Eyes Forward with John Nicholson

The evening of October 24th was a special night in the history of Old Friends when nearly 150 people joined us to celebrate a new partnership between Old Friends and MyRacehorse.

This new relationship is a coming together of two of the best things happening in the sport of Thoroughbred racing. One is giving people everywhere a chance to be a part of our sport by giving affordable access to Thoroughbred ownership and participation. The other is often the very face of Aftercare and leads the known universe in giving comfortable sanctuary to the sport's retired athletes and giving everyone in the world a chance to know these great horses personally.

At the heart of it, both Old Friends and MyRacehorse serve to bring horses and people together. That's mightily important because, ultimately, it's the average fan who has a true devotion to the horse that has made Thoroughbred racing the sport we love.

In late 2024, a successful member of the MyRacehorse stable, Lane Way, retired to Old Friends. Then in January, MyRacehorse Founder and CEO, Michael Behrens, and I met at the Eclipse Awards, where we shared an enthusiastic conversation about the possibility of a more formal collaboration between our two organizations. And in April, we were thrilled to host Michael at our Georgetown, KY farm, where he enthusiastically reunited with Lane Way.

In just the first few minutes of his visit, Michael clearly saw and articulated the synergy between Old Friends and MyRacehorse. We decided to inconspicuously join one of our tours, where Michael got the full experience, including an appearance and greeting by Old Friends Founder, Michael Blowen. He soon turned to me and said, "John, the people here on this tour are more MyRacehorse people than the people in the turnstiles of the track or in the betting lines. These people are here for the horses!"

Michael Behrens had succinctly and brilliantly grasped the essence of what we hold to be true. The horse is the essential element. The bond between horse and mankind is the basis of our devotion to the sport and to the animal. It is why we give so much of ourselves in service to these valiant retired competitors.

MyRacehorse honors not only the horse, but it celebrates and serves the wonderful people who love racing. The great coming together of splendid humanity and magnificent Thoroughbred horses in spirited and respectful competition is what animates us. It's a most special feeling, better experienced than explained. It can be seen in the eyes of MyRacehorse folks. The same is seen in the eyes of all those who love Old Friends.

Racing may have been called the Sport of Kings. But, it is not the Kings that make it great. The countless lovers of the animal matter infinitely more than any monarch. And good people will honor and love all the horses, the swift and the less swift. The people of MyRacehorse and our Old Friends family are the good people.

I know that those of you who had the good fortune to meet him or even read his book, "A Charmed Life" as told to Diane White, all have your cherished responses to his passing and we appreciate so much you sharing them with us. -- **Michael Blowen**

Original Facebook post August 29, 2025: Some things seem like they will last forever, and you just never expect there to be an end. Little Silver Charm was one such everlasting little horse. A few weeks ago, we mentioned that Special Ring was the last of the original horses to come over to Dream Chase Farm in 2006. We kind of forgot that Little Silver Charm was also in that group (although probably not included with the original Thoroughbreds in the head count). This past Friday evening, the very last surviving equine to originally arrive at Dream Chase Farm was laid to rest in, of course, the Champions Cemetery at Old Friends.

Little Silver Charm was given a voice (and a rather snarky one at that) by Diane White, who was one of his caretakers (notice I don't say owners). I think he called her his "ghost writer" at one point in time. He always had an opinion on everything, and always said his piece in our annual magazine as well as newsletters sent out to keep folks updated on what was going on around the farm. He is even registered as an author with the Library of Congress after "writing" his very own book several years ago.



I have so many memories of this little horse and his adventures around the farm. I have lost count of the number of times that Michael and Little Silver Charm would burst into the middle of a tour and immediately win everyone over. One afternoon, Michael took him over to meet Creator, who was curious about the little horse. Little Silver Charm immediately presented his back end to the big stallion.

One Easter Sunday evening, many years ago, I found them wandering the farm, challenging the stallions to races. Prized took him up and trounced him, but he blamed his “jockey”, Michael, for the loss. Swan’s Way was also willing to race, and his lazy trot gave Little Silver Charm a chance to save face.

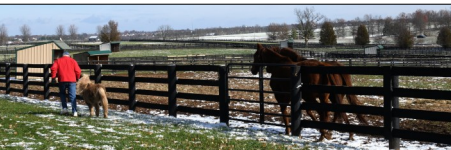
When big Silver Charm arrived at Old Friends on December 1, 2014, hanging on Little Silver Charm’s paddock was a poster welcoming him to the farm with a note – “just remember I was here first!” I remember stalking the two Charms through the spring until I finally got a photo of the two of them touching noses.

There were races with Touch Gold and many others through the years, him and Michael and Diane

wandering down the tree-lined lane that leads up the hill to the farm, trips inside the house for his beloved ginger snaps (and they had better be the good ones from Whole Foods), and even jumping little hurdles in the yard. He also loved to kick a soccer ball when sent his way and had very good aim.

I remember when Eldaafer arrived with his entourage of goats, Google and Yahoo. For a while, the goats shared Little Silver Charms paddock part time. During that time, someone stomped on his soccer ball and flattened it. Someone else, um, ate his pinup poster of Zenyatta that hung in the run-in shed. When he learned he was getting a new paddock of his very own, Little Silver Charm requested a hot tub. That request was denied, but he did get a sign on his paddock that said, “Goat Free Zone”.

It is going to be strange not to see his mischievous little self around the farm. Time marches on and waits for no horse, even a very small and loved one like Little Silver Charm. Rest well Charmie, we will all be missing you for a long time to come. - **Laura Battles, Old Friends Photographer and Guide**



Major Blue Lands at Old Friends

I wasn't lucky enough to serve an apprenticeship under Wayne. If I did, I'm certain Old Friends would have grown faster and stronger much sooner. And, while he was approachable, I can't claim him as a friend. But to see him reunited with Charismatic when there was nothing at stake but their love, was a moment I'll never forget. Major Blue proved to be a very useful racehorse for his connections with 10 top three finishes in 29 starts for \$375,091 in earnings. The son of Flatter took his owners to

the winner's circle four times with his first victory coming at Lukas's winter base, Oaklawn Park, when he broke his maiden as the favorite. Making a brief appearance on the Road to the Kentucky Derby in the Blue Grass S. (G1), he made two stakes starts in 2023 before racing in the allowance and claiming ranks for the rest of his career. Placing twice in 2025, he ended his career with a fourth-place finish at Lukas's beloved Churchill Downs two weeks before his trainer passed away.

We are so proud that Major Blue, the final horse owned and trained by legendary Hall-of-Fame trainer D. Wayne has joined our retirees here at Old Friends.

It is evident to all that Major Blue was a special horse to the Lukas family. According to wife Laurie, "Major Blue was purchased in 2021 by Wayne to form a partnership with Wayne and me and longtime friends from Colorado, Bob and Ann Ghent. He is named for Wayne's grandson Brady Lukas who is a major in the Air Force. Major Blue has a huge heart and always gave his all in his races and workouts. He was a barn favorite and loved by his exercise riders, grooms, and jockeys. Although not a famous big-name racehorse, he is what racing is all about – the enjoyment and love of the horse."

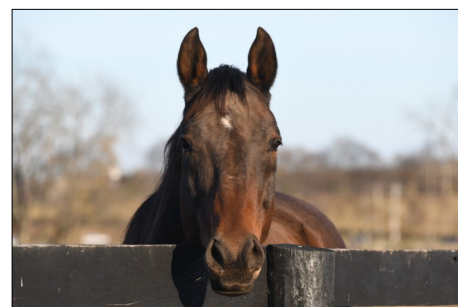

When the Old Friends Stakes debuted at Kentucky Downs in 2015, it introduced something the racing world had never seen before — a stakes race with a built-in retirement guarantee. For the first time, winning a race didn't just bring a purse, a trophy, and prestige — it brought a promise of lifelong care, no matter what the future holds. The winner would become an Old Friend for Life.

This concept was truly pioneering. It bridged two worlds that had long been separate: the excitement of the racetrack and the responsibility of aftercare. The Old Friends Stakes made aftercare a reward — not just an obligation — and showed that compassion could be part of competition.

The Old Friends Stakes (2015-19) was joined by the FTBOA Silver Charm Stakes (Tampa Bay Downs; 2018-19), and the Old Friends Purse (Pimlico Race Track; 2023-present) as Old Friends for Life races.

Ten years after its creation, the concept is working exactly as hoped. Past winners who used their lifetime retirement benefit and now reside at Old Friends include Next Shares, Kalamos, Get Western, Noble Drama and most recently Flatlined, who arrived in February. All are now living their best retired lives, reminding us that racing success can lead directly to lifelong care and security.

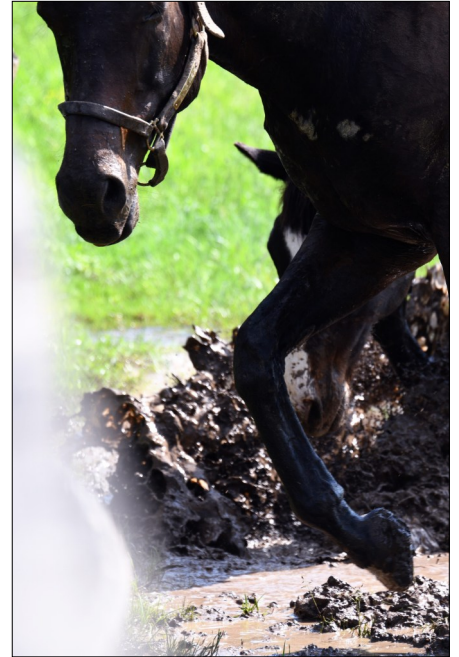

The Definition of an “Iron Horse”? It’s Klaatu!

In early May of this year, a horse by the name of Klaatu came to our attention when his new owner called to inquire about retirement. The more we found out about this horse, the more we became convinced that we needed to find a place for him at Old Friends.

Turns out that Klaatu is one of those “Iron Horses” that racing fans so much admire. Check out these stats:

- Klaatu is a Pennsylvania-bred, born in 2014.
- The 11-year-old raced from 2018-2025.
- Career record includes 114 starts, of which he won 15 races.
- Earned \$363,913.

Over the course of his eight-year racing career, Klaatu had 18 different owners and 17 trainers. At one point, he was claimed in five consecutive races. He raced mostly in Pennsylvania and Ohio at Mahoning Valley, Parx Racing, Thistledown, and Penn National, with a couple of starts at Delaware Park.

Early in 2025, Klaatu caught the attention of Diamond Racehorse Aftercare’s Jay Oringer, who began keeping an eye on the old warrior, waiting for the right opportunity. On May 8, 2025, Klaatu’s life changed forever. That afternoon, he finished second in a \$5,000 claiming race at Thistledown. Jay had arrangements in place to claim and retire him, and several days later, Klaatu strolled onto a horse van and left the racetrack for the final time.

Jay contacted Old Friends to ask about the possibility of retirement for Klaatu, and the rest is history. On September 16, Klaatu arrived at Old Friends. We have found him to be a very sweet, kind, personable horse.

Klaatu is not the first “Iron Horse” to retire to Old Friends.

Mikethespike (126 starts), Catlaunch (108 starts), Zippy Chippy (100 starts), Wally Ballou (91 starts) Mike Man’s Gold (86 starts), and Nana’s Hope (80 starts) are just a handful of the retirees at Old Friends who spent their careers grinding out starts and earning their retirement the hard way.

We proudly share that our retirees run the gamut from Kentucky Derby winners to “Iron Horses” and everything in between. Every horse is deserving of a dignified and safe retirement. We are happy to say

that Klaatu, in a paddock with new friends Own Agenda, El Oh El and Forte Dei Marmi, found his forever home at Old Friends.

Did You Know? The name **Klaatu** originates from the 1951 science fiction film, “The Day the Earth Stood Still”, where it is the name of an alien ambassador. The name is part of the famous phrase, “Klaatu barada nikto,” which the character says to his robot, Gort, to give a command. While the phrase’s exact meaning was never officially translated by the film-makers, it has become a famous command in science fiction.

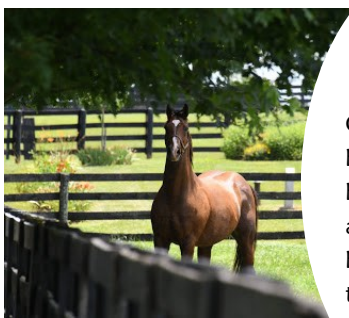
