The family was "amazed," said Downing's daughter Sue Downing Wingate, to learn of this piece of their story.

"[Downing] obviously knows a lot of family history, but had no idea that this was up here," Wingate said. "It's amazing. It's just fascinating. Everybody, I don't care if you're famous or not, has a unique story.'

Now that the family is aware of the cemetery and familiarized with the relatives buried there, they want to follow the "paperwork" to figure out exactly what their history was, Downing said.

"It's paperwork at this point to try to tie things together," he said. "It appears that there were three different Francis Downings, and we're trying to decipher from those three which one exactly we came from. Finding the history opened whole new doors as far as our family genealogy is concerned."

Old Friends and Ashton Grove have a symbiotic relationship that allows "old horses and old people" to help each other, said Old Friends board of directors secretary Barbara Fossum.

"Our main farm is over on Paynes Depot, but we have a division here," Fossum said. "Our founder, Michael Blowen, who stepped down as president in 2024, always envisioned it's a perfect match, old horses and old people. good for each other."

The intent of the land purchase

was to create a similar "enhancement" dynamic for the retired horses and residents of the area," Old Friends President John Nicholson said.

"It surrounds people, it makes the horse's lives better and the people's lives better," Nicholson said. "We're hoping to have some type of replication of that at Hillcrest Farm...a living environment for people that interacts very, very neatly and aesthetically beautifully with the horse farm."

Downing, a strong proponent of education – academic and vocational alike – also worked for the University of Kentucky's Extension Service, served on the alumni board, and hired students for the co-op who looked ahead as best they could, he said.

"That was always a part of the questioning from me to those prospective employees: 'What's your education background? And What's your desire for the future?' Downing said. "Try to look

ahead as best you can and what's it going to take to get there."

Owen County Chamber of Commerce awards annual scholarships named for Downing to "individuals who show outstanding leadership skills" who are pursuing post-secondary education at an academic college or university or a trade or vocational school, according to the chamber's website.

"They came up with the idea of the scholarships, and that really fits well in everything I've tried to do, and that suits me fine," Downing said. "That's been going on since then, 20 odd years ago now."

Downing values not only looking forward but also understanding the importance of looking back from where Kentucky has come, he said. The discovery of the cemetery was personally meaningful to him, but it was also a major discovery for the state.

"That's a very historic point, not only for the family but as far as the terrain is concerned and the history of Kentucky and so forth, it's very important."

Hillcrest Farm has a significant arboreal history, too, as it is home to a gingko tree that Ashland Community and Technical College dated to the original gingkoes that Henry Clay brought to the state, said Passerello.

"We know this is part of the original Henry Clay trees – we don't know if it's one of the originals or whether it is a seed," she said, "but Ashland does tell us that it's a part of it. It's at least 200 years old."

Concerning the gingko, the homestead, and the cemetery, Downing praised Old Friends for its preservation of and care for the property.

"I told Bev that I was very pleased with all the upkeep they had on the property and all up there," he said.

According to Passerello, Ashton Grove farm manager Marisa Miller participated in the upkeep once the property was acquired, and she also spearheaded the research into the history of the cemetery, to present to Downing upon his first look.

"[Marisa] has a personal interest in this cemetery and was one of them up here with a weed eater cleaning it up," Passerello said. "Marisa's been part of the team that has come up here and is working to restore this cemetery and bring it back."

This "perfect storm," as Passerello dubbed it, formed as a result of the desire to care for retired horses and gifted the retired Downing and his family with connections to the past that they didn't have prior.

"Too many things had to come together, had to combine to get us all up here," Passerello said. "It's such a remarkable story."

"Nothing happens by accident," said Nicholson. "The common denominator is the horses. The horses keep doing things for us, keep bringing us together. It's magical."



The long way home

On December 7, 2023, when Noble Indy stepped off a horse van in Georgetown, Ky., it marked the conclusion of a long odyssey from Puerto Rico to his native state of Kentucky, and the beginning of retired life at his forever home, Old Friends. Along the way, the now-10-year-old bay gelding benefited from generous people who stepped up to help him, including:

- Fred Hart, owner of Noble Indy's dam, Noble Maz
- · Kelley Stobie, co-founder and executive director of Caribbean Thoroughbred Aftercare (CTA), an accredited aftercare facility in Puerto Rico that offers assistance to horses
- One of the racing industry's leading owners, Mike Repole, who was Noble Indy's owner when he won the 2018 Louisiana Derby
- Noble Indy's breeder, WinStar Farm

Noble Indy, a son of Take Charge Indy trained by Todd Pletcher, scored his first and only stakes victory in taking the Grade 2 Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds in March 2018. The win punched his ticked to the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, in which he finished 17th. The once-promising runner was never able to recapture his stakes form and he began to drop down the racing ranks.

Noble Indy won one race each year from 2019 through 2021. He was claimed in his first start in 2022, at age 7, and changed ownership again soon thereafter. That owner wound up shipping Noble Indy to Puerto Rico to race. However, in five starts at Camarero Race Track in 2022 and 2023, he failed to win and earned a meager \$4,550 in those

It was around this time that Hart got involved and wanted to retire Noble Indy. In a conversation with Thoroughbred Daily News, Hart said, "I became sentimentally attached to this horse and was afraid harm would come

to him if he stayed in Puerto Rico. I just wanted to get him out of there."

Hart contacted Stobie, and the two worked together to try and retire the horse. The main challenge was the high price that the owner, Skull Stable PR, was asking, until an injury to Noble Indy resulted in a lower price. In early November 2023, CTA completed the purchase, and Noble Indy was retired and sent to Stobie's facility.

"It was a tense time since Indy came to Puerto Rico, not knowing if we would be able to get him off the island in one piece," Stobie said. "Thankfully, his surgery . . . did not go as planned, so he could no longer race and the owner agreed to retire him to CTA."

Noble Indy arrived at Stobie's farm on November 7, 2023, "pushy, nipping and kicking, full of joy. Just within the first two days he has been here, he is already more relaxed and trusting."

While with Stobie, Noble Indy had visits from a farrier, an equine dentist, and he saw a veterinarian for vaccinations and blood tests to verify he was negative for piroplasmosis, an endemic tick disease prevalent in the Caribbean. When all was completed, Noble Indy was cleared to start the long journey to retirement. A seven-day USDA quarantine was followed by a flight to Miami, a van ride to a lavover facility in Ocala, Fla., and then the final of leg of Noble Indy's journey to a lifetime retirement at Old Friends.

Stobie is quick to offer thanks to all of those who helped.

"We are grateful to Repole Stables for their generous donation, which not only helped Noble Indy, but paid for two other horses in need to get home. Also, thanks to WinStar Farm for stepping up and sending a donation."

"We are all very excited that Noble Indy will spend the rest of his life at Old Friends in Kentucky," Repole said. "This was an amazing team effort by so many to bring Noble Indy back from Puerto Rico and to give him the great retirement that he deserves.'

Said Michael Blowen, "Thanks to everyone who worked so hard to allow us to enjoy Noble Indy's retirement. His story makes him a magnet for racing fans. Come visit!"

McCraken's homebred journey

In the early days of Old Friends, Michael Blowen sought advice from former Kentucky Gov. Brereton C. Jones, owner of Airdrie Stud. Jones shared his wisdom, lent early financial support, and would later send Airdrie stallions Afternoon Deelites, You and I, and Patton to retirement at Old Friends. In 2024, we were pleased to again partner with Airdrie, now led by Jones's son Bret, as we welcomed their former stallion McCraken to the farm. Old Friends.

McCraken was bred and raced by some of the finest people in Thoroughbred racing. Janis Whitham and her family's Whitham Thoroughbreds have been successfully developing their broodmare band through their breed-to-race operation for nearly 50 years and also have raced two-time champion older mare Bayakoa.

The Whithams do things the right way, and their successes and longevity in a difficult business are testimony to their methods. Their homebred McCraken was a wonderful horse for them, and he took their family where every breeder dreams of going – the Kentucky Derby.

Trained by Ian Wilkes, McCraken, a son of Ghostzapper, became one of the most talked about horses of his generation by beginning his career as an undefeated, graded stakes-winning 2-year-old, emphatically punctuating his juvenile campaign with a stylish victory in Churchill Downs's Grade 2 Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes in 2016, his third win in as many starts.

In his first start at 3, McCraken cemented his reputation as one of the East Coast's best prospects for the 2017 Triple Crown season with an impressive score in Tampa Bay's Grade 3 Sam F. Davis Stakes. In his next start, in Keeneland's marquee event, the Grade 2 Blue Grass Stakes, he was sent off as the 8-5 favorite, though he would suffer his first career defeat, finishing a third. That set him up for his start in the Kentucky Derby.

While McCraken could only finish eighth in the Derby, behind winner Always Dreaming, the build-up to the world's most famous race was one of the great highlights of the Whitham family's hugely successful involvement in racing. I recently spoke to Janis's son Clay, who credits that Derby with bringing the

whole family together and helping to inspire another generation of Whithams to fall in love with our great sport.

The charismatic McCraken would go on to add an impressive win that summer in the Grade 3 Matt Winn Stakes at Churchill before finishing second, beaten just a nose, in the Grade 1 Haskell Stakes at Monmouth Park. He was retired after his 4-year-old season with career earnings of \$869,728.

While his promising stallion career was derailed at the outset by fertility issues that kept him from receiving the opportunity he deserved, it brings both the Whitham family and our Airdrie Stud team great joy in knowing that McCraken will continue to be a fan favorite in his incredible forever home at Old Friends, the Kentucky Derby of retirement farms.

Saying goodbye

As happens every year, in 2024 Old Friends lost a number of beloved members of its equine family - 18 of them. The most recent group included graded stakes winners, classic contenders, stakes producers, successful sires, expensive one-time yearlings, horses of royal pedigree and those without a stitch of black type, an accomplished eventer, and hard-knocking career claimers. They ranged in age from 5 to 31. A few had not been here long, others for what seemed like forever, including one resident of 24 years. Each goodbye is hard, but let us acknowledge their lives as they deserve to be remembered.

Alotofloot

Dk. b. or br., g., 2001, by Demaloot Demashoot—Z. Shy Spirit, by Ziad

Alotofloot was by an oddly named albeit fast racehorse, Demaloot Demashoot, out of a hickory tough claimer, and his extended female line carried no black type for more than 70 years. Though not as tough as his sire and dam, who had combined for 75 starts, Alotofloot managed to keep up the distaff tradition of earning no black type. The highlight of his seven-race career came when he won his maiden in his racing debut at age 4. The following year, he won a \$10,000 claimer at Mountaineer Park, and that was it. The Florida-bred came to Old Friends in 2021. He may not have been one of our better-known residents, but we loved having him here for three good years.

Even the Score

Gr. or ro., h., 1998, by Unbridled's Song—Ashtabula, by Rahy

Even as he crossed into old age, Even the Score was a distinctive fellow, with his snowflake white coat, dignified bearing, and sweet nature. On paper, his bloodlines were hard to argue with, being by a leading sire and

out of a stakes-winning mare. On the track two decades ago, Even the Score defined versatility and class - winning from 6 1/2 furlongs to 11/8 miles, on dirt and grass, all over America, including twice in Grade 2 stakes races. Even the Score retired to stud in 2005 at Ro Parra's Millennium Farm in Kentucky, standing 15 seasons and siring 22 stakes winners, including Grade 1 winner Dullahan. Pensioned four years ago, he arrived at Old Friends, largely through the efforts of Morgan Kei, who had worked with him at Millennium. The accomplished racehorse and sire was lost to us in January 2024 due to complications from colic.

Gold Round (Ire)

B., m., 1997, by Caerleon—Born Gold, by Blushing Groom (Fr)

Gold Round was an exemplary racehorse and broodmare. The Irish-bred was out of a half-sister to three-time Breeders' Cup Mile (G1) winner

Goldikova and had herself defeated future Breeders' Cup winner Starine in the 1999 Prix des Sablonnets in France. The following year, she would add a victory in the Prix Cleopatre (Fr-G3) to her résumé. Gold Round's career stalled beyond that, and she was retired by the Wertheimer family, who had bred and raced her. As a producer, Gold Round proved gold, indeed, producing five stakes winners (three group/ graded class), along with a trio of stakes-placed runners, first for the Wertheimers and later for Foxwoods, who bought her at auction for \$672,000. Months after producing her last foal in 2020, Gold Round came to Old Friends as part of an LNJ Foxwoods contingent of older mares. Here, last August, she stood loyally at the side of her best friend Hi Dubai as she passed into the next realm. Twenty-seven-year-old Gold Round followed her in death four months later due to colic.

Handy Stan

Dk. b. or br., g., 2020, by Stanislavsky— Many Talents, by Minardi

Old Friends at Cabin Creek in New York said goodbye to its popular resident Handy Stan, when he passed away at age 14. The New York-bred gelding did not make his first start until late at age 3, then campaigned mostly in mid-level claiming company at major New York racetracks. He proved consistent at that level and at six furlongs, never finishing worse than third in eight starts. In his third outing, he was claimed for \$25,000 by trainer Thomas Morley and Robert Murphy, for whom he scored all three of his victories and more than tripled the return on their investment. He later was retrained for a second career before being pensioned in 2022 to Cabin Creek, where the handsome bay was a favorite.

Hap

Ch., h., 1996, by Theatrical (Ire)—Committed, by Hagley

The highs and lows of Hap's life reads like a fairy tale in reverse. By and out of a king and queen of the turf, the flashy chestnut with the broadly blazed face was a beautiful, high-headed runner who became a multiple graded stakes winner for owner Allen Paulson, earning \$1.3 million and defeating global champions and Grade/Group 1 winners. When an injury ended his career, the son of Theatrical entered stud at a major Kentucky farm. Interest in the grass specialist, however, soon waned. By 2008, his book had run dry. Hap was sold at auction that winter for \$7,300 and sent to Indiana, where several years later the once-magnificent stallion was discovered malnourished and near death. Hap's rescue was a group effort led by veterinarian Ken Kimmick, retired truck driver Richard Anderson, and Paulson's widow Madeleine Pickens. In 2016, Hap arrived here to spend the last eight years

of his life being loved and cared for – a cherished member of our community.

Hi Dubai

Ch., m., 2000, by Rahy—Jood, by Niiinsky II

In 2020, several aging mares owned by the Roth family's LNJ Foxwoods came to Old Friends to live in a paddock their owners had built specifically for them. Four years later, we lost two of those Old girlFriends, with the passings of Gold Round and Hi Dubai. Hi Dubai was one of 96 stakes winners sired by Rahy and was herself a sister to European champion Fantastic Light. She was a good but lightly raced runner for Godolphin, winning her maiden in the listed Pretty Polly Stakes in England, then finishing a close fifth in the 2003 Epsom Oaks (Eng-G1). Later sold for \$320,000 to LNJ Foxwoods, Hi Dubai produced some winners, but nothing reflecting herself. At age 24, she passed on in her paddock, with Gold Round standing protectively at her side.

lde

Ch. h., 1993, by Forty Niner—Maytide, by Naskra

Old Friends bid farewell to one of its oldest ambassadors on June 8, when 31-year-old Ide succumbed to colic. His loss was a tough one. The charismatic son of Forty Niner had long occupied a marquee paddock at the top of the main road. He was gentle, friendly, and always up for a carrot . . . or two. And in his final years, Ide was noted for lovingly adopting Alphabet Soup's bereaved paddock mate - mini donkey Gorgeous George - after the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner's 2022 passing. The muscular, unabashedly gorgeous chestnut stallion with the meandering blaze had been a classic prospect in 1996, and a winner in seven of nine starts (including four Grade 3 stakes) before an injury that spring sent him into retirement. Ide stood initially in Kentucky and later in Louisiana, where he was a perennially leading sire. As Michael Blowen put it, "Ide was as kind as any Thoroughbred

at Old Friends. Even though he lived a long, full life, it wasn't long enough."

Interwin (Aus)

Ch., g., 1998, by Interstellar—Winter Rain, by Sir Tristram

Interwin wasn't much of a racehorse . . . in fact, he was a disaster. The gangly Australian-bred struggled in his only three career starts, beaten a combined 67 lengths, and never earned a penny. Nevertheless, Interwin was an athlete of a very high order. Post-racing he went on to become an elite five-star eventing horse, ridden by an Australian Olympic coach. In 2010, Interwin came to the U.S., where he competed bicoastally until retired at 16 to become a lesson horse. The chestnut gelding was pensioned to Old Friends in 2016, where his first companion was another newbie named Little Mike. Later, Interwin was placed in a paddock with Grade 1-winning millionaires Affirmed Success and Kudos. For some time, Interwin struggled with the neurological condition EPM, which got progressively worse, until his death in September 2024.

Presidential Fling

Dk. b. or br., g., 1997, by Wallenda—Rare Fling. by Kris S.

Presidential Fling was special to Old Friends, in part because his sire, Wallenda, was one of our all-time favorite residents. Father and son overlapped in residency here for two years, before his sire, a Grade 1-winning millionaire, died in 2016. Though a dark bay like his sire, Presidential Fling wasn't cut from the same racing cloth. Gelded early, he ran through age 7, won five of 30 starts, and earned \$80,535. He spent 10 years at Old Friends before we lost him in 2024.

Riva Way

Ch., g., 1998, by Tinners Way—Yia Yia, by Riva Ridge

Like Presidential Fling, Riva Way was by a long-time Old Friends alum, Tinners Way, a Grade 1 winner and the last living son of Secretariat. Riva Way was a bright chestnut in the mold of his sire. Though plagued with injuries, the career claimer was honest and hard-trying, with 11 victories over middle distances and earnings of \$109,915 over five seasons. Upon his retirement, he was acquired by Old Friends's May

de Rosa and sent here in 2005, thus becoming one of our longest residents. Riva Way was not a big name, but he was lovingly described as a "big sweetheart."

Setna the Wise

Gr. or ro., g., 2019, by Cairo Prince— Smart 'n Special, by Smart Strike

The youngest resident lost in 2024 was 5-year-old Setna the Wise, who was claimed by colic. The handsome, dappled gray sold for \$47,000 as yearling but clearly had developed into something quite special by the following April, when NBS Stable bought him at a juvenile sale in Florida for \$335,000, more than triple the sale average. Sadly, Setna's story would be one of promise unfulfilled. He did not race until 3, when he won his debut at Fair Grounds. In seven subsequent starts, he never again found the winner's circle, though he did manage a third-place finish in the \$150,000 Caesars Stakes at Indiana Downs. In 2023, Setna came to Old Friends, where he happily resided with friends in Paddock 32.

Sharoan

Dr. b. or br., m., 1995, by Salt Lake— Pretendyouraduck, by Quack

Sharoan was one of five Old girlFriends lost this past year, and one of the farm's older citizens at 29. She was by the accomplished racehorse and sire Salt Lake and out of a daughter of a world-record setter. But Sharoan's light didn't shine brightly on the racetrack. After two unplaced starts, she was sent to the breeding shed, where she produced five winners and a minor stakes-placed runner before making Old Friends her final home in 2017.

Smokey Stover

Dk. b. or br., g., 2003, by Put It Back—Milady's Halo, by Jolie's Halo

Twenty years ago, Smokey Stover reigned as one of America's best sprinters. The nearly black gelding, who would later – and quite accurately – be described as "tall, dark, and handsome," ran just as good as he looked for trainer Greg Gilchrist and owner Harry Aleo. A multiple graded stakes winner of \$568,725, Smokey routinely shaded 1:09 for six furlongs, finished out of the top three just once in 14 starts, and won in stakes company from New Jersey to California. Upon his retirement in 2008, this superb athlete was retrained as a showjumper. After a decade in the show ring, Smokey Stover was pensioned to his forever home at Old Friends. He eventually ended up at the nearby Ashton Grove annex facility, where residents at the senior living center could come by and admire him. It is there that he died in November 2024.

Spensive

Gr. or ro., h., 2000, by Ponche—Operate Quick, by Dr. Schwartzman

Though not famous on the track, Spensive was rock-solid, a California stakes winner trained by Bob Baffert. The Florida-bred didn't have a great pedigree, but the fact that he brought \$125,000 at a 2-year-olds in training sale


that averaged \$22,700 indicates he had potential. He did show promise early, winning the 2002 Gold Rush Stakes and defeating

future Santa Anita Derby (G1) winner Buddy Gil in the process. But by age 5, Spensive had lost a step, and Baffert dropped him into a \$50,000 claiming race. .. and lost him. With his best days in the rear-view mirror, he retired to stud in his birth state, where he was lightly used. He sired a handful of winners, but more importantly, several of his offspring were gray beauties who went on to successful show careers. Old Friends became Spensive's final home, where over time his once-gray coat became white. He gleamed like a diamond in a grassy paddock, and he and Silver Charm were at times referred to as doppelgangers. He lost his life after suffering a pelvic fracture slipping on an ice patch last winter.

Stretchinthelimits

B., m., 2006, by In Excess (Ire)—Star Stretcher, by Judge T C

Stretchinthelimits wasn't a stakes winner, but neverthe-



less displayed talent in a brief career for trainer Mike Mitchell and Vessels Stallion Farm. The daughter of leading California sire In Excess won three of her first four starts in the big leagues of Hollywood Park and Santa Anita. As a broodmare prospect, Stretchinthelimits was bred exclusively to Grade 1 winner Square Eddie, a union that produced seven foals and a minor stakes winner. Stretchinthelimits came here early in 2024 and, sadly, we lost her less than a year later.

Unaccountable

Dk. b. or b.. a.. 2005. by Fusaichi Pegasus—Admirer, by Private Terms

Unaccountable was one of those quiet warriors who through history have formed the backbone of racing. A hardtrying, competitive runner. he lasted seven seasons on the track, started 48 times, and earned \$298,860. The gelded son of Kentucky Derby winner

Fusaichi Pegasus scored nine of his 13 victories at middle distances on grass at tracks such as Belmont Park and Saratoga, mostly for trainer Chad Brown and owners Gary and Mary West. After being claimed midcareer, age eventually took its toll. By 9, he was still winning, but in \$4,000 claiming company at Suffolk Downs. Upon retirement, Unaccountable came to Old Friends, where he spent the last 10 years in comfort, living the good life he had so well earned.

With This Ring

Ch., m., 1993, by Green Dancer-Wedding Picture, by Blushing Groom (Fr)

The late Josephine Abercrombie loved horses and was especially passionate about good aftercare. To that end, her Pin Oak Foundation contributed much toward building Old Friends's new state-of-the-art visitors center, which bears her name. Another contribution, a

bit more personal, was that of a much-loved mare that Abercrombie had raised, raced, and cared for into advanced age. The horsewoman and philanthropist had bred or campaigned nearly 100 stakes winners. With This Ring, was not one of them. Although genetically bred to be a good one, no one gave her the memo. Her personal best was a third-place finish in five starts. She later proved a much better broodmare for Abercrombie, producing seven winners and a graded stakes winner. Sadly, we lost With This Ring to colic in 2024 at age 31. She wasn't with us long, but it was fitting that Abercrombie's homebred spent her final days here as an Old girlFriend.

Yahoo

Last, alphabetically, but not least, was Yahoo the goat. Anyone who toured Old Friends this past decade would be familiar with Eldaafer's unorthodox

paddock pals - Google and Yahoo. Though Google left us a while ago, Yahoo continued on as a cherished mainstay. Yahoo and Google were racetrack companions for the 2010 Breeders' Cup Marathon winner Eldaafer, who seemed convinced he needed them nearby, and they reciprocated that sentiment. When the gelding retired in 2014, he was transferred to a new life at Old Friends. He would not go alone. Eventually, a custom goat "house" was built in the run-in shed to protect them from prowling coyotes. And a mesh fence was set up to ensure they wouldn't wriggle out and create mayhem around the farm. Yahoo was a striking girl, shining white, with black points around her face and neck. And she was sweet and mild-mannered. By some estimates there are 100 million goats in the world. How we ended up with the best one, we'll never know.

Count Again

Count Again didn't start his racing career until the age of four, but that didn't stop "The Count" from becoming a sensational racehorse. Count Again won five Graded Stakes races to include two Grade 1's and Count ended his racing career with over \$1M in earnings in just 19 starts!

Campaigned by Agave Racing Stable and Sam-Son Farm, Count Again was conditioned by trainer Phil D'Amato for the better part of his career. The ownership partners would like to thank Phil and his team for the quality of care they provided to all of our horses over the years.



Alpha

In his prime, Alpha was an invaluable member of the stable for his owner-breeder. By a champion, out of a stakes-winning multiple stakes producer by Nijinsky II, Alpha hailed from a family packed with quality black type. Darley must have had the American classics in mind while planning the 2008 mating of Bernardini and Munnaya that produced him. He arrived on March 11, 2009, in a compact but elegant physical package to match his royal lineage.

For Godolphin and trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, the attractive bay colt displayed promise enough at 2 to earn a top-25 ranking on the Experimental Free Handicap. But the spring classic dreams of his owner didn't quite pan out. In the 2012 Kentucky Derby, Alpha broke poorly and ran six wide before finishing 12th behind winner I'll Have Another.

Redemption came with a vengeance that summer, when he scored back-to-back victories in Saratoga's Grade 2 Jim Dandy Stakes and Grade 1 Travers Stakes, the latter in a dead heat with Golden Ticket, representing the midsummer classic's first dead heat since 1874. At 4, Alpha scored a front-running victory in the Grade 1 Woodward at his favorite track – Saratoga – and retired late the following year with earnings approaching \$2 million.

The multiple Grade 1 winner was sent to Sequel Stallions in New York, where he would eventually sire a trio of statebred stakes winners. Exported to Brazil in 2019, his best there was the 2023 Group 1 Brazilian Derby winner Cold Heart, Pensioned from stud duty in Brazil after the 2023 breeding season, arrangements were made to send the then-14-year-old stallion to Old Friends, where he arrived on Dec. 8, 2023.

Michael says: For those needing good news in racing, Alpha is at the top. When his stallion career was completed in Brazil, Dan Pride of Darley America and Godolphin called and said His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum wanted to bring him back to a good home and thought Old Friends would be a suitable spot. We were overjoyed. Alpha got an all-expenses paid return trip and, after a series of quality checks at Darley, was delivered to us with a sizable endowment. He's big, bossy, and willful, and his many fans adore him.

While Alpha was small in stature, he was big in heart. He was a Saratoga specialist, winning multiple graded races there during his career. He became the second Travers winner for our stable, with his sire, Bernardini, being the first. But it's also special being able to facilitate his return to Kentucky and Old Friends. We appreciate all that Michael and his team do to care for these retired Thoroughbreds and hope that visitors to Old Friends will enjoy seeing him there for years to come.

Any Given Saturday



Any Given Saturday was an extraordinary racehorse in 2007, and he was bred to be so. One of more than 180 stakes winners by Distorted Humor and out of a stakes-producing A.P. Indy mare, he was bought as a yearling by WinStar Farm for \$1.1 million at the Keeneland September sale. The handsome bay eventually won 6 of 11 starts for trainer Todd Pletcher and banked \$1,083,533.

He was his best at 3, finishing third to Nobiz Like Shobiz (another Old Friends pensioner) in the Grade 1 Wood Memorial Stakes before a dull eighth-place effort in the Kentucky Derby. But during the 10-week period between July 4 and Sept. 22, Any Given Saturday caught fire, capturing three major stakes in emphatic fashion. In the Grade 2 Dwyer Stakes at Belmont Park, he turned the tables on Nobiz Like Shobiz to win by four lengths; a month later, he took the Grade 1 Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park over Hard Spun and champion Curlin; and finally, he ran off with the historic Grade 2 Brooklyn Handicap at Belmont in September.

Any Given Saturday retired in 2008 to Jonabell near Lexington, at a \$40,000 fee, and shuttled from Kentucky to Australia before landing in Pennsylvania for 2014. Though he was siring some decent runners, the decision was made to sell him to Korean interests. Of course, the best of Any Given Saturday's 27 stakes winners hit the track following his exportation, in the form of Hoppertunity, a Grade 1 winner of \$4.7 million, and 2015 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint victor Mongolian Saturday.

After nine South Korean seasons, Any Given Saturday was happily repatriated to the United States, arriving at Old Friends on March 6, 2023.

Michael says: Anyone who was privileged enough to see Any Given Saturday's overwhelming victory in the 2007 Grade 1 Haskell had to be impressed. Ridden by Garrett Gomez and trained by Todd Pletcher, the great son of Distorted Humor and Weekend in Indy, obliterated Hard Spun and Curlin. A few days later, owners WinStar and Satish Sanan sold him to Godolphin. His career as a stallion ended up in Korea. When that was finished in 2022, we contacted Jun Park, the American representative of the Korea Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, and he arranged for Any Given Saturday to return to the United States and to Old Friends. Late in 2023, his Korean caretakers came to visit him, and everyone seemed very happy. Especially me.

Big Brown

Big Brown delivered. Like the UPS package service he was named for, Big Brown was reliable, steady, and always delivered on schedule – with one very notable exception.

A bay son of Boundary trained by Rick Dutrow, Big Brown burst onto the racing scene in spectacular fashion in 2007, winning his juvenile debut at Saratoga by 11 lengths at 1 1/16 miles on turf. That was a pretty accurate preview of what was to come.

After a six-month layoff, he made his first start as a 3-year-old at Gulfstream Park going a mile on dirt and won off by nearly 13 lengths. He followed that up three weeks later with a five-length score in the Grade 1 Florida Derby.

That handed the unbeaten colt the role as favorite for the 2008 Kentucky Derby, in which he dutifully turned in a 43/4-length victory while becoming the first ever to win the roses from the far outside 20 post.

In the Preakness, he won by $5\,1/4$ lengths under wraps, looking every bit as if he would become the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978. It was not to be. Plagued by hoof problems and racing with an acrylic patch in the Belmont Stakes, Big Brown was rank early, ran into traffic problems, bumped at least one rival, and eventually dropped out of contention, with jockey Kent Desormeaux easing him. He was officially listed in the race chart as "distanced."

Big Brown went on to win his last two starts that summer before being retired. As a 3-year-old, other than in the Belmont, he recorded triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures in every race. At stud in Kentucky, before being later relocated to New York, Big Brown sired Grade 1 Santa Anita Derby winner and \$1.9 million earner Dortmund, among the best of his 38 stakes winners. After his stallion career ended, he arrived at Old Friends in September 2024.

He was like a puppy and especially loved it when the young children would come over to pet him. As sweet as he was, when he got on the racetrack, he knew it was time to go to work. I remember after his race at Gulfstream Park, (jockey) Kent Desormeaux said he was the fastest horse he'd ever ridden, and the rest is history. After visiting Old Friends and getting to know John Nicholson and Michael Blowen, I couldn't be more comfortable knowing Big Brown will get the love and care he deserves at Old Friends, where the horse is the boss.

Birdstone

In the spring of 2004, a plain bay colt with not a white hair on him became the horse America loved to hate. Barely 15 hands and 900 pounds at the time, the late Marylou Whitney's homebred Birdstone shocked a roaring crowd into silence when, at 36-1, he ran down heavily favored Smarty Jones in the Belmont Stakes to deny him a Triple Crown sweep. Moments later in the winner's circle, trainer Nick Zito and jockey Edgar Prado found themselves in an unusual place – apologizing for their victory and ending Smarty's bid for destiny.

Despite that moment of infamy, Birdstone was a good one in every sense. The son of 1996 Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone and future Broodmare of the Year Dear Birdie snagged the 2003 Champagne Stakes (G1) and 2004 Travers (G1) in additional to that memorable Belmont, and banked \$1,575,600 before a bone chip stopped him after his ninth start.

At Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Ky., Birdstone's initial \$10,000 fee looked like an absolute steal when his first crop reached the races and included 2009 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Mine That Bird, 2009 Eclipse Award 3-year-old male champion and Belmont Stakes winner Summer Bird, and three additional North American graded stakes winners.

Birdstone never replicated that gangbuster debut crop but became a useful sire whose offspring have since earned some \$30 million. The sweet-natured stallion was pensioned to Old Friends in August of 2020.

Like evervone else in America. I was desperately hoping that Smarty Jones would win the 2004 Belmont to win the Triple Crown. Additionally, Stewart Elliott, his jockey, came up, like I did, through the claiming ranks at Suffolk Downs. But it wasn't to be. A son of Grindstone came hurtling down the long Belmont stretch, passing Smarty and sucking every last bit of air from the Belmont grandstand. His owner, the eternally classy Marylou Whitney, was apologetic in the post-winner's circle interview. But she had nothing to be sorry about. Birdstone would go on to win the Travers, confirming his competitive greatness. After he was winding down his post-racing career, I started to make inquiries about possibly retiring him to Old Friends. I even had the audacity to drop a subtle hint to John Hendrickson and Mrs. Whitney the last time I saw them at an event at the Hall of Fame. Enter the Passarellos. Jon and Bev are longtime breeders with strong connections to Gainesway and Neil Howard. When I inquired about Birdstone's diminishing stallion career, Bev went to work, extolling the virtues of retiring a stallion to Old Friends. Buoyed by her gritty enthusiasm. I sent a note to Mr. Hendrickson. Within a few months, Birdstone arrived at Old Friends. A few weeks after his arrival, we were contacted by a very nice woman from Cady Hill, the estate in Saratoga Springs. She explained how happy John Hendrickson was with his decision to send Birdstone to Old Friends. He couldn't be as happy as we are to have Birdstone. And, to make it even better, he's our vet's - Dr. Bryan Waldridge-favorite horse, and he is supported by a very generous stipend.

Bird Town

Bird Town is a living testament to the potency of the power-packed breeding program built by C.V. Whitney in the past century. The daughter of Cape Town and Dear Birdie hails from a Whitney female family that goes back four generations, into the 1950s.

C.V. bred 176 stakes winners before his passing in 1992, after which his widow, Marylou Whitney, very capably took over the racing and breeding operations. In the 2000 filly Bird Town, she turned out yet another stakes winner from the distaff line that had included her late husband's classy, distance-loving turf mare Hush Dear.

Bird Town, trained by Nick Zito, reached the races in the fall of her juvenile season in 2002 and won once in four starts. Like many Whitney runners, she improved with age and distance. At 3, the bay filly blossomed into a champion, winning three of eight starts and finishing second four times. Her victories included the Grade 1 Kentucky Oaks and Grade 1 Acorn Stakes.

She retired to the breeding shed in 2004, the year her half-brother, Birdstone, also bred and raced by Marylou Whitney, won the Belmont Stakes and denied Smarty Jones a Triple Crown sweep. Their dam, Dear Birdie, was subsequently named Broodmare of the Year by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders for her remarkable record of producing back-to-back American classic

As a member of the Whitney broodmare band, Bird Town produced graded stakes winner Bird Song among her 12 named foals. After that busy breeding schedule, Bird Town was pensioned in 2020. She arrived at Old Friends in 2024, where she joined her classic-winning brother. Bird Town is the first Kentucky Oaks winner retired to Old Friends.

John says: Under any circumstances, Old Friends would be honored to welcome Bird Town. The fact that she comes to us from the Marylou Whitney Stables means that her arrival carries an even deeper meaning for us. We were so saddened by the recent unexpected passing of John Hendrickson. He and his wife, Marylou Whitney, were not only towering figures in Thoroughbred racing, they were stalwart supporters of Thoroughbred aftercare in general and Old Friends in particular. The presence of Bird Town, along with her half-brother, Old Friends resident Birdstone, will always serve as a reminder of John Hendrickson and Marylou Whitney's prescient leadership of our industry, their dedication to their horses, and their commitment to Thoroughbred aftercare.

Bred and owned by Marylou Whitney, Bird Town's biggest win came in the 2003 Kentucky Oaks (G1), where, remarkably, she stumbled coming out of the gate, and then rallied from nextto-last to finish a 3 1/4-length winner. The win gave her Hall of Fame trainer, Nick Zito, his first Oaks victory, Bird Town's other top wins included the Acorn Stakes (G1) and Charon Stakes, also in 2003. That year, she was second in the Beldame Stakes (G1), Test Stakes (G1), and Beaumont Stakes (G2), For her efforts, she won the Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old filly. Bird Town went on to a broodmare career at Marylou Whitney Stables, producing 12 named foals, including graded stakes winner Bird Song. She was subsequently pensioned from her broodmare duties, and arrived at Old Friends in December of 2024, joining her halfbrother, classic race winner Birdstone, as an Old Friends retiree.

Channel Maker

"Turf specialist extraordinaire" describes Channel Maker perfectly. The Canadian-bred ended a long career in 2023 with earnings \$3.9 million – every penny of it on grass. The brother to 2018 Sovereign Awards finalist Johnny Bear retired as the leading money winner of another turf overachiever, English Channel.

For years, Channel Maker enchanted fans with his tenacious, pacesetting style, running with his head high in the clouds - "like a giraffe," part-owner Adam Wachtel once said. After failing to meet his yearling reserve at \$57,000, the chestnut gelding would get the last laugh, winning in the best company from ages 2 to 9, from 6 1/2 to 12 furlongs. He could do pretty much anything ... on grass.

Victories in two Grade 1 stakes earned him the 2020 Eclipse Award as America's champion grass male. Through an eight-season career, Channel Maker took more shots at the Breeders' Cup than any horse ever had - six - and though he failed to win one, his résumé was still heavy with Grade 1 victories. He was also voted champion at 3 in Canada.

Late in 2023, the decision was made by his owners and trainer Bill Mott to retire their very special gelding to Old Friends while still sound and competitive.

"What horse competes at the highest level from 2 to 9?" Wachtel asked. "I've never seen anything like him. He's been the horse of a lifetime."

In September of 2016, I was watching the Grade 2 Summer Stakes at Woodbine. Trainer Bill Mott had a 2-yearold in the race that I thought might be special named Good Samaritan, who won the race impressively. I also noticed an interesting horse in the race named Channel Maker. He finished third. A few days later, Len Friedman of Ragozin told me I should check into Channel Maker, in that he had run a very fast race for a 2-year-old and that he was from a very nice family. I was already a big fan of English Channel as a sire. I called up my close friend and often horse partner Gary Barber, and we decided to try and buy this horse. Who would ever have assumed that seven years later this amazing gelding would have earned nearly \$4 million, won four Grade 1s, finished third in the Breeders' Cup Turf, and won an Eclipse Award? In eight years of racing, he never sustained a major injury and never missed a scheduled race while traveling all over North America, as well as to Dubai and Saudi Arabia. During his 4-year-old campaign, Dean Reeves and Randy Hill joined Gary and I as owners. At age 9, he won vet another Grade 2 race at Saratoga, and he retired at year-end. Our ownership group had the privilege of owning one truly special horse. Channel Maker, enjoy your retirement at Old Friends.

Cozmic One

On the evening of a full moon, obliterated by a late Kentucky snowstorm, a sturdy dark bay colt arrived in the Bluegrass. Despite the whiteout, or maybe because of it, March 8, 2012 was a "magical night," according to co-owner-breeder Ann Holbrook (ex-Moss), one filled with endless possibilities.

And why not dream? His sire was a champion and leading progenitor, and, more importantly, he was the first foal of the incomparable Zenyatta, arguably the greatest racemare of the modern era. Through his veins coursed the blood of such breed-building giants as Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector, Seattle Slew and Roberto, Bold Ruler and Buckpasser. What wonders lie ahead for the colt they would name Cozmic One?

Soon enough, we knew. He had his own Facebook page and then a Breyer figure cast in his youthful image. And yet . . . this big, strapping colt of impeccable lineage never won a race. And so it goes in racing.

Cozmic One was – and remains today – a special horse, despite his past performance lines. For owner-breeders Jerry and Ann Moss, he finished unplaced in five starts, before they gracefully threw in the towel, gelded him, and turned him over to de Sousa Stables to train as a show horse.

In his new life, "Coz" earned the success denied him on the racetrack. He quickly became an object of outsized interest and a worthy diplomat for Thoroughbreds in second careers. In 2018, as part of the Retired Racehorse Project Thoroughbred Makeover, "Coz" finished fifth of 96 in show jumping, and even made a celebrity appearance at Breyerfest.

The return of an old injury in 2023, however, prompted his retirement from competition. In October of 2024, the sweet-natured fellow arrived at Old Friends, where he continues to be a revered ambassador for his breed and sport.

Game On Dude had 34 starts over the course of five racing seasons and won nearly half of them, so there are plenty of memories to take away from his career, but for me, nothing was better than when Game On Dude won the Santa Anita Handicap in 2014 to become the first horse to win that storied race three times.

Game On Dude was clearly in the twilight of his career at that point. He was 7 and had lost three straight races, beginning with a crushing loss in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Classic that cost him titles as champion older horse and Horse of the Year, awards for which he was the front-runner entering that day.

Going back to the 2012 Californian, Game On Dude had been favored in 14 straight races and was odds-on in seven of those races. But having lost three straight, and with Mucho Macho Man and Will Take Charge - the one-two finishers from the previous fall's Breeders' Cup Classic - in the Big Cap, Game On Dude was the distant third choice at 7-2.

But the old boy reached back for one last hurrah. He used his wicked speed, the kind he could carry a distance, to run his rivals off their feet – six furlongs in 1:09.39, a mile in 1:32.57. And he kept on going. It might have been his finest race.

Legendary trainer "Sunny" Jim Fitzsimmons once said, "It's what you can't see that matters

Of course, he was right. In 2012, a colt of underwhelming physical presence and pedigree (a former \$11,000 yearling) proved emphatically that great heart and profound courage can bubble to the surface when least expected. I'll Have Another would become the stuff of dreams and find himself on the precipice of equine immortality that spring, though Kentucky Derby bettors thought otherwise and dismissed the Reddam Racing Stable colt at 15-1 odds.

Trained by Doug O'Neill, ridden by Derby neophyte Mario Gutierrez, and in front of a record crowd of 165,307, the son of Flower Alley disposed of one of the finest fields ever to line up for the Louisville classic - half of which were, or would soon become, Grade 1 winners. In so doing, he also became the first in Derby history to win from the 19 post.

I'll Have Another followed up with a tenacious Preakness score and looked good for a Triple Crown sweep before a tendon flared up at the worst possible time and he had to be scratched from the Belmont the day before the race. Since it would require weeks, maybe months of recovery, owner Paul Reddam decided to call it a career for his gifted colt.

With five victories in seven starts, earnings of \$2.7 million, and a championship in hand, I'll Have Another was sold to Japanese interests for \$10 million as a stallion prospect. But after six disappointing seasons at stud, the double classic winner was repatriated to his homeland, where success continued to elude him.

Reddam, who had reacquired the now-aging stallion, donated him in March of 2024 to Old Friends, where I'll Have Another now spends his days grazing lush pasture, greeting passers-by, and happily accepting treats from fans – enjoying life as a champion should.

A lot can and has been said about Lava Man - a book could be written about his accomplishments in racing – so providing a summary of his career in a few words is difficult. But here's some things to know about Lava Man: He won more money after being claimed than any horse in racing history; he is the fourth-leading California-bred money earner of all time (behind California Chrome, Tiznow, and Best Pal); he won more Grade 1 races (seven) than any Cal-bred in history; he's one of only two horses to ever win all three premier Grade 1 races for older horses at the three major tracks in California in the same year - Old Friends resident Game On Dude is the other - and he equaled Native Diver's feat of winning the Hollywood Gold Cup (G1) three years in a row.

Did we mention he was beloved by racing fans? Fans love a horse who rose from the claiming ranks to the top echelons of the sport, but even more they love a horse who races a long time, tries his best every time out, and pays off at the window. That was Lava Man.

None of that would have happened if his owners, STD Stable and Jason Wood, had not asked trainer Doug O'Neill to claim the son of Slew City Slew for \$50,000 for them midway through his 3-year-old season, in his 13th start. After being claimed, Lava Man was one of the best in the game for years, winning 14 of 34 starts, with 13 stakes wins, nine of them graded, and earning \$5,170,103.

Dude outearned Mike almost 2 to 1, but apparently Mike never got the memo, because he rules the paddock. If you try to give Dude a carrot, Mike is there trying to prevent any such act of kindness.

Silver Charm

Bob Baffert has won the Kentucky Derby six times and, owing to American Pharoah and Justify, even has two Triple Crown winners on his résumé. But it was Silver Charm who first got him to the winner's circle on the first Saturday in May, and that victory came one year after a brutal loss, one that left Baffert wondering if he'd ever get a better chance on Derby Day.

Cavonnier, Baffert's first starter in the Kentucky Derby, was beaten in the 1996 Derby in the very last jump by Grindstone. A year later, Silver Charm was in a dogfight with Captain Bodgit.

"Please don't do it. Lord, please don't do it to me again," Baffert said he pleaded as the horses neared the wire.

When the horses hit the finish, Baffert collapsed into the arms of Bob Lewis, who owned Silver Charm with his wife, Beverly.

"I didn't think I'd feel like that," Baffert said. "It was an unbelievable experience. My stomach hurt so much when they hit the wire, I couldn't move."

That tenacity was Silver Charm's calling card. Of his 12 wins, six - including a dead heat - were by a head or less. Silver Charm was the first horse with whom Baffert won the Dubai World Cup and was the first Kentucky Derby winner to also win that rich race.

Michael says: On August 7, 1982, in the middle of a dark and stormy Saratoga afternoon, with trees down and the water on the track seemingly deeper than the infield pond, I placed the first \$50 wager of my life on a beautiful gray horse in the Whitney Stakes, Silver Buck. Owned by C.V. Whitney and trained by Elliot Burch, it seemed only right that, even at odds-on, he would win. He did. A few years later, in March of 1986, the filly Bonnie's Poker won three races in 10 days for Oscar Barrera. Eighteen years later, after a contentious legal battle, Bonnie was retired to Old Friends by her owner, Kris Jakeman. Bonnie was tough as nails and very smart.

As a handicapper, I knew of Bob Baffert long before I heard of Silver Charm. I bet Bob's Cavonnier in the 1996 Derby when he lost that heartbreaking photo to Grindstone. However, it wasn't until the next year when he was walking Silver Charm over for the Derby and I was trying to lead one of trainer Carlos Figueroa's claimers over from Barn 7 at Suffolk Downs so I could watch the Derby on one of the dusty TVs, that he really made an impression. I bet Silver Charm and watched him fight off Captain Bodgit and Free House while waiting for Carlos's horse to finish seventh in an eight-horse field. While Bob celebrated, I was on my way back to Barn 7. Little did I dream that, nearly a quarter-century later, Bob would be a great friend and Silver Charm would be grazing outside my back window.

Stormy Liberal

Stormy Liberal is the type of success story that horse racing thrives on. The one-time \$100,000 auction juvenile showed only modest promise early in his career and by the fall of his 4-year-old season had been dropped into \$40,000 claiming company. At that price, the Stormy Atlantic gelding was snapped up by trainer Peter Miller for Rockingham Ranch and David Bernsen. In Miller's hands, he developed into a star sprinter on grass, racing through age 7, capturing two editions of the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, and earning the title of champion turf male of 2018. On the track, the handsome milk chocolate bay was pure speedball, winning 12 races from five to 6 1/2 furlongs and always on grass, en route to career earnings of more than \$2.2 million. He also went abroad to finish in the money twice in the rich Al Quoz Sprint (UAE-G1) in Dubai.

When a late 2019 exam revealed lesions in both fore ankles, the decision was wisely made to retire Stormy Liberal to Old Friends, where he arrived in mid-February 2020 – unfortunately, just as the coronavirus pandemic was exploding. Now that the farm is past those restrictions, his many fans have been able to come out to Old Friends to see Stormy Liberal.

The Pizza Man

The Pizza Man is a real home state hero. The son of English Channel was bred in Illinois, won the state's richest race – the Grade 1 Arlington Million – and retired as the all-time leading money earner bred in the Prairie State, with \$2,158,941. He is the only Illinois-bred ever to win the Arlington Million.

Bred by Midwest Thoroughbreds, the operation of Richard and Karen Papiese of Chicago, The Pizza Man is a homegrown product, the Papieses having claimed his dam, I Can Fan Fan, for \$18,000 in 2005. He got his name because the Papieses thought the blaze on his forehead looked like a slice of pizza. Though from Chicago, they did not specify if they thought it looked like deep dish or thin crust.

Trained by the late Roger Brueggemann, The Pizza Man raced for seven years, winning 17 of 36 starts. His victories included Arlington's Grade 3 Stars and Stripes Stakes twice and the Grade 2 Hollywood Turf Cup. He even ventured to Canada to win the Grade 1 Northern Dancer Turf Stakes. In 2015, for his 6-year-old season, he was named Illinois-bred Horse of the Year.

The Pizza Man was retired on September 16, 2017, in a ceremony at Arlington Park, and later worked as a stable pony for Brueggemann's barn.

He came to Old Friends in August 2020 along with 2014 sprint champion Work All Week, another Papiese Illinois homebred trained by Brueggemann.

The Pizza Man retired as one of the greatest Thoroughbreds ever produced in Illinois, and, as a retiree, he still displays that Fightin' Illini spirit. And he certainly is one of the best athletes that state has produced in the past decade. Trained by the late Roger Brueggemann, The Pizza Man didn't hit his stride until his 5-year-old campaign. That year, I was invited by trainer Dee Poulos and racetrack guru Richard Duchossois to hand out the trophy for the Black Tie Affair Stakes at Arlington Park. He dominated the Black Tie Affair and won wire to wire. And I got to present him the trophy. Now, thanks to Richard and Karen Papiese, we've been reunited at Old Friends. I'm sure he doesn't remember me, but I sure remember him. He's so good looking and dignified I'm thinking of renaming him The Pavlova Man. But that wouldn't fit. I'll take The Pizza Man with all fixins.

Touch Gold

For over 20 years I have been awaiting the chance to repay the favor to Touch Gold for bailing me out, and those that happened to trust my opinion back on a famous afternoon of racing.

Push the rewind button to June 1997, when Silver Charm was seeking to become a Triple Crown winner in the Belmont Stakes after winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. And though I respected Silver Charm, I was thrilled about the prospect of betting against him at a short price – with Illinois Derby winner Wild Rush.

I told friends in the Daily Racing Form office that year: Wild Rush - bet him. Well, Wild Rush gave me a Belmont rush for only a mile or so, then began his retreat. And that's when his entrymate Touch Gold saved the day, rallying wide under Chris McCarron to catch Silver Charm in the closing strides. Thanks to Touch Gold being coupled in the wagering with Wild Rush, I was wrong and still got to collect a \$7.30 mutuel, leaving me that day much luckier than smart.

With the benefit of hindsight, Wild Rush had nothing on Touch Gold as a 3-year-old. For that matter, it could be argued that not even Silver Charm and Free House – other top 3-year-olds of that year – were of his quality for at least a few months that summer, when Touch Gold also won the Haskell, and prior to the Belmont was an unlucky fourth in the Preakness after stumbling to his face at the start and injuring a hoof.

He is a splendid addition to Old Friends, and I'm sure many, like me, will forever remember his 1997 Belmont victory, whether they bet him (or his stablemate) or not.



Michael Blowen: If Madeleine Paulson weren't such a good golfer, Fraise may never have triumphed in the 1992 Breeders' Cup Turf. The wife of the late Allen Paulson won Fraise from her husband in a wager on the green, decided he should be competing on the grass, not the dirt, and turned over training duties to Bill Mott, who had won the Breeders' Cup Turf with Theatrical in 1987. The result was a record-breaking Breeders' Cup Turf win by a head in a blazing 2:24.

He knew what he wanted and when he wanted it, but he was never rude. His majesty is difficult to capture in words.


